

Dear Friends in Jesus,

You might be surprised to find that there is no other mention of the Season of Lent in this February *Epistle*, but, due to the very late date of Easter Sunday (April 20), Ash Wednesday also comes quite late this year (March 5). So, stay tuned next month for information on our schedule for Community Lenten worship and supper!

What I did want to mention to you this month is something new that we will be doing as a congregational family, beginning this spring, to honor our high school graduates. Following approval by Congregational Council last fall, we will be presenting to each of our graduating high school seniors each year a scholarship of \$250, toward their higher education expenses. It is our plan that our scholarships will be presented and announced at school class nights or award nights. I and other Council members will see to it that we have someone present at each school each year to make the presentations.

There are a few requirements that must be met by each graduate to receive the scholarship. First, and most obviously, the recipient must be planning on pursuing a degree or certification at a recognized and credentialed institution. (The scholarship will be paid directly to the institution when the young person begins her/his program of study.) Second, and most importantly, it is our intention that the scholarships be given to our young members who are active in the life of our congregational family. At a minimum, this means that the young person needs to be a confirmed member of the congregation, who has been a communing and contributing member of record each and every year since the time of her/his confirmation (or since the time of his/her joining our congregational family if that occurs after confirmation). Obviously, it would be my wish and the wish of Council that each scholarship recipient be active beyond this, for instance in the life of Youth Group.

It is planned that the \$250 scholarships will be paid from our Local Benevolence Fund, which is supported by our earnings from each year's Strawberry Festival – another very good reason to continue to support this important annual event, coming up this year on Wednesday, June 11!

As many of us know first-hand all too well, \$250 doesn't go as far as it once did in covering the ever-increasing costs of higher education. But it is Council's hope and mine that this will be another small but tangible way that we can show our support for our young members as they go forth to meet the challenges of our hurting world and show the light of Jesus in their career endeavors. ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING, PART ONE

The first part of our Annual Congregational Meeting was held on Sunday, December 8, following worship. At that meeting, a 2014 Current Fund Budget was adopted which totals \$133,608 – a 3.1% increase from the 2013 Budget. Please bear this small increase in mind as you plan your giving in 2014 – being, for instance, an increase of about \$1.25 on a gift of \$40. Our adopted synodical benevolence figure of \$12,000 was unchanged from 2013, but this does not reflect actual giving, which has exceeded this amount by a good margin for the past couple of years. In elections for our Congregational Council, the following persons were elected to a three-year term: Lorraine Henninger, Roy Henry, Sandra Lamenza, and Jeffrey Lehman. We thank these newly-elected Council members, as well as the outgoing members whom they replace—John Ferree, Karen Gehring, Kris Kell, and Craig Peters. Finally, our congregation took action to officially adopt our new Mission Statement, which you will find on the cover of this and all future issues of our *St. John's Epistle*.

We pray that God will grant rest and peace to Marie and John, and the hope and joy of the Resurrection to all of their loved ones.


Little Sermon
