Dear Friends in Jesus,

I want to thank the good folks at my former congregation, Holy Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church of Lanse, PA, for the following joke which was included in a recent newsletter:

A pastor decided to skip church one Sunday morning and go play golf. After telling her assistant that she wasn't feeling well, she drove to a golf course in another city, so nobody would recognize her. She teed off on the first hole. As her ball took flight, a huge gust of wind caught it, carrying it an extra 150 yards and dropping it right in the hole, for a 450-yard hole in one! At that moment, an angel in heaven looked at God and asked, "What'd you do that for?" God smiled and said, "Who's she going to tell?"

As with my (totally fictional, I'm sure!) colleague, many things call out to us for attention on a Sunday morning. It seems to me that, as is so often the pattern in human history, we have swung from one extreme (the days of "blue laws" and there being almost nothing besides explicitly-Christian activities taking place on a Sunday) to the other (where hunting here in Pennsylvania will apparently soon be added to the ever-growing slate of available Sunday activities), and I highly doubt that will be slowing down. I've often stated my contention that Jesus doesn't expect that we never miss worship – that there are indeed sometimes other tasks to be done in God's name that take us away on a Sunday morning. But worship with our congregational family – or a congregational family away from home – should absolutely be our "default setting". Except for those infrequent times when God's work calls us in another direction, or those occasional times where sickness or other personal emergency get in the way, worship should be where we are, for God's sake as well as for our own.

As I was sharing with Congregational Council at our November meeting, our average Sunday congregational family worship attendance this year has been – well, "very average", for lack of a better term – just kind of flat when looked at from the perspective of our almost two decades together. I'm thinking that God has in mind something more for us – that, in addition to our presence in worship being necessary simply to say a great big "THANK YOU" to God,

these times in which we are living make it even more critical that we band together in worship as a congregational family to be reminded of and strengthened for our calling to be God's people of love in a challenging world.

So, as the year 2019 begins to come toward its close, please step back and prayerfully take a look at your life of worship, your participation in the Sunday life of your congregational family. What do you see? What is your default setting? What do you allow to take you away? How does what you see align with what you believe Jesus would want for you as His beloved child?

As we again enter into this holy time of the Church Year, reminded once again of just how very much God loves you and me and all that God has made, I want to thank you, my sisters and brothers in this wonderful congregational family, for another year of productive and, we pray, faithful ministry together – Ann and I wish and pray for each of you a most blessed Advent and Christmas celebration and a strong beginning to another new year!

Advent Christmas Event

Once again this year, we have some unique opportunities to enrich our journey through the wonderful seasons of Advent and Christmas. Please see Miss Laurie's letter in this *St. John's Epistle* for all the details about our **December 15** "Advent/ Christmas <u>Event</u>" which will get underway at **4:30 P.M.**

Then, on **Christmas Eve**, our **4:00 P.M.** worship will once again have its own special focus and feel. We will do that with a focus on our young persons, including a Sunny Sermon and music by the "Jingle Elves" celebration choir, set within worship that will, in general, be simpler and less formal than our later traditional candlelight worship later that evening. Then, at **8:00 P.M.**, our traditional candlelight festival liturgy of Holy Communion will again take place in the nave with carols galore. Our goal at both 4:00 P.M. and 8:00 P.M. is to provide the most meaningful opportunities to worship our Newborn King for the most people of God. Please come and worship at one or both! *Please note that, in a change from recent years, our musical preludes will begin prior to the top of the hour, so that we are ready for worship to begin at 4:00 and 8:00 sharp. (And, if you have music of any kind that you would like to share at either 4:00 or 8:00 (or both), please contact Pastor Tom as soon as possible if you have not already done so.)*

Annual Congregational Meeting To Be Held

As specified in our congregational constitution, our Annual Congregational Meeting will be held in two parts. On **Sunday, December 8**, we will meet following worship to take action on the election of four members to our Congregational Council and to adopt a spending plan for 2020. On **Sunday, January 19**, we will again meet following worship to receive and act on reports of the ministry of our congregation conducted during 2019 and take care of such other business as may come before the gathered body. For both parts of the meeting, it is **very important** that we have a good turnout of voting members! Voting members are confirmed members of the congregation who have communed and made a contribution of record during 2018 and/or 2019.

