8:30-9:30am Special Faith Formation Time, AED Familiarization (In-Person) (Gary Daniels and Rob & Courtney Foreman will lead this session to familiarize all interested persons with our Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) unit. Please note that the unit is designed to be used in an emergency even by someone who knows nothing about it, and we are already blessed to have many medically-trained persons in our congregational family who are familiar with AED's, but it seems like yet another good way to care for each other in Jesus' Name to have as many of us as possible who currently know nothing about AED's (like Pastor Tom for instance) become a bit more familiar. Special Congregational Meeting (The purpose of the meeting will be to consider and take action on a recommendation from Congregational Council that we accept a proposal from *Houck* for the repair/replacement of the roofing at the base of our steeple, which as we all know must be taken care of prior to winter weather. Their estimate of \$33,846 is far and away the best one we have received, approximately half the cost of one proposal received and \$10,000 or so less than another. This cost estimate, as with the other two received, cannot and does not cover any additional work which may be needed to repair/replace damage which can't be seen and assessed, such as to the wood supporting the roof, which may also have suffered with the intrusion of rain and weather over time. This additional work would be covered by "time and material". The funding for the project would come from the \$100,000 "reserve" which we have already set aside in our accumulated Memorials Interest as part of the St. John Restoration 250 project. Clearly, this estimate figure gives us considerably more leeway than did the other bids received for any hidden/unexpected repair work which might end up being needed. Everyone is welcome to sit in on the meeting, but especially needed are all voting members, those confirmed members of the St. John Congregational Family who have communed and contributed this year or in 2021.)
