#### Looking Ahead

A first planning meeting for our Annual Strawberry Festival will be held on Tuesday, March 2, on Zoom, beginning at 7:00 P.M. Clearly, our first order of business will be to assess whether it makes sense to go any further in planning for June 9 or not, in view of where we are likely to be by then with regard to the pandemic, even with the ongoing vaccination effort.

Miss Laurie will lead a gathering of *Celebration Club* on Wednesday, March 3, from 6:30 to 8:30 P.M. – planned for in-person at the church.

At its February 14 meeting, Congregational Council approved returning to inperson (as well as Zoom) worship effective Sunday, March 7. This, of course, is assuming that there aren't any significant setbacks with regard to the pandemic before then, and that things continue generally to improve as they have been in recent weeks.

As to the question of whether to combine in-person and Zoom worship in one 10:15am experience or have separate in-person and Zoom worship times, the feedback you provided in the recent survey was clear as to the congregational family's preference: 31 "votes" were received favoring the single combined 10:15am worship, while 3 "votes" came in favoring two separate times of worship. Accordingly, it is planned that our 10:15 am worship on March 7 will be combined Zoom and in-person from upstairs in our beautiful worship space at the church, with the use of our organ for music.

For those attending 10:15 worship in-person, as was the case last fall, our ushers will still be guiding everyone to safely spaced, designated seating, and masks, covering both nose and mouth at all times, will still be required of everyone, with no exceptions of any kind. Since our in-person attendance last fall averaged only in the upper-20's, there should be no issue with the current PA Department of Health 10% of capacity attendance limit of 32.

For those attending 10:15 worship via Zoom, the call in/log in process will still work exactly the same but when Zoom opens up, instead of showing Pastor Tom and other worship leaders in their living rooms, your screen will include rectangles showing two views of worship at the church – one a close-up of the lectern area from where Pastor Tom will be leading worship and the other which will alternate between showing Judy and our other keyboardists at the organ and showing an overall view of worship from the balcony area. To avoid possible interference with the flow of worship coming from the church, all Zoom participants will find that their mikes will need to be muted at all times, but the chat function will continue just like before, allowing Zoom-ers to continue to directly connect.

A big "Thank You" is due to our overall Zoom coordinators, Roy & Rachel Henry! AND WITH THAT THANK YOU, ALSO AN <u>URGENT REQUEST</u>... WE ARE IN NEED OF AT LEAST A FEW MORE PERSONS WHO WOULD BE WILLING TO SERVE AS ZOOM HOSTS FOR SUNDAY MORNINGS BEGINNING MARCH 7, SINCE THAT HOSTING WILL NEED TO TAKE PLACE FROM THE CHURCH. PLEASE SPEAK WITH ROY OR RACHEL HENRY – WHO WILL PROVIDE THE BIT OF TRAINING NEEDED – TO LEARN MORE ABOUT WHAT IS INVOLVED. You don't need to be a technology expert to be a part of our new Video Ministry Team, just someone 1. who has a suitable device (like a laptop or a tablet) and 2. who is comfortable accessing worship and other activities on Zoom!
