The Maurer Family Tree Farm of Dalmatia has graciously donated one of this years Christmas trees on display at the church.

Our winter session of Midweek Bible Study will get underway on **Wednesday**, **January 12** and continue through February 23, after which we will break for the Season of Lent. We will meet each week from 6:30 to 8:00 P.M. Please stay tuned for more information as to our format – in person/Zoom/hybrid, which will be guided in good measure by what is happening COVID-wise closer to that time. The topic of our winter study is also authored by our fall Bible Study writer, Rabbi Evan Moffic – **What Every Christian Needs to Know About the Jewishness of Jesus: A New Way of Seeing the Most Influential Rabbi in History**. In this new study, Rabbi Moffic, in his own words, shares with us "a new introduction to the rebel rabbi named Jesus." As always with these studies, no previous Bible study experience is required – only an interest and enthusiasm to study, reflect on, and (if and when you are comfortable doing so) discuss God's Word together! So that the correct number of study books can be ordered for our study, please register in advance (by speaking with Pastor Tom) by the end of the day Thursday, December 23.

If you are an Amazon.com shopper, our congregation is registered with the "Amazon Smiles" program, whereby Amazon donates one half of one percent of your purchase amount to a charitable organization that you select. Please note that, to qualify, your purchase has to be made through the "smile" side of things, to which you will find a very easily identifiable link from the main part of the Amazon.com website. Once you have selected us the first time, we will automatically be designated each time you shop and you won't need to re-do the search.) All monies received in this way will be automatically deposited for use in the Current Fund.

Three new 2022 sponsor sheets have also been posted on the foyer bulletin board – for continuing ministry support for our *Celebrate* bulletin inserts (\$22/month); for *Tree 4 Hope*, an innovative anti-poverty ministry begun by our neighbors at Tree of Life Evangelical Lutheran Church, Linglestown Road, Harrisburg, and serving those in need in Guatemala, involving an orphanage, mission trips from our area, and, now, a new girls' school called "Hope Academy" - a world mission with a local connection (\$50/month) – and for providing one month of a *Konde Diocese (in Tanzania, Africa) Pastors Salary* (\$50/month) . Please sign up on the foyer bulletin board to sponsor any of these three ministries in honor or in memory of loved ones or events. *Please note that, until we get closer to returning to all of the "normal/regular" details of worship, a sign-up sheet won't be posted for altar flowers. <i>Please stay tuned for updates about when we will be resuming our flower ministry!*

To make sure that our blessed prayer shawls get to as many folks in need of God's healing touch as possible, it is now possible for anyone from the St. John congregational family to deliver a prayer shawl to a person who is known to them to be hurting in body, mind, and/or spirit, and who would be blessed by receiving one of our shawls. To obtain a shawl, please first contact Pastor Tom, who will help you with the process. (*Please bear in mind that it is the intention of the prayer shawl ministry that each person receive just one shawl "for life", to be used in whatever time(s) of brokenness they may face.*)

If you are not currently comfortable taking part in in-person worship, there are **three** very simple options for giving your tithes and offerings. In all cases, Pastor Tom will then see that all offerings received get securely passed along to our counters.
