

#### **Letter from the Pastor**

Dear Friends in Jesus,

Since December 24 falls on a Sunday this year, we again encounter one of those "only every once in a while" quirks of the Christian Church Year – a day with two very different purposes and two very different names.

On the <u>morning</u> of Sunday, December 24, we will be doing all of the things we do as a Congregational Family on most any Sunday morning – gathering for faith formation opportunities for all ages at 9:00am and then for worship at 10:15am. We will observe the <u>Fourth Sunday of Advent</u>, one final Sunday in blue where we will hear of the joy and promise of Jesus' coming and light those candles of waiting on our Advent Wreath.

But then, come the <u>late afternoon/evening</u> of Sunday, December 24, we will completely change gears and be doing the things we do as a Congregational Family each year when the beauty of <u>Christmas Eve</u> rolls around, exchanging our blue of hope and anticipation for the white of high festival times and lighting candles, not on a wreath of waiting, but to pray thankfully together and sing the beloved carol *Silent Night*. There will once again be two distinctive times of worship on Christmas Eve...

Our **4:00 P.M.** worship will once again have its own special focus and feel. We will do that with a focus on our young persons, including a Sunny Sermon and special music by our youngest members, set within worship that will, in general, be simpler and less formal than our traditional candlelight worship later that evening. Then, at **8:00 P.M.**, our traditional candlelight festival liturgy of Holy Communion will again take place in the nave with carols galore. Our goal at both 4:00 P.M. and 8:00 P.M. is to provide the most meaningful opportunities to worship our Newborn King for the most people of God. Please come and worship at one or both and please note that our musical preludes will be planned so that they wrap up and worship begins at the top of the hour, at 4:00 and 8:00. If you might have music of any kind that you would like to share during the prelude at either 4:00 or 8:00 (or both), please contact me as soon as possible if you have not already done so.

I realize that, on a day when everyone traditionally already has a great deal to attend to, asking you to come to worship twice in one day might seem like "overdoing it" , but I hope you will look at the morning and the late afternoon/evening as two essential pieces of one whole celebration – one not being really complete without the other and both very worthy of your time and best effort!

As we again enter into this holy time, reminded of just how very much God loves you and me and all that God has made, I want to thank you, my sisters and brothers in this wonderful congregational family, for another year of productive and, we pray, faithful ministry together – and I want to join with Ann to wish you a most blessed Advent and Christmas celebration and a strong beginning to another new year. A lot has changed over the past 23½ years, for all of us, and we know that change is built by God right into the very fabric of Creation, but the thankfulness that we both feel to be a part of the St. John congregational family – the honor that it is to journey in faith together – does not change. Thank you – and thank you for your kind attention in reading on in this **St. John's Epistle!**

# **Annual Congregational Meeting to be Held**

As specified in our congregational constitution, our Annual Congregational Meeting will be held in two parts. On **Sunday, December 10**, we will meet following worship to take action on the election of four members to our Congregational Council and to adopt a spending plan for 2024. On **Sunday, January 21**, we will again meet following worship to receive and act on reports of the ministry of our congregation conducted during 2023 and take care of such other business as may come before the gathered body. For both parts of the meeting, it is **very important** that we have a good turnout of voting members! Voting members are confirmed members of the congregation who have communed and made a contribution of record during 2022 and/or 2023. For those attending either or both parts of the meeting via Zoom, the Zoom host of the morning will make sure to keep a close eye on all Zoom participants for any questions that need forwarding to the floor of the meeting and when hands need to be raised for any voting.

To aid you in preparing for the December 10 meeting, the proposed 2024 combined budget for the Current, Children and Youth (C&Y), Flower, Improvement, and (newly combined in 2024) Sunday School Funds, along with the budget for the Benevolence Fund, are included in this *Epistle*.

To focus on that combined budget for a moment, covering the funds which handle far and away most of the day-to-day work of congregational ministry, you will notice that total anticipated 2024 income and expenditures show an increase of 4.6% from 2023. Part of this increase is due to the simple bookkeeping change of having the Sunday School Fund (\$3,100) included in these totals for the first time. Another part of the increase comes with well-deserved increases in compensation for Miss Laurie and our other paid staff and a necessary increase in heating oil expense. And finally, there is a 3.8% increase in Pastor Tom's area of the budget, to keep his compensation in line with the synodical minimum guideline and, for the second of two years, to provide for covering half of the cost of including Ann in Pastor Tom's health insurance plan for the coming year, after several years of savings in this area with Ann on a separate plan. This increased insurance cost should come to an end early in 2025, leading to a nice decrease in our 2025 budgets.

With regard to Congregational Council elections, our Nominating Committee is bringing the following four names for congregational action on December 10: **Justin Adams, Karen Gehring, Sandra Paul** and **Matthew Riland**.

Please don't miss this opportunity to help in the faithful strengthening of our ministry together – plan to join in these brief but important gatherings on December 10 and January 21!
