Our congregational family observance of the early Easter Season this year will involve much that is familiar – or should be – along with something brand new. The "familiar" that I have in mind is our keeping of the "Three Days" or "Triduum" – the ancient title for the period that begins on Maundy Thursday evening and ends on Easter Sunday evening. If you have never taken the time to experience the power of this three day focus on the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus, why not make this the year? Our schedule of worship and related activities for the Three Days will be as follows:

-Maundy Thursday, April 2:

At 7:00 P.M., we will gather for a Liturgy of Holy Communion, sharing in the mystery and the meaning of that Upper Room – the body and the blood given for us – the betrayal and desertion of our Lord. Reflecting that betrayal and desertion, our worship will end with the solemn stripping of the altar by members of altar guild as the senior choir intones the haunting words of Psalm 22.

-Good Friday, April 3:

At 7:00 P.M., we will gather for the Liturgy of Good Friday – a dark and solemn time featuring a dramatic reading of The Passion of Jesus According to St. John. Please note that Youth Group members will again read the principal parts of The Passion, getting together for a short "rehearsal" at 6:15 P.M. Please support them with your presence!

-Holy Saturday, April 4:

At 9:00 A.M., members of Youth Group will gather to set up for our annual Easter Egg Hunt, with the hunt getting underway at 10:00 A.M. for children in four age groups: preschool, grades K-1, grades 2-3, and grades 4-5.

At 7:00 P.M., we will continue our worship <u>downstairs</u> with a Liturgy of Readings and Prayer. This liturgy, a part of the Liturgy of Easter Vigil, features a series of lengthy readings from the Old Testament, telling of the creative and saving actions of God, beginning with Genesis 1, that point the way to the ultimate creative and saving action of Easter. There will be no music and no offering — only my reading by the light of a single candle, silence for meditation, and prayer.

-The Resurrection of Our Lord, Easter Day, April 5:

Following Easter Sunday tradition at St. John, a very brief Sunrise Worship will take place outdoors (weather permitting) from 6:30 – 6:45 A.M. From 6:45 – 7:00, all interested men of the church will prepare and set up for Easter breakfast, which will be served from 7:00 – 8:00. Following some clean-up time, and a Men's Choir rehearsal at 8:15, regular Sunday School will follow at 9:00. Our morning will conclude with a Liturgy of Holy Communion, featuring the great hymns of Easter, at 10:15 A.M. A special musical prelude, including Men's Choir, will precede this worship, so please plan to come approximately 15 minutes early.

The "brand new" is our first-ever Easter Program, coming up during 10:15 A.M. worship on The 2nd Sunday of Easter, April 12. While the rest of the world will have already stored away the Easter decorations, concluding that Easter is over and done, we choose to live the truth that Easter is, in fact, a "week of weeks" – 49 days plus 1 – and our young persons, guided by Amy Gehring and Louise Baumgardner, will lead us in continuing that celebration on the 12th, following a dress rehearsal scheduled for Wednesday, April 8, at 6:30 P.M.

We worship an amazing God, and there is no better way to be reminded of that than by joining with your congregational family in this inspiring beginning to April!

We are trying a Monday scheduling for spring, in the hope of better avoiding the many concerts and sporting events scheduled during the middle of the week in this busy season. As before, class will be held each week from 6:30 to 8:00 P.M. Having finished a fall and winter study of the various denominational branches of our Christian Family, the topic for this study will be the Bible books of I & II Corinthians, where we meet the Apostle Paul as his most lively and, at times, fiery self, and where we hear about the real-life problems and joys of Christian congregational family life, finding out just how much we have in common with these our ancestors in our Christian Family tree. No previous Bible study experience is required — only an interest and enthusiasm to study, reflect on, and discuss God's Word together! My name is Brad Harker, and I live in Halifax, Pennsylvania. My family has had the distinct pleasure of being friends and neighbors with the Thompson Family (Brian, Jodi, Cody, Zach and Cameron) for several years, and my 13 year old son, Tyler, is a friend and classmate of Cameron Thompson.

Our family has participated for several years with the Relay for Life of Upper Dauphin, which is sponsored by the American Cancer Society for the purpose of raising money and awareness to battle cancer. The Relay for Life will be held this year on June 19 at 3:00 through June 20 at 3:00 at the Halifax High School. If you are not familiar with the Relay for Life, teams unite to raise funds and walk the track for 24 hours straight to celebrate cancer survivors, lend support to those that are currently battling cancer, raise awareness about the American Cancer Society and the services they offer, and to help find a cure for cancer. 
