Dear Friends in Jesus,

In our time of so many seemingly overwhelming problems, here is an anonymous modern parable, set along a seashore as seems so very appropriate in these summer months:

I was walking down a deserted stretch of Mexican beach at sunset. As I walked along, I saw another person in the distance. As I drew nearer, I noticed that he kept leaning down, picking something up and throwing it out into the water. Time and again, he kept hurling things out into the ocean.

As I approached more closely, I could see that the man was picking up starfish which had been washed up on the beach and, one at a time, he was throwing them back into the water. I was puzzled. I approached the man and said, "Good evening! I was wondering what you're doing there?"

The man smiled, bent down, and picked up another starfish and, as he threw it into the sea, he smiled and said simply, "I made a difference for that one, didn't I?!"

The UDA Elementary Odyssey of the Mind team placed 8th out of 56 teams from around the world at the Worlds Competition over Memorial Day weekend! They placed 2nd with their question and answer session! They were able to interact with the teams from Hong Kong, Korea, Mexico, Poland and Switzerland as well as many different states from here in the US.



# **Upper Dauphin Area Archery Season from Myrtle Beach NASP World Open Championship**

UDA archery continued its year by heading to the Open Championship in Myrtle Beach, S. C.

The Middle School and High School teams both qualified for this championship by finishing 14th and 10th respectfully at Nationals. The HS had 9 shooters qualify as individuals and the MS had 5 shooters. All 9 HS archers decided to attend the Open. Three team members also were interest so the 12 archers thus competed as a skeleton team of 12. Teams can have up to 24 members with the best 12 scores counting for your team score. The 12 member UDA team shot well to finish as the



6th place team. Individually Kyra Grace Tomlinson managed a 291-score placing her 6th in the HS girl's competition. Jordan Bush was our top male archer shooting a 285 ranking him 48th for HS boys. Grace Kohler and Austin Heim both finished at 284 earning them a ranking of 38th for the HS girls 56th for the HS boys respectfully.

The MS having only 5 individuals qualify with only 4 able to attend did not compete as a team. The 4 individuals showed up and shot well. Gary Leitzel shot his personal best. The score of 292 of a possible 300 earned him 2nd place in the MS boys' division. He finished a near 1 point behind the Open World Champion. He also shot 25 – 10-point bullseyes out of 30 shots. His 25 – 10's were only topped by 4 other archers, HS, MS and Elementary in the entire tournament. Kenzie Reading also shot her personal best score of 282 earning her a 22nd place finish in the MS girls' division. Kyra Grace Tomlinson earned a spot in the NASP Scholarship shoot off. The top 5 girls from the National Championships compete for the prizes of \$5000 - 1st place, \$4000 - 2nd place, \$3000 - 3rd place, \$2000 - 2nd place and \$1000 - 5th place. The 5 arrows shoot off found Kyra Grace in second place 1 point behind first place earning her a \$4000 scholarship.

The archers all enjoyed this opportunity to shoot and hang out on the beaches in Myrtle Beach. This was a great reward for their hard work and long season that began in December 2022. Congratulations to all our archers, parents, grandparents and friends that support the kids and the program. Keep an eye out for the UDA Archery float in the local Fireman's Carnival parades this summer!
