DID YOU PICK UP YOUR ADVENT DEVOTIONAL BOOKLET?

If you have not yet done so, please be sure to pick up your household's copy of our Advent devotional booklet *Wait for the Lord* at the church as soon as possible. The Season of Advent begins on November 30 this year, and it is Pastor Tom's hope that we will all make use of this common resource for Bible reading during the Advent Season of preparation, much as we did back in Lent – in addition to the regular daily Bible reading which we each do throughout the rest of the year, not instead of. This year's devotional includes daily meditations from the great spiritual leader and guide Henri Nouwen which tie in with the readings on the litanies we will be using each week in worship for the lighting of our Advent Wreath. (And, thanks to a bulk discount in ordering the booklets, there are also some extra copies available for your family members and friends who are not officially a part of our congregational family – please see Pastor Tom.)

MEN'S CHOIR MEMBERS WANTED!

A Men's Choir will again be forming to sing for Christmas Eve worship. Two rehearsals will be held – on Tuesday, December 9, and Tuesday, December 16, from 6:30 to 7:30 both evenings. A final rehearsal will be held before 4:00 P.M. worship on Christmas Eve. Since this is a new group that comes together each time, and not a standing choir, all males of any age or experience with singing are especially welcome to join the group. Please speak with Pastor Tom or Carol Hubler to learn more.

ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING TO BE HELD

As specified in our congregational constitution, our Annual Congregational Meeting will be held in two parts. On Sunday, December 14, we will meet following worship to take action on the election of four members to our Congregational Council and to adopt a Current Fund budget for 2015. On Sunday, January 18, we will again meet following worship to receive and act on reports of the ministry of our congregation conducted during 2014, and conduct such other business as may come before the gathered body. We will also take some time on January 18 to talk about tentative plans with regard to 1. calling a part-time staff person to work in the area of Ministry with Children & Youth and 2. constructing a kitchen/social hall adjacent to the pavilion. Please note that no votes will be taken and no official decisions will be made on January 18 – it will be a time of information sharing and question and answer only. For both parts of the meeting, it is very important that we have a good turn out of voting members! Voting members are confirmed members of the congregation who have communed and made a contribution of record during 2013 and/or 2014.

To aid you in preparing for the December 14 meeting, a copy of the proposed budget for 2015 is included in this *Epistle*. Its projected Current Fund budget increase of \$7,648 (from \$133,608 to \$141,256) represents a 5.7% increase from 2014. This overall increase includes 1) a \$6,977 (7.0%) increase in Pastor Tom's area of the budget (keeping his salary and housing allowance still just a bit above the minimum guideline for 2015 adopted by our Lower Susquehanna Synod but especially showing the effects of a steep increase — over \$5,000 — in the cost of insurances) and 2) well-deserved small increases for our organist, secretary, and sexton.

With regard to Congregational Council elections, our Nominating Committee is bringing the following four names for congregational action: Gail Billow, Joseph Doyle, Dale Hassinger, and Tamara Spicher.

Please don't miss this opportunity to help in the faithful strengthening of our ministry together – plan to join in these brief but important gatherings on December 14 and January 18!

CHRISTMAS EVE WORSHIP SCHEDULE

At 4:00 P.M. on Christmas Eve, a quiet liturgy of Holy Communion will again be held. Carols accompanied by the piano will be a part of our liturgy, and we will get to enjoy all the beautiful Christmas decorations, but there will not be a candlelighting service. We will gather together upstairs near the front of the Nave, so that our typically smaller attendance does not feel "lost" in this large space. This worship opportunity is designed especially for those folks who, for whatever reason, are not able to come to the later traditional worship.

Then, at 8:00 P.M., our traditional candlelight festival liturgy of Holy Communion will again take place in the nave with carols galore. We will be blessed with special musical preludes to begin both worship services. Please note that these preludes will begin at 4:00 P.M. and 8:00 P.M., so that the most worshipers can enjoy the music. If you have music of any kind that you would like to share at either or both services, please contact Pastor Tom as soon as possible if you have not already done so.

For anyone attending the 8:00 worship with portable oxygen, we will again have a special area, with comfortable seating and a great view, set aside on the north side of the back of the balcony, across from the choir. This will keep those with oxygen safe from the candles being held by worshipers on the main floor, as well as those being held by members of the choir. We will again have on hand a number of battery-operated "candles", with tips that resemble a flame, for use by those in this "flame-free" seating area during the candlelighting. Also, Pastor Tom and his assistants will bring Holy Communion to anyone seated in this special area.

Come and worship! Worship Christ, the newborn King!!

WINTER SESSION OF BIBLE STUDY

Midweek Bible Study will resume for its winter session on Wednesday, January 14, meeting weekly through February 11, when we will take a break for Lent and Holy Week. We will meet each week from 6:30 to 8:00 P.M., and we will be finishing our study, begun in the fall, taking a look at the beliefs and practices of other denominational branches of our Christian Family, as well as other world religions, using a resource called *Honoring Our Neighbor's Faith*. (If you have ever found yourself wondering what makes us distinct from our Amish neighbors – or our United Church of Christ neighbors or our Mormon neighbors – this class will attempt to address those questions.) Since each session of the study is independent from the rest, interested folks can easily "jump in" for this winter part of the study. As always, no previous Bible study experience is required – only an interest and enthusiasm to study, reflect on, and discuss God's Word together! If you were not a part of the fall study, please register in advance (by speaking with Pastor Tom) no later than Friday, January 9, (when he returns to the office) so that the correct number of new study books can be ordered.

LOOKING AHEAD – SUMMER IS COMING!

The date has been set for our Annual Strawberry Festival in 2015. It will take place on Wednesday, June 10, in our grove and pavilion. Although serious planning has not yet begun for the Festival, Brad Crum has again been booked as entertainment for the early/mid afternoon timeslot, singing as Elvis, and – new this year – the local musical group *Shotgunn*, of which our own Darrell Denlinger is a part, will be performing in the late afternoon/early evening.

Also, the dates of Vacation Bible School have been set, running Monday, July 20, through Friday, July 24, with the closing program taking place on Sunday, July 26, outside in the pavilion.

Please save these dates in your family's calendar, and please spread the news to your friends and neighbors. Summer will be here before we know it!

PLEASE HELP

As we near the end of the year, please be sure that, if you are a communing member of St. John, you have turned in at least one communion record card this year. If during the year you have been living and worshiping out of the area, or if you have communed even once at another congregation, please be sure to have that congregation send notice to Pastor Tom. If you are a contributing member of the congregation, please be sure that you have used your offering envelopes at least once this year, so that you are on record as having made a contribution. (And, following January 1, please remember that the same record keeping need exists in the new year.) Please do your part to make sure that our parish records are as accurate as possible!

In keeping with the wishes of Brian and Jodi, the money raised has been divided between leukemia research and their own extra financial needs in these challenging months.
