

Dear Friends in Jesus,

Well, this is one of those years where we no sooner take away the last greenery of Christmas than we are bringing in the rugged cross of Lent! We will observe **Ash Wednesday**, the traditional beginning of the Season of Lent, on **February 13 at 7:00 P.M.** with a Liturgy of Holy Communion, including the optional imposition of ashes. Those desiring to receive the mark of a cross, traced in ashes on their forehead, will come forward at the appropriate time in the worship, much as we come forward to receive Holy Communion. As is traditional here at St. John, those communing will have the option of receiving the wine from the common cup.

Then, on subsequent Wednesday evenings during Lent, the Lutheran, United Church of Christ, and United Methodist congregations of the Berrysburg and Elizabethville area will again join together for a light supper and worship. The supper, consisting of simple items like soup and sandwiches, will begin at 6:15 P.M. Following supper, at 7:15 P.M., we will join in worship. Worship will end by approximately 8:00 P.M. Once again this year, the host pastor of each congregation will lead the worship, while the pastors will each take turns preaching in a congregation other than their own. Our theme for this year's Lenten series will be *Women of the Bible*. The details for these Wednesday evenings are as follows:

ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING, PART ONE

The first part of our Annual Congregational Meeting was held on Sunday, December 9, following worship. At that meeting, a 2013 Current Fund Budget was adopted which totals \$129,586 – a 1.8% increase from the 2012 Budget. Please bear this small increase in mind as you plan your giving in 2013 – being, for instance, an increase of just less than \$.40 on a gift of \$20. Our adopted synodical benevolence figure of \$12,000 was unchanged from 2012, but this does not reflect actual giving, which has exceeded this amount by a good margin for the past couple of years. In elections for our Congregational Council, the following persons were elected to a three-year term: Kenneth Koller, Eric Mattern, Sandra Shade, and Cheryl Shadle. We thank these newly-elected Council members, as well as the outgoing members whom they replace—Darrell Denlinger, Michael Henninger, Patricia Herb, and Mary Peters!

In the past we have paid for the youth group members to snowtube which was 25.00. Of course this will be more expensive. The learn to ski or board group rate is \$50.00. This includes a lift ticket, lesson, and rentals. The only limit on this package is you are limited to the beginner slopes, so if you have not skied before or only went once or twice, this is for you. The other package is \$60.00. This includes a lift ticket, lesson and rental. This package however allows you to go on any slope, so if you have been skiing several times this is for you. Also, they rent helmets for 9.00. This is up to the parent to decide if they want their child to rent a helmet. With the increase in concussions lately it is a great idea. The youth group treasury will be paying \$25.00 toward this trip for youth group members, so depending on which package you decide on, you would need to pay 25.00 or 35.00 plus the 9.00 for helmet. 

Motion by Carol Hassinger, 2nd by Pat Herb to accept the October Council minutes. Motion passed unanimously.

Reception of Petitions and Communications:

Bishop announced that Assistant will be let go due budget constraints as of 11/1/12.

Discussed local congregations looking for Pastors.

Motion by Carol Hassinger, 2nd by Jamie Doyle to give \$3,000 for Hurricane Sandy relief in NY and NJ. The Council Meeting was called to order by President Jim Watson.

Pastor Tom offered devotions.

Present – James Bullock, Jamie Doyle, John Ferree, Mike Henninger, Karen Gehring, Pat Herb, Kris Kell, Mary Peters, Jim Watson and Pastor Tom

Excused Absences –Darrell Denlinger, Carol Hassinger and Craig Peters

Motion by Mike Henninger, 2nd by Karen Gehring to accept the November Council minutes. Motion passed unanimously.

Reception of Petitions and Communications:

We will need to appoint Synod male & female voting members in January which is earlier than usual. Faye Nichols and Jim Watson have volunteered. Pre-meetings for these representatives will be 1/28/13 and 3/18/13.

We received a Thank you note from Pam Drenner for hosting Synod's Listening post #14 for the Year of Reformation.

Synod has a budget of \$3,500,000, but they've only taken in \$2,800,000 which is a 20% variance. We've already exceeded our contribution goal, but many congregations have not.

Pastor suggested that \$20,000 of his 2013 salary be designated as housing allowance. Motion by Jamie Doyle, 2nd by Kris Kell. Motion passed unanimously.

Devon Radel will be participating in a mission trip to Georgia-Appalachia area with his church at college. Motion by Pat Herb, 2nd by Mary Peters to sponsor him \$125 toward his \$250 cost out of local benevolence. Motion passed unanimously.

Cub Pack #86 whom we sponsor needs a place to meet during cold winter months. Wolf Den requested to use our facilities. They meet on Thursdays (not every Thurs.) and Pastor is getting the exact dates. Motion by Mike Henninger and 2nd by Pat Herb to approve. Motion passed unanimously.

Request for non-member wedding because we're mid-way between their families. Request denied.

Annual appeal form Medic 6- motion by Jamie Doyle and 2nd by Jim Bullock to give a gift of \$100 from local benevolence. Motion passed unanimously.

A marketing company contacted Pastor Tom soliciting a 4"x4" paid advertisement for the back of t-shirts which the UDA cheerleaders distribute at games for \$299.50. Request denied.

Pastor's Report: Motion by John Ferree, 2nd by Kris Kell to accept Pastor's report. Motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Reports: Motion by John Ferree, 2nd by Kris Kell to accept the treasurer's reports. Motion passed unanimously.

Reports of Standing Committees:

Church Property: Pew cushions will be rotated. Next meeting is in January.

Finance Committee: No Report

Worship & Music: Advent Night is on December 16th at 6:00pm.

Organ requires repairs to coupler mechanisms to repair pipe leaks. Karl Myers was contacted and provided us with 3 options:

- 1. For approximately \$4,500, he can repair pieces that have gone bad. Similar repairs would need to be made every 20 years or so.
- 2. For approximately \$22,627, he can repair an upgrade to digital retaining pipe organ sound, just replacing the linkage form the keys to the pipes with a digital system which eliminates the need to repair every 20 years.
- 3. For approximately \$32,584, he can do a complete computerization of keyboard and operating system. Nothing changes with pipe organ sounds. More capabilities and includes software updates.

The Worship & Music Committee is recommending Option 3. Council is recommending Option 3 to be paid from interest in the Memorials Fund and for a Congregational vote on January 20th since this is a substantial expense to preserve our historic organ and bring it up to date. Motion by Jim Bullock and 2nd by Mary Peters. Motion passed unanimously. Karl Myers will be invited to attend the January 20th meeting.

2013 Sundays designated for outside worship beginning with Memorial Day weekend and ending with Labor Day weekend have been established.
