

Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus,

I'm delighted to report, and to look forward to, the plan that our worship in the week which begins with Palm/Passion Sunday and ends with Easter Day will, for the first time in three years, look and feel very much like "normal"! A few details:

Palm/Passion Sunday, April 10

At **9:00am**, we will proceed with our normal Faith Formation activities, in their usual combination of Zoom and in-person events. At **10:15am**, we will likewise join in our new normal "hybrid" worship, combining inperson and Zoom opportunities and, while we will not have a procession of palms of any sort, we will be handing out our beautiful Equal Exchange palms to those present in-person (and have them available for a day or two beforehand for picking up here at the church for those who will be Zoom-ing that morning). Our worship will begin with the Liturgy of the Palms and we will again enjoy Vincent Lamenza's reading of The Passion of Jesus (this year According to St. Luke) as the center point of our worship.

• Maundy Thursday, April 14; Good Friday, April 15; Holy Saturday/Easter Eve, April 16

On all three of those evenings (which, as you may recall my mentioning in previous years, together actually form one complete time of worship), we will gather for worship at **7:00pm**. On both Maundy Thursday and Good Friday evenings, we will join in "hybrid" worship, combining physically present and Zoom access to worship for all. On Holy Saturday/Easter Eve, our worship will not be available on Zoom, with the much smaller and quieter and darker setting of our downstairs chapel.

• Easter Day, April 17

We will once again gather in-person for a brief time of Sunrise Worship at **6:30am** in the field across from the pavilion, next to the sexton house (or under the pavilion roof in case of inclement weather). At **9:00am**, we will again proceed with our normal Faith Formation activities, in their usual combination of Zoom and inperson events. And at **10:15am**, we will likewise join in our new normal "hybrid" worship, combining inperson and Zoom opportunities as we celebrate the Good News that Jesus is Risen! *Please be watching for news about a possible return of our Easter morning breakfast, following the Sunrise Worship.*

And it occurs to me that I would be remiss if I didn't also mention that, on **April 24**, this **Second Sunday of Easter** will once again be the day of our **Easter Celebration Worship**. While the rest of the world will have already stored away the Easter decorations, concluding that Easter is over and done, we choose to live the truth that Easter is, in fact, a "week of weeks" – 49 days plus 1 – and our young persons, guided by Miss Laurie, will lead us in continuing that celebration. As Miss Laurie and the young persons continue to remind us, our God <u>Is</u> a Great Big God! Let's prepare to celebrate together just How Great and just How Big!!

I will look forward to being in worship with YOU, my sisters and brothers in this wonderful congregational family that is St. John, in this most Holy of times. Please don't hesitate to contact me with any questions or ideas!

Boundless Celebration and Retreat at Camp Nawakwa

The senior high youth group (those currently in 8th through 12th grade) are planning to attend the Gathering Celebration and Retreat at Camp Nawakwa from Sunday, July 24th to Wednesday, July 27th. This is in place of attending the ELCA Youth Gathering in Minneapolis, which was canceled earlier this year.

The 'Boundless' Celebration and Retreat, focuses on the 'Boundless' theme and incorporates the three unique days youth and young adults would experience at a typical Youth Gathering. Sunday, July 24, is the day that most closely resembles our Synod Day, with a catered meal, camp games and activities, live music, a visit from Bishop James Dunlop, and outdoor worship, all in the Upper Camp field and pavilion at Nawakwa. Retreat groups will participate in active learning on Monday morning, followed by camp activities in the afternoon, and an all-camp activity with the campers and camp staff Monday evening. Wednesday morning, groups will worship with the entire camp community, led by Pastors Jennifer & David Hope-Tringali, who are serving as camp Chaplains for the week. Jennifer and David shepherd Tree 4 Hope, a missionary ministry in Guatemala.