To aid you in preparing for the December 8 meeting, the proposed 2020 budgets for the Current Fund and the Children and Youth Fund are included in this *Epistle*. To focus on the 2020 Current Fund budget for a moment, our largest fund which handles most of the day to day work of congregational ministry, you will notice that it shows a total increase of only \$746 or just under a half-percent from 2019. This small increase basically comes from Pastor Tom's section of the budget, with the recommendation to again set his salary to the minimum figure specified by synodical guidelines for someone with his years (32) of pastoral experience being partly offset by a decrease in the cost of his health insurance benefits. For its part, the Children and Youth Fund, from which Miss Laurie's important ministry is provided, shows a \$470 or 2% increase, reflecting a much-deserved 2% increase in her compensation.

With regard to Congregational Council elections, our Nominating Committee is bringing the following four names for congregational action: **Roy Henry, Ken Koller, Heidi Lehman** and **Lori Motter**.

Please don't miss this opportunity to help in the faithful strengthening of our ministry together – plan to join in these brief but important gatherings on December 8 and January 19!

Equal Exchange Program

OUR PARTNERS

Equal Exchange has initiated partnerships with small scale dairy farmers in Vermont and Wisconsin (with other partnerships on the way!) These partners share a commitment to animal welfare, to ecologically responsible practices, and to the maintenance of rural communities. If they hire workers outside the immediate family, they treat those workers respectfully and pay them fairly.

There is cheese available from Equal Exchange in the kitchen refrigerator. Honor system prevails. Put money in plastic bag in refrigerator.

RED BARN WISCONSIN

Red Barn is a network of 10 small family farms in Wisonsin. The network was started by a veterinarian, so theres a special emphasis on treating the anumals humanely and giving high priority to their health. Each Red Barn farm has 75 or fewer dairy cows, a scale that allows each farming family to care for a herd with minimal outside labor, and treat each cow as an individual.

NEIGHBORLY FARMS OF VERMONT

Neighborly Farms of Vermont is a third generation farm owned by The Dimmick Family. Its an organic small scale dairy with an on site creamery. The sixty head herd lives in an open barn, with access to pasture, and milking is done by a high tech robot. A few times a day - on their own! - each cow enters the stall, gets some food, gets cleaned and is automatically milked.

The council meeting was called to order by President, Dan Langhans. Pastor Tom opened the meeting with devotions and a prayer.

Minutes: Motion by Matt Williard and seconded by Barb Bullock to approve the minutes (with noted corrections) from the July 2019 meeting. Motion approved unanimously.

Reception of Petitions and Communications:

The monthly water inspections were completed and passed for both July and August.

The six-month elevator inspection was completed and passed.

Pastor's Report: Motion made by Donna Rabenold and seconded by Dan Maurer to accept the pastor's reports for July and August. Motion approved unanimously.

Children and Youth Ministry Report: Motion was made by Carol Hassinger and seconded by Matt Williard to accept Miss Laurie's July and August reports. Motion approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Motion made by Pat Herb and seconded by Arlene Doyle to accept the treasurer's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Reports of Standing Committees:

Church Property: Several maintenance issues have been taken care of. The cross has been hung above the alter in the social room and the cabinet was hung in the youth room on the third floor. Sandra Lamenza reported on the options and bids she received for repairing the plaster and painting the sanctuary. She will attend the September property committee meeting and discuss options with them.

Finance: No report

Worship and Music: The committee met on September 10. There are seven outdoor services scheduled on the following dates: May 24, June 21, July 5, July 12, July 26, August 16, September 6. The earlier summer service schedule will start May 24 and end September 13.

Motion was presented by the committee and seconded by Matt Williard to have the Lykens Valley Bluegrass Band return for one of the summer services. Motion approved unanimously.

The decision was made to retire the large nativity that has been positioned at the front of the sanctuary where the grand piano now sits. The committee recommended that the smaller nativity made by Fearl Lenker be moved to the sanctuary at a different location possibly in the entrance. Sandra Lamenza offered to find a suitable location and set up the nativity.

Faith Formation Team: Getting ready for the fall programs.

Youth Ministry: A trip is planned to go miniature golfing with a stop at Sweet Treats. They are working on assembling 500 school kits, A Gaga Pit was purchased and set up in the ball field. They will be going to the Bethesda Mission in October with cans of soup and Sterno heaters.
