

Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus,

Even though, as I write these lines, the Season of Christmas is just a few days in the rear-view mirror, the passage of time in general and the Church Year in particular pause for no one. And so it is time to lift up the fact that we will observe **Ash Wednesday**, the traditional beginning of the Season of Lent, on **February 14 at 7:00 P.M.** with a hybrid Liturgy of Holy Communion, including the optional imposition of ashes for those who are present in-person. Those desiring to receive the mark of a cross, traced in ashes on their forehead, will come forward at the appropriate time in the worship, much as we come forward to receive Holy Communion.

Then, on subsequent Wednesday evenings during Lent, the Lutheran, United Church of Christ, and United Methodist congregations of the Berrysburg and Elizabethville area will again join together for worship and a light supper. The supper, consisting of simple items like soup and sandwiches, will begin at **6:15 P.M.** Following supper, at **7:00 P.M.**, we will join in worship. Worship will end before 8:00 P.M. Once again this year, the host pastor of each congregation will lead the worship, while the pastors will each take turns preaching in a congregation other than their own. Our theme for this year's Lenten series will be *Mountains of Faith*. Each week we will consider a different mountain (or mount) where God interacts in powerful ways with people in the Bible. Creation Care Team

In case you haven't heard, the St. John Green Team is now the Creation Care Team! While the name has changed, the goals are very much the same. We aim to continue a number of the projects started by our predecessors while, at the same time, finding new and creative ways to lessen our impact on this planet that God has blessed us with.

Initially, we restarted the recycling program at the church. There are two bins located in the kitchen. The taller bin is for plastic bottles (#'s 1, 2, and 5) and aluminum and tin cans (no foil or pie pans). Please be sure to rinse out items placed in this bin. The shorter bin is for paper and corrugated cardboard. Please be sure to remove any staples from the paper and break



down the cardboard, so it lays flat. Also, these bins are for recycling generated at the church. Please do not bring recycling from home to place in these bins. The only recycling items that should ever be brought to the church are aluminum cans (again, no foil or pie pans) that are collected by the Youth Group. Those aluminum cans should be placed *inside* the lower portion of the barn.

Today was the first time that we started to pass the offering plates during the choir anthem with the flow suggested by Sheila after the last council meeting. Things seemed to go ok with traffic flow and having the option to leave envelopes in the plate prior to the service.
