

Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus,

As I was saying in my letter on these pages last month, we are blessed and we give thanks to God that, while we are not yet at the "new normal", we are certainly in a vastly different place from last year at this time, when our worship and other normal events in the days leading up to Easter Day ended up being cancelled entirely or, in the case of Easter Day itself, being severely curtailed. This month I would like to report on the plans for our congregational family life this year in the period from Palm/Passion Sunday (March 28) through Easter Day (April 4):

• Palm/Passion Sunday, March 28

At **9:00am**, we will proceed with our normal Faith Formation activities, in their usual combination of Zoom and in-person events. At **10:15am**, we will likewise join in our new normal "hybrid" worship, combining inperson and Zoom opportunities and, while we will not have a procession of palms of any sort, we will be handing out our beautiful Equal Exchange palms to those present in-person (and have them available for a day or two beforehand for picking up here at the church for those who will be Zoom-ing that morning – stay tuned for more information about that). Our worship will begin with the Liturgy of the Palms and we will again enjoy Vincent Lamenza's reading of The Passion of Jesus (this year According to St. Mark) as the center point of our worship.

• Maundy Thursday, April 1; Good Friday, April 2; Holy Saturday/Easter Eve, April 3

On all three of those evenings (which, as you may recall my mentioning in previous years, together actually form one complete time of worship), we will gather for worship at **7:00pm** <u>on Zoom only</u>. During our Good Friday worship, members of Youth Group will be sharing a reading of The Passion of Jesus According to St. John as the traditional center point of our worship. On all three evenings, while we will of course worship with the reverence appropriate to these Holy Days, in these unique times we will also take advantage of the ability that being on Zoom-only permits to unmute and visit together after worship.

Holy Saturday/Easter Eve, April 3

At **8:00am**, Youth Group members will gather to set up for our traditional Easter Egg Hunt for our younger members. It will get underway at **9:00am** but will take place only outdoors and with appropriate safeguards as to distancing and such.

Easter Day, April 4

We will once again gather in-person for a brief time of Sunrise Worship at **6:30am** in the field across from the pavilion, next to the sexton house (or under the pavilion roof in case of inclement weather). Instead of squeezing into the foyer for warmth beforehand as we usually do, I'll simply ask everyone to remain in their cars for warmth if necessary until we are ready to begin and to please come together at 6:30 while keeping safe distancing and with their required masks covering both nose and mouth for everyone over the age of two. At **9:00am**, we will again proceed with our normal Faith Formation activities, in their usual combination of Zoom and in-person events. And at **10:15am**, we will likewise join in our new normal "hybrid" worship, combining in-person and Zoom opportunities as we celebrate the Good News that Jesus is Risen!

I will look forward to being in worship with YOU, my sisters and brothers in this wonderful congregational family that is St. John, in this most Holy of times. Please don't hesitate to contact me with any questions or ideas!

Bible Study

Our spring session of Midweek Bible Study will get underway on **Wednesday**, **April 14** and will continue through the end of May, wrapping up just before the Memorial Day weekend. Speaking as he first did more than 600 years before Jesus' birth, in a time when things which had for centuries seemed so rock-solid were tottering and shaking, the Prophet Jeremiah has a lot to say to us in these times in which we are living. (And perhaps more so than with any other biblical prophet, we find a kindred spirit in Jeremiah – someone who is open about his struggle with just how difficult following the call of God can be.) No previous Bible study experience is required – only an interest and enthusiasm to study, reflect on, and (as you are comfortable doing so) discuss God's Word together! So that the correct number of study books can be ordered for our study, please register in advance (by contacting Pastor Tom in whatever way is easiest for you) no later than Palm/Passion Sunday morning, March 28.

St. John Fellowship Opportunity

Each Thursday evening from 6:00 to 7:30, beginning Thursday, April 8, everyone is welcome to drop by for a time of fellowship on Zoom. Think of it as the Zoom version of our sextons unlocking the front door of the church, turning on the lights, and turning up the heat for anyone who might wish to stop in for any or all of that time. Roy and Rachel Henry will simply create a weekly recurring Zoom event which will automatically begin at 6:00pm and end at 7:30pm, but no actual host will be needed and they themselves will likely not be able to be present due to family schedules. Likewise, Pastor Tom will typically not be present and there will be no agenda or theme – simply a "space" to come together and visit and catch up for whomever might wish to do so. It is an experiment for this time until the "new normal" when we anticipate returning to all of the various in-person things much as we knew them pre-pandemic.

Strawberry Festival Meeting

The second planning meeting for our Annual Strawberry Festival is scheduled for Monday, April 12, beginning at 7:00pm in-person upstairs in our main worship space, which will allow for those present to (each wearing a mask covering both nose and mouth) gather and maintain safe spacing. At the recent first planning meeting, the decision was made by those present to proceed with planning for an adapted "drive through" Festival which will allow the entire pavilion to function as one large kitchen and serving space for those working, with traffic directors helping to keep the drive through line flowing smoothly while runners take orders and deliver food to "curbside". There will be no on-site dining, no entertainment, and no stands of any kind. Needless to say, it will be unlike anything we have ever done and will result in some familiar committees not being necessary this year while much more help will be needed in other new and/or adapted committees. Reception of Petitions and Communications:

Water testing inspection was passed for January.

Kone Elevator Service notified us that there would be a 3 ½% increase in the service contract.

A motion was made by Ron Erb and seconded by Arlene Doyle to make contributions of \$300 to Community Life Team Ambulance and \$300 to Upper Dauphin Human Services. Motion approved unanimously.
