Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus,

As I write these lines in mid-November, it looks like all of the pieces are coming together to allow us to return to our more familiar Sunday morning schedule of **9:00 A.M. Faith Formation Time** (Sunday School) and **10:15 A.M. Worship**, beginning on **November 29**, the **First Sunday of Advent**. For Faith Formation Time, this really just represents a change of time, from our current 9:45 to our "tried and true" 9:00. But for Worship, this will mean several substantive changes in how we have recently been doing things. First of all, we will be discontinuing our 8:30 Zoom-only worship because, second of all, we will all be able to come together to our 10:15 worship, either by being at the church in-person or by logging in/calling in via the Zoom platform:

For those attending 10:15 worship in-person, our ushers will still be guiding everyone to safely spaced, designated seating, and masks, covering both nose and mouth at all times, will still be required of everyone, with no exceptions of any kind. Since our safe seating plan can accommodate approximately 65-70 people, and since thus far our in-person attendance has been averaging only in the upper-20's, there should continue to be adequate seating for all at 10:15.

For those attending 10:15 worship via Zoom, the call in/log in process will still work exactly the same but when Zoom opens up, instead of showing Miss Laurie and Judy and me in our living rooms, your screen will include rectangles showing two views of worship at the church – one a close-up of the lectern area from where I am currently leading worship and the other which will alternate between showing Judy and our other keyboardists at the organ and showing an overall view of worship from the balcony area. To avoid possible interference with the flow of worship coming from the church, all Zoom participants will find that their mikes will need to be muted at all times, but the chat function will continue just like before, allowing Zoomers to continue to directly connect.

Whether you are present at 10:15 in-person or via Zoom, Council's and my goal is to have worship be a seamless experience for you, allowing you to continue to have a blessed worship experience in the way that seems safest and best for you as we go forward together. We will in no way be back to "normal" on November 29, but it represents one more hopeful and prayerful step along the winding road leading in that direction. A big "Thank You" is due to our overall Zoom coordinators, Roy & Rachel Henry, as well as the folks who have stepped up to help Rachel and Roy with Zoom hosting, as a part of our new Video Ministry Team!

Speaking of worship as December begins of course brings up thoughts of Christmas Eve worship. As I write these lines, Miss Laurie, Worship & Music Committee, Congregational Council, and I are still figuring out how we might best worship both safely and meaningfully on this important day. I feel confident that Christmas Eve will continue to include more than one time of worship to suit different schedules and that there will be both in-

person/candle lighting and Zoom opportunities, subject of course, to developments with regard to the virus. Please stay tuned for those details – and please feel free to share your ideas with me.

I am anticipating that our Winter Midweek Bible Study will get underway on Wednesday, January 6 (the festival day of Epiphany), from 6:30 to 8:00 P.M. again via Zoom, but I am still working out the details, including what the coming of the Season of Lent will mean for Wednesdays in general and Bible Study in particular in 2021. Here again, please stay tuned for details as we get closer to time, but feel free to sign up with me at any time.

As the past almost nine months have held tumult and change such as most of us have never before experienced, I have been finding deep hope and assurance in the steady turning of the Church Year, reminding me and you that the followers of Jesus have experienced challenges like ours and many, many much more trying times over the past almost-2,000 years. But, led by the Holy Spirit, the worship calendar has continued to turn and our ancestors in the faith have endured, as shall we. As we again enter into this holy time of the Church Year, reminded once again of just how very much God loves you and me and all that God has made, I want to thank you, my sisters and brothers in this wonderful congregational family, for another year of productive and faithful – even if much changed and adapted – ministry together. Ann and I wish and pray for each of you a most blessed Advent and Christmas celebration and many joyous new beginnings in the year 2021 to come!

Annual Congregational Meeting to Be Held

As specified in our congregational constitution, our Annual Congregational Meeting will be held in two parts. On **Sunday, December 13**, we will meet following worship to take action on the election of four members to our Congregational Council and to adopt a spending plan for 2021. On **Sunday, January 17**, we will again meet following worship to receive and act on reports of the ministry of our congregation conducted during 2020 and take care of such other business as may come before the gathered body. For both parts of the meeting, it is **very important** that we have a good turnout of voting members! Voting members are confirmed members of the congregation who have communed and made a contribution of record during 2019 and/or 2020.

