About Our Organist

Thomas Dressler is an 8th generation descendant of the founding pastor of St. John, J. Michael Enderlein, through J. Michael Enderlein, Jr. He grew up on the Enterline farm in Rush Township, near Snydertown. He graduated from Susquehanna University with a Bachelor of Music, and from Westminster Choir College in Princeton, NJ with a Master of Music, both in Organ Performance. He played his first full organ recital at the age of 14 in Freeburg, PA, and has been performing regularly for the past 48 years. His specialty is historic instruments and techniques, and he has performed on most of the oldest organs in the US, as well as instruments like the organ at the West Point Cadet Chapel--the largest church organ in the world. He has performed almost every year since 1990 on the historic organ at Round Lake, NY, the only musical instrument designated a National Historic Landmark in the US. He has appeared on local television programs in Philadelphia, the Poconos, and upstate New York, and was interviewed by Erika Funke on ArtScene on WVIA. He has released two CDs, one recorded at Round Lake, NY and the other at Princeton Theological Seminary. He has taught music at the college level and was Dean of the Lehigh Valley Chapter of the American Guild of Organists for three years. He is currently Director of Music (organist/choir director) at College Hill Presbyterian Church in Easton, PA.
