

Dear Friends in Jesus,

I always try to make sure that my letter fits easily on the front page of the newsletter, but, this month, there is a lot to share about upcoming worship here at St. John, so please stay with me and read on to the back side of this page!

As you might have guessed, I'm speaking of the opportunity we all have to observe the Sunday of the Passion/Palm Sunday, as well as the "Three Days" or "Triduum" – the ancient title for the period that begins on Maundy Thursday evening and ends on Easter Sunday evening.

On the Sunday of the Passion/Palm Sunday, April 13, our worship will once again include the celebration with palms (again making use of beautiful "fair trade" palm fronds that provide just compensation for small growers), as well as a dramatic reading by Vincent Lamenza of The Passion of Jesus According to St. Matthew. New this year, we will begin our worship either outside or downstairs in the Sunday School Room and join in a procession of palms, led by our young persons. (Folks who are physically unable to join in the procession will simply go upstairs in advance just like normal and be able to follow along through the sound system.) Then, early in our worship, the young persons will be excused to join in a special "children's church", where they will learn a song, read a story, and share in a snack – returning to the rest of us before the end of the worship time.

The Three Days begin four days later, on April 17, as we Christians focus on the very core of our faith – the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. From ancient times, the Three Days have been understood as one continuous period of worship. This means, for one thing, that our worship on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday evenings ends without the usual Benediction – we're really not ending our worship, after all, merely taking a pause. This also means, much more importantly, that our being in worship on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday evenings, is just as important as our being in worship on Easter Sunday morning. Our schedule of worship and related activities for the Three Days will be as follows:

Maundy Thursday, April 17

At 7:00 P.M., we will gather for a Liturgy of Holy Communion, sharing in the mystery and the meaning of that Upper Room – the body and the blood given for us – the betrayal and desertion of our Lord. Reflecting that betrayal and desertion, our worship will end with the solemn stripping of the altar by members of altar guild as the senior choir intones the haunting words of Psalm 22.

Good Friday, April 18

At 7:00 P.M., we will gather for the Liturgy of Good Friday – a dark and solemn time featuring a dramatic reading of The Passion of Jesus According to St. John. Please note that Youth Group members will again read the principal parts of The Passion, getting together for a short "rehearsal" at 6:15 P.M. Please support them with your presence!

Holy Saturday, April 19

At 9:00 A.M., members of Youth Group will gather to set up for our annual Easter Egg Hunt, with the hunt getting underway at 10:00 A.M. for children in four age groups: preschool, grades K-1, grades 2-3, and grades 4-5.

At 7:00 P.M., we will continue our worship <u>downstairs</u> with a Liturgy of Readings and Prayer. This liturgy, a part of the Liturgy of Easter Vigil, features a series of lengthy readings from the Old Testament, telling of the creative and saving actions of God, beginning with Genesis 1, that point the way to the ultimate creative and saving action of Easter. There will be no music and no offering – only my reading by the light of a single candle, silence for meditation, and prayer.

The Resurrection of Our Lord, Easter Day, April 20

Following Easter Sunday tradition at St. John, a very brief Sunrise Worship will take place outdoors (weather permitting) from 6:30 – 6:45 A.M. From 6:45 – 7:00, all interested men of the church will prepare and set up for Easter breakfast, which will be served from 7:00 – 8:00. Following some clean-up time, and a Men's Choir rehearsal at 8:15, the annual Sunday School Easter Party, for all ages, will follow at 9:00. Our morning will conclude with a Liturgy of Holy Communion, featuring the great hymns of Easter, at 10:15 A.M. A special musical prelude, including the young persons singing the song they learned the week before, will precede this worship, so please plan to come approximately 15 minutes early.

Please don't miss your opportunity to fully take part in this holiest of Christian holy times!

Due to the late date of Easter this year, a shortened Midweek Bible Study will resume on Wednesday, April 30, and run through Wednesday, May 21, when we will take a break for the summer. Class will be held each week from 6:30 to 8:00 P.M. We will continue our multi-year journey of studying individual books of the Bible, using resources from our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's Book of Faith emphasis on Bible study. After spending the fall and winter looking at the Book of Acts, with its emphasis on the life and career of the Apostle Paul, we will now turn to one of Paul's most important letters for this spring study – The Book of Galatians. No previous Bible study experience is required – only an interest and enthusiasm to study, reflect on, and discuss God's Word together! So that the correct number of study books can be ordered for our study, please register in advance (by speaking with Pastor Tom) no later than Easter Sunday morning, April 20.

Sign up on the foyer bulletin board for Lutheran Night with the Senators, which is coming up on Friday, May 16, as the Harrisburg Senators host the Binghamton Mets. \$4 of every \$11 box seat ticket we purchase as a church group will be donated to the camping ministry of our Lower Susquehanna Synod, and Bishop James Dunlop will throw out the first pitch. Fireworks will close out the evening. Deadline to sign up and pay for tickets (check payable to "St. John Lutheran" and given to Pastor Tom) is Sunday, April 27.

LOOKING AHEAD TO STRAWBERRY FESTIVAL TIME...

This year's Strawberry Festival will take place on Wednesday, June 11, in our grove and pavilion. Although serious planning is just getting underway for the Festival, Brad Crum has again been booked as entertainment for the early/mid afternoon timeslot, singing as Elvis. Please save the date of June 11 in your family's calendar, and please spread the news to your friends and neighbors.

...AND TO OUTDOOR WORSHIP...

Our schedule of summer outdoor worship has also been finalized by Worship & Music Committee and Congregational Council. These Sundays will be: May 25 (Memorial Day Weekend), June 15 (when we will be celebrating the Festival of the Holy Trinity with Holy Communion), July 6 (Independence Day Weekend – "Colonial" Order for Holy Communion), July 27 (Vacation Bible School Closing Program, followed by Annual Picnic), August 3 (Annual Old Fashioned Hymn Sing), and August 31 (Labor Day Weekend).