Since our plan is that folks will be attending 10:15 A.M. worship on December 13 and January 17 both in-person and via Zoom, we will also plan that everyone will be able to simply attend the two parts of our Congregational Meeting in those same ways. For those attending either or both parts via Zoom, the Zoom host of the morning will make sure to keep a close eye on all Zoom participants for any questions that need forwarding to the floor of the meeting and when hands need to be raised for any voting. But there is one potential Zoom participation issue of which all those <u>calling in with a telephone</u> need to be aware. Because telephone participants can neither be seen by the Zoom host nor unmute themselves, there doesn't seem to be any way for telephone participants to give input to the meeting by way of their Zoom connection, so we are hoping that perhaps all those who normally Zoom via their telephone will be able, just for December 13 and/or January 17, to find a way to Zoom by way of an internet-connected device, maybe shared with a family member. If this will not be possible, please contact Pastor Tom or Roy or Rachel Henry, who will try to work out a way by which telephone Zoomers could call the telephone of someone on the floor of the meeting.

To aid you in preparing for the December 13 meeting, the proposed 2021 combined budget for the Current, Children and Youth (C&Y), Flower, and Improvement Funds, along with the budget for the Benevolence Fund, are included in this *Epistle*. To focus on that combined budget for a moment, covering the funds which handle far and away most of the day to day work of congregational ministry, you will notice that total anticipated 2021 expenditures show a <u>decrease</u> of just over \$8,000 or 4.2% from 2020. This decrease is the combined effect of 1. a \$9,300 decrease in Pastor Tom's area of the budget with greatly reduced health insurance costs and mileage, partially offset by a proposed 2.2% increase in his salary/housing allowance; 2. similar proposed 2.2%

increases in compensation for Miss Laurie and our other paid staff; and 3. a \$2,000 budgeted increase in insurance costs.

With regard to Congregational Council elections, our Nominating Committee is bringing the following four names for congregational action on December 13: **Ira Antes, Sheila Barder, Michael Henninger** and **Dana Klouser**.

Please don't miss this opportunity to help in the faithful strengthening of our ministry together – plan to join in these brief but important gatherings on December 13 and January 17!



The council meeting was called to order by President, Roy Henry. Pastor Tom opened the meeting with devotions and a prayer.

Present: Roy Henry, Carol Hassinger, Sandra Lamenza, Matt Williard, Barbara Bullock, Dan Maurer, Ken Koller, Ron Erb, Heidi Lehman, Lori Motter, and Pastor Tom Bruner

Excused Absence: Darrell Denlinger, Arlene Doyle

Minutes: Motion by Ron Erb and seconded by Barb Bullock to accept the August minutes. Motion approved unanimously.

Reception of Petitions and Communications:

The monthly water inspections for July and August were completed and passed.

A thank you note was received from Bethesda Mission for our contribution to the Women's and Children's Ministry.

Pastor's Report: Motion made by Dan Maurer and seconded by Matt Williard to accept the pastor's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Children and Youth Ministry Report: Motion was made by Matt Williard and seconded by Dan Maurer to accept Miss Laurie's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Motion made by Ron Erb and seconded by Dan Maurer to accept the treasurer's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Reports of Standing Committees:

Many of the committees have not been meeting due to the COVID 19 pandemic. Any business that needed attention has been handled through phone calls.

Church Property: There are several window issues in the sexton's house and the church as well as several other repair projects that will require a professional. The committee will get estimates for the work. They are also getting estimates for replacing the gutters on the pavilion. The baseball field backstop fencing and the seesaw need repair. The committee voted to eliminate both items rather than repair. The baseball field is not being used, and the seesaw does not meet necessary safety requirements.

Finance: There will be a budget meeting on October 28.

Worship and Music: The committee will meet in November. A motion was made by the committee and seconded by Dan Maurer to cancel the Thanksgiving Eve service. Motion approved unanimously. A decision was made to delay confirmation until Pentecost on May 23, 2021.

Faith Formation Team: No report

Youth Ministry: The group has scheduled a LYO school kit assembly day. They will be meeting once a month on Zoom. All fundraisers have been cancelled through the end of the year.

Mutual Ministry: No report.

COVID 19: Miss Laurie will resume in-person activities on September 20.

Roy Henry reported on the options for installing an improved WIFI service to operate Zoom in the church. He presented proposals from Comcast and ATT. It was decided to pursue the ATT option. The goal is to have the in-person service and the Zoom service at the same time in the church.

The plan is to continue the outdoor services through October 18. Indoor services will start on October 25 with the current time schedule of 11am.

New Business: The issue of Christmas decorations for the church was discussed. It was recommended that we keep the decorations simple this year because of the uncertainty regarding the impact of COVID 19.

Next Council Meeting: Scheduled for November 1at 4pm via Zoom.

Adjournment: Motion by Ron Erb and seconded by Dan Maurer to adjourn the meeting. Motion approved unanimously.
