The 2024 schedule of Greeters will soon be prepared. If you would be interested in serving occasionally in this important ministry, please speak with Pastor Tom. Basically, this ministry involves arriving about 15-20 minutes prior to worship on a Sunday morning when scheduled and standing (or sitting if needed – no problem) just inside the main doors in the foyer to say a warm hello to those arriving for the morning. For those coming through the doors for the first time, a point in the right direction can also be a great help. No experience is required, and the Greeter(s) assigned on a given morning can be a single person, a couple, or an entire family as desired. And, if it turns out that you aren't able to serve on a scheduled date, you can simply switch with someone else on the schedule or, if it is at the last minute, simply let Pastor Tom know. Thank you for prayerfully considering this call to serve!

Four new 2024 sponsor sheets are now posted on the bulletin board in the foyer area – three of them 1. for continuing ministry support for our *Celebrate* bulletin inserts (\$22/month); 2. for *Tree 4 Hope*, an innovative anti-poverty ministry begun by our neighbors at Tree of Life Evangelical Lutheran Church, Linglestown Road, Harrisburg, and serving those in need in Guatemala, involving an orphanage, mission trips from our area, and, now, a new girls' school called "Hope Academy" - a world mission with a local connection (\$50/month) – and 3. for providing one month of a *Konde Diocese (in Tanzania, Africa) Pastors Salary* (\$50/month). The fourth is the separate sign-up sheet for sponsoring weekly altar flowers in 2024, (\$35 per week).
