A Letter from The Pastor.....

Dear Friends in Jesus,

Here at the end of one year and the beginning of another, my letter this month concerns a number of mostly unrelated things that I'd like to share with you:

First, as Miss Laurie also mentions in her letter, I'm delighted to say that she and I are teaming up this year to realize a long held goal of mine — to give our 4:00 P.M. worship on Christmas Eve its own special focus and feel. We will do that with a focus on our young persons, including a Sunny Sermon and music by our Celebration Choir, set within worship that will, in general, be simpler and less formal than our later traditional candlelight worship later that evening. Our goal at both 4:00 P.M. and 8:00 P.M. is to provide the most meaningful opportunities to worship our Newborn King for the most people of God. Please come and worship at one or both and please note that, as in prior years, our musical preludes will begin at the top of the hour, at 4:00 and 8:00.

Second, since December 24 falls on a Sunday this year, it is <u>both</u> the 4th Sunday of Advent as well as Christmas Eve, which means that our regular 10:15 A.M. weekly worship will focus on the completion of our Advent journey of waiting and preparation, before we make the move to our Christmas celebration at 4:00 P.M. Please plan to take part <u>both</u> in the morning and in the evening, since they will compliment and enrich each other, rather than duplicating!

Third, a request for your help with our elevator... In the past year, we have had to make several service calls, including last Christmas Eve as you may recall, all of them relating to the door mechanism. Never has it been an issue of safety or of getting stuck. Instead it is a matter of elevator door alignment being a very touchy and temperamental thing – finicky even. Our elevator service company has told us that a great deal of their work, whether on large commercial elevators or on small limited use ones like ours, is door repair, and that it is very important that we all do our best to take good care of those doors. Specifically, please try never to use your hand to force the doors open or to hold them open. Likewise, please don't put things in the way of the doors to hold them open. Please do use the "door open" button in the car, with the arrows that point out, holding it as long as you might need.

Fourth, a change to let you know about with regard to using the Sunday School Room/chapel downstairs for personal/family functions, like birthday parties, showers, and holiday dinners ... At its November 12 meeting, Council took action to require that folks who use this room for non-congregational activities 1. take their trash along with them and 2. sweep and clean up the room, making every effort to leave it just the way they found it, including the positioning of chairs and tables. These changes serve to bring the rules for use of this room into line with the rules for use of our pavilion. If in doubt, the bottom line for us all is to please treat our church building and facilities as if they were our own home – because they are!

Fifth, I'm delighted to share with you that, effective in December, we are now getting our wine for Holy Communion from Broad Mountain Vineyard in Elizabethville instead of from the out of state source we had been using until now. In fact, the Michael's, who own and operate the vineyard, are donating the wine for our use. Since we use about 24 bottles, or two cases, each year, this is no small gift! If you have the opportunity, please add your personal thanks to the thanks which I have extended on behalf of our congregational family. It is good to be using wine coming from the God-given soil of our own area for this awesome Meal in which Jesus meets us!

And finally, <u>last but in no way least</u>, I want to thank you for another year of productive and, we pray, faithful ministry together – and I want to join with Tim and Dan and Ann to wish you, our wonderful congregational family, a most blessed Advent and Christmas celebration and a strong beginning to another new year. A lot has changed over the past 17½ years, for all of us, and we know that change is built by God right into the very fabric of Creation, but the thankfulness that the four of us feel to be a part of the St. John congregational family – the honor that it is to journey in faith together – does not change. Thank you – and thank you for your kind attention in reading!

Winter Session of Bible Study

As the 2017 observance of the 500th Anniversary of the beginning of the Protestant Reformation comes to an end, Midweek Bible Study this winter will continue the study begun last fall with a look at the work for which (except for his 95 Theses themselves) Martin Luther is perhaps best remembered – *The Small Catechism* – continuing our journey through a brand new 500th Anniversary resource called *By Heart: Conversations with Martin Luther's Small Catechism*. This richly illustrated resource, complete with companion DVD, will again guide our exploration of Luther's guide to the most important aspects of our Christian Faith. The study will resume on Wednesday, January 10, and then will meet each Wednesday from 6:30 to 8:00 P.M. through February 7, when we will take a break for Ash Wednesday, Lent, and Holy Week. No previous Bible study experience is required – only an interest and enthusiasm to study, reflect on, and discuss God's Word together! If you were not a part of the fall study, please register in advance (by speaking with Pastor Tom) no later than Wednesday, January 3 (when he returns to the office), so that the correct number of new study books can be ordered.

Please Help

As we near the end of the year, please be sure that, if you are a communing member of St. John, you have turned in at least one communion record card this year. If during the year you have been living and worshiping out of the area, or if you have communed even once at another congregation, please be sure to have that congregation send notice to Pastor Tom. If you are a contributing member of the congregation, please be sure that you have used your offering envelopes at least once this year, so that you are on record as having made a contribution. (And, following January 1, please remember that the same record keeping need exists in the new year.) Please do your part to make sure that our parish records are as accurate as possible!

Annual Congregation Meeting to be Held!

