

Dear Friends in Jesus,

As you are hopefully well aware by now, Amanda Baker began her ministry with us as our Children's & Youth Ministry Coordinator in mid-February. Already, she is making her presence felt as she focuses her energy and passion for the Gospel of Jesus on our ministry to and with our younger members, at this point particularly focused on our pre-youth group-age folks.

Please be sure to turn over to the next page for Amanda's monthly letter which will fill you in on many things that are happening, including the plans for Sunday, April 10, when we will officially install Amanda in her position during morning worship and then, following worship, invite especially those younger folks and their parents and caregivers to a pizza lunch and time of sharing and fun in the pavilion (weather permitting) or the Sunday School Room.

I would like to use my remaining space this month to highlight a four-item "wish list" for Amanda's ministry:

- 1. Support/Steering Committee Members (Amanda would very much like to form a strong and vigorous group of interested persons to give guidance and support to her work through the coming years. Please speak with her if you would like to know more or to volunteer.)
- 2. Small Desk and Chair (As you may know, Amanda currently divides her time between her home in the Halifax area and the campus of Messiah College, but we would like to eventually furnish a small work space for her here at the church. If you would have a desk and/or chair that might work that you would be willing to donate, please contact Amanda.)
- 3. Financial Support (You might recall that, for this first year's approximately \$20,000 ministry budget for Amanda's work, we are planning that \$15,000 will come from Memorials Fund interest, \$2,500 from the Bicentennial/Local Benevolence Fund, and the rest from designated gifts beyond regular giving to our congregation's ministry. This support from giving over and above previous contributions will hopefully increase in coming years to cover the entire cost of Amanda's work. If you would like to make a gift toward Amanda's ministry, all you need do is write a check payable to "St. John Lutheran C & Y Ministry", making the notation "Children & Youth Ministry" on the memo line for good measure. If you forget and simply make your check payable to the church, don't worry - that will also work. Please place your check in a plain envelope that is also marked "Children & Youth Ministry" and which includes your offering envelope number if you would like your gift to appear on your annual giving statement. You can then either drop your envelope in the offering plate, give it directly to Carl Baumgardner – the treasurer of the account through which project monies are being routed - or mail it here to the church at PO Box 270, Berrysburg, PA 17005-0270, whichever is easiest for you.)
- 4. Prayer Support (Saving the most important need for last!)


