All proceeds will go to our Youth Group for support of Youth Group outings and the planned 2022 ELCA National Youth Gathering. We are in need of two Voting Members – a man and a woman who must both be voting members of the congregational family, confirmed, contributing, and communing – to join with Pastor Tom in taking part in our Annual Lower Susquehanna Synod Assembly, taking place on Friday evening, June 4, and Saturday, June 5. For the first (and most likely last) time, the Assembly will take place only virtually, probably on the Zoom platform. The only other requirement for those participating is that they will <u>each</u> need to have <u>two</u> Zoom-compatible devices available to them – one with a suitable screen to allow for viewing and hearing everything that is taking place and the other, such as a smart phone, to be used as a dedicated voting device. Since we will all be Zooming from the comfort of our own locations, please take note of the opportunity presented to multi-task (not to mention attend in your jammies!) such as has never been the case before and likely never will be again. To take advantage of less expensive "early bird" registration – paid for by our congregational family – <u>Voting Members are needed by Pastor Tom by Thursday, April 15</u>.

Last year about this time the Women of the ELCA of St. Johns were making plans for the purchase of new church aprons. The ordering was put on hold because of the Pandemic. The women would like to reopen this project. The aprons, both full and half, will be available in gray. The color will be a bit lighter than the original aprons we purchased 8 years ago. The full aprons will have 2 pockets and will cost approximately \$8.00. The half aprons will have 3 pockets and will cost approximately \$7.00. We still have the original sign-up sheet which is posted at church. We will continue to take orders through April 25th. The sign-up sheet will remain posted through that time. If you are an Amazon.com shopper, perhaps especially in this time of pandemic, our congregation is registered with the "Amazon Smiles" program, whereby Amazon donates one half of one percent of your purchase amount to a charitable organization that you select. Once you have selected us the first time, we will automatically be designated each time you shop and you won't need to re-do the search.) All monies received in this way will be automatically deposited for use in the Current Fund.

If you are not yet ready to take part in in-person worship, there are <u>three</u> very simple options for giving your tithes and offerings. You are welcome to 1. mail your offering to the church (PO Box 270, Berrysburg, 17005-0270) or 2. drop it by the church and place it in the red plastic tub that is prominently visible in the Sunday School Room, on the table just outside Pastor Tom's office door. *In addition, 3. if neither of those is easily done, you may wish to contact your bank about setting up an automatic payment, as some of our congregational family members also have done, whereby the offering you direct is sent by your bank as a check mailed directly to the church.* In all cases, Pastor Tom will then see that all offerings received get securely passed along to our counters.