As specified in our congregational constitution, our Annual Congregational Meeting will be held in two parts. On **Sunday, December 10**, we will meet following worship to take action on the election of four members to our Congregational Council and to adopt a spending plan for 2018. On **Sunday, January 21**, we will again meet following worship to receive and act on reports of the ministry of our congregation conducted during 2017, and conduct such other business as may come before the gathered body. For both parts of the meeting, it is **very important** that we have a good turn out of voting members! Voting members are confirmed members of the congregation who have communed and made a contribution of record during 2016 and/ or 2017.

To aid you in preparing for the December 10 meeting, a copy of the proposed budget for 2018 is included in this *Epistle*. You will note that there are, in fact, several budgets included in addition to that of the Current Fund, thanks to the hard work of our new treasurer, Jamie Doyle, and her wish going forward to include as much meaningful financial information for you as possible. To focus on the 2018 Current Fund budget for a moment, the largest one which handles most of the day to day work of congregational ministry, you will notice that it shows a total increase of about \$10,000 or 6.9% from 2017. Right off the bat, it is important to note that the amount of new expenses over 2017 is actually more like \$7,000 or 4.8%, since \$3,000 of the increase shown comes not from new expenditures but rather from showing some expenses we incur every year which haven't previously been broken out in the budget. Of the \$7,000 increase, not quite \$4,400 comes from Pastor Tom's section of the budget, with the recommendation to increase his salary to the minimum figure specified by synodical guidelines for someone with 30 years of experience and the effect of this increase on other benefit costs, while another \$800 comes from our new contract with Custer & Faust for payroll and tax preparation and \$1,500 comes from increasing the repair and maintenance line item.

With regard to Congregational Council elections, our Nominating Committee is bringing the following four names for congregational action: Barbara Bulloch, Darrell Denlinger, Carol Hassinger, and Daniel Maurer.

Please don't miss this opportunity to help in the faithful strengthening of our ministry together – plan to join in these brief but important gatherings on December 10 and January 21!

St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church Congregational Council Meeting Minutes October 8, 2017

The Council Meeting was called to order by Pastor Tom who also offered prayer and devotions.

Present – Carl Baumgardner, Gail Billow, Jeff Buffington, Jamie Doyle, Joseph Doyle, Dale Hassinger, Dan Langhans, Donna Rabenold, Tamara Spicher and Pastor Tom

Excused Absences - Patricia Herb

Unexcused Absences - Henry Henninger,

Reading of Minutes: Motion by Donna Rabenold, 2nd by Carl Baumgardner to accept the minutes. Motion passed unanimously.

Reception of Petitions and Communications: Thank you note received from Lower Susquehanna Synod for our sponsorship of the Konde Diocese in Tanzania.

Request from Morgan Cook, Chair of the Cub Scout for \$40 to sponsor new Cub Scout member with limited resources. Request for \$50 from each church to sponsor Martin Luther movie at Colonade on 10/22. Motion by Carl Baumgardner, 2nd by Joe Doyle to sponsor both requests from the Bicentennial Fund. Motion passed unanimously.

Water test as Friday report dated September 15, 2017 was not in compliance. The UV light was replaced and the sewage tank was pumped out immediately. Pure Test tested water on 9/18 and it was fine. We're waiting for a 2nd clean test to be sure. Permission received from Sewage Enforcement Officer to do some digging and look for connector line that may be broken. Leak stemmed from a bad hose connection and is fixed. 5 year DEP inspection of our water system was conducted and the only item flagged was that we're not supposed to have underground line after the UV light. However, this is an existing condition and we don't have to alter it.

Elevator door stopped working last week and the Tech diagnosed a problem with the rubber stopper on the 2nd Floor which signifies alignment and just needed adjusted. Just a reminder, don't hold the door open, push the button to keep the door from closing.

Sandra Lamenza would like to purchase slightly imperfect refrigerator from Lowe's for the kitchen and have it delivered. Lowe's will dispose of the old one.

Discussed a recommendation from Custer & Faust to pay the Children & Youth Coordinator out of the Current Fund to make it cleaner and easier for them to track and calculate the taxes. The Current Fund will be reimbursed from the Children & Youth Fund. During the first 3 quarters of 2017, the payment amount has been based on \$20/hour for an average of 20 hours per week which equals \$800 every two weeks (based on 26 pays per year = \$20,800 for the year if no vacation is taken), but for the final quarter of the year will change to a frequency of 24 pays per year (\$20,800/24 = \$866.67 on the 15^{th} and last days of each month if no vacation is taken).

Motion by Carl, 2^{nd} by Jamie to do so. Motion passed unanimously. We will continue to track Children & Youth as a separate fund during the initial 3 year period that was part of the original plan.

Pastor's Report: Motion by Dale Hassinger, 2nd by Gail Billow to accept Pastor's report. Motion Passed unanimously.

Children & Youth: Motion by Jeff Buffington, 2nd by Gail Billow to accept the Children & Youth Ministry report. Motion passed unanimously.

Report of Treasurers: Motion by Gail Billow, 2nd by Dale Hassinger to accept the treasurer's reports. Motion passed unanimously.

Reports of Standing Committees:

Church Property: Put new roof on sexton's house on the part that does down to the basement & replacing window. 3 maple trees were planted along cemetery by road.

Finance Committee: Meeting 10/9 for Budget planning

Worship & Music: Met at Tree of Life, Linglestown to discuss ideas on contemporary services. Committee will continue exploration on this topic. Setting 10 of the liturgy will take place soon.

Faith Formation Team: Next meeting 10/10
