Dear Friends in Jesus,

As a beautiful Christmas Season of worship now rapidly recedes into the past, I'd like to share several details about upcoming February worship for your calendars...

The first would be to make a slight correction in what I just said for, while it is true that the 12-Day Christmas Season has ended, we aren't quite done with the observance of Christmas. By one traditional Christian reckoning, the 40-Day period that begins with Christmas Day as Day #1 and ends with February 2 as Day #40 makes up its own Christmas cycle and so, on February 2, we will celebrate a festival called Presentation of Our Lord and read the story of Jesus' parents bringing their little baby to the Temple in Jerusalem for presentation to God as required in the Old Testament Law. So, just for that morning, we will be flashing back to the birth and infancy of Jesus and we will do some caroling one more time. Then, the decorating committee will take down the last of the greenery and it will soon be on to the Season of Lent. Since that first Sunday in February is also Scout Sunday, we will again be welcoming members and parents and leaders from our Cub Scout Pack #46. And, please don't forget that February 2 will also be our First Annual "Sports Jersey Day". Get your favorite sports jersey ready now - from any sport, from the collegiate level, minor league level, or major league level - and let's have a rainbow of color in worship that morning.

The following Sunday, February 9, the youth of our congregation will again be taking the entire leadership of our worship – please plan to be here for worship of God and support of our youth! <u>And please note that ushers, greeters, and other persons scheduled to serve in worship that morning will not be needed, as the youth will be taking on all those roles.</u>

And then, on Sunday, February 16, the Men's Choir will be providing the morning anthem. As our Director, Carol Hubler, reminds us: "All males of any age are invited to come join in this musical celebration. The anthem is relatively easy and quite upbeat! There are three rehearsals scheduled, so if you can't attend all of them, hopefully one or two will do it for you. The rehearsals are from 7 pm to 7:30 pm on January 28 and February 4 and 11. Hope to see you there! Any questions, please talk to Pastor Tom or Carol Hubler." We will also ask God's blessing on a new batch of Prayer Shawls during worship on February 16.

Having mentioned Christmas as I began this letter, I want to, before I close, again join with Ann in thanking you, our congregational family, for the many expressions of love we received during the Christmas and Advent seasons. Your kind words, your cards, your gifts and, of course, the congregational gift were truly sources of great joy for us. We are indeed blessed as we approach twenty years of life and ministry together with you here on "The Hill"!

Please Help!

As we begin a new year, please be sure that, if you are a communing member of St. John, you turn in at least one communion record card this year. (If during the year you live and worship out of the area, or if you commune even once at another congregation, please be sure to have that congregation send notice to Pastor Tom.) If you are a contributing member of St. John, please be sure that you use your offering envelopes at least once this year, so that you are on record as having made a contribution. Please do your part to make sure that our parish records are as accurate as possible!

A reminder here in the midst of winter, when unpredictable weather can make it very difficult or even just plain unsafe for some in our congregational family to gather here on The Hill for worship, that you can listen to our worship each Sunday morning through a link found on our congregational website. (And, of course, you can access this same audio any time for any reason, including when you just want to hear again something you already heard on a previous Sunday!) To tune in, you will need some kind of electronic device that is able to connect to the internet – or someone handy who has such a device. With that device nearby, simply follow these instructions:

+Go to our congregational website – www. stjohnhillchurch.org.

+When you arrive on our website homepage, scroll about halfway down to the item on the right that says "St. John's Service Recordings" where you will find a green link that says "St. John's YouTube Channel". Clicking this green link will take you to our very own St. John channel on the YouTube website.

+Once there, you simply click on the particular date you are interested in, at which point a new blacked out (remember we have only sound, no video) window will appear and that Sunday's worship audio will begin to play. The first thing you will likely hear is the murmur of our gathering congregational family before the Announcements. And you may need to turn up your sound a bit, depending on your device.

+You can then use the cursor that appears at the bottom of that blacked out window to go forward or backward as needed – or just sit back and listen to the whole thing!

Thank you to Rachel and Roy Henry who oversee our recording ministry, and to the folks who help them on Sunday mornings. Please report any problems or difficulties to Rachel or Roy or to Pastor Tom.

The council meeting was called to order by President, Dan Langhans. Pastor Tom opened the meeting with devotions and a prayer.

Excused Absence: Darrell Denlinger

Minutes: Motion by Barb Bullock and seconded by Dan Maurer to accept the minutes with noted corrections from the November 3, 2019 meeting. Motion approved unanimously.

Reception of Petitions and Communications:

The monthly water inspections were completed and passed.

The property insurance policy has arrived for review and renewal. Council recommended that we notify them of the kitchen improvements.

Pastor Tom presented the tax form he needs to submit for his housing allowance. Motion was made by Carol Hassinger and seconded by Barb Bullock to sign the form. Motion passed unanimously. The form was signed by Sandra Lamenza, Assistant Secretary.

The Upper Dauphin Conference has requested that St John host a conference on Elder Abuse and Fraud. The conference would be sponsored by the Upper Dauphin Conference and open to the public. Council agreed to host the conference. More details will follow.

There was some discussion about placing a monitor in the lobby that would project information about church events and some of the information that is displayed on the bulletin board. The project is open for further research and discussion.

Pastor's Report: Motion made by Donna Rabenold and seconded by Arlene Doyle to accept the pastor's report. Motion approved unanimously

Children and Youth Ministry Report: Motion was made by Ron Erb and seconded by Pat Herb to accept Miss Laurie's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Motion made by Ron Erb and seconded by Dan Maurer to accept the treasurer's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Reports of Standing Committees:

Church Property: Several maintenance issues have been taken care of. The fire extinguisher location list has been updated. The covers for the heaters in the youth room and the archive room have been adapted so the heat can be turned on and off without removing the cover. The pavilion spouting has been an ongoing issue. The property committee has recommended we remove parts that are not necessary. Council agreed but recommended that the spouting remain along the south side of the pavilion. The sanctuary ceiling project is still in a research stage. There are several additional contractors that have asked to have their bids considered. Council recommended that the finance committee review how much of our current funds we could reasonably allocate to the project, and that introduce the project to the congregation at the January Congregational Meeting and get a feel of what people are willing to contribute to the project.
