Dear Friends in Jesus,

As we all continue to take cautious steps down the road toward (we hope and pray) one day returning to something at least very much like the "normal" we knew before March, I am delighted to use this space to share information about our planned return to in-person worship here on The Hill. All of the details, as worked out by Congregational Council and me at our June 14 meeting, follow directly after this letter, and I would encourage you to give them a read. The first thing that you will note is that this doesn't in any way represent a return to "normal" – just as moving into the "Green Phase" in the rest of society doesn't equal "normal". For starters, there are a whole lot of details such as we've never had to think about before. They can appear like overkill and even heavy-handed, but that is not at all my/our intention. Instead, as it says early in the plan, all of these details come "out of an abundance of concern and protection and love for each other – as Jesus would have us do – in these times of so much uncertainty and so much that is still unknown about the COVID-19 virus."

All of the details matter, so again I would ask you to please give them a read on the pages which follow, but I want to especially highlight some of them:

- 1 Our 11:00am in-person outdoor worship doesn't affect our Zoom Christian Education times at 8:45am or our Zoom worship at 9:30am in any way. It is no better than Zoom worship in any way simply a different kind of worship opportunity for those who would be comfortable with it.
- 2 For at least the first week(s), attendance will be strictly limited to 24 persons plus me/the worship leader. As we gain experience, Council and I will be looking to safely increase that number as soon as possible, but the attendance limit now and going forward will be "iron-clad". Because I absolutely don't want to ever have to turn anyone away from worship, please contact me ahead of time if at all possible to let me know of your plans to attend on a given Sunday. If you are truly comfortable just taking the chance or if it is a last-minute realization that you can get here by 11:00am after all and you're okay just seeing if there is still "room" please come on over and check, but, again, the attendance limit, for all of our sakes, is "iron clad" no exceptions so please don't put me or you in the sad situation of my having to enforce the limit, for that is what I will do.
- 3 A mask <u>covering both nose and mouth at all times</u> is required for every worshipper over the age of two. This also is "iron clad", with no exceptions for any reason, including medical conditions. As our society re-opens, research has shown that the riskiest thing that any of us can do is gather in a group for an extended time e.g. worship but research has also shown that having everyone wear a mask can reduce any risk of virus transmission by as much as 75%. Let me say it again <u>the mask requirement, covering both nose and mouth, for all of our sakes, is "iron clad" no exceptions for any reason so please don't put me or you in the sad situation of my having to enforce the rule, for that is what I will do.</u>

- 4 Please be sure to bring along your own comfortable chair with which we will all arrange ourselves to observe "safe" (six-foot) distancing from other folks not in our "party".
- 5 Please be sure to dress for the weather think chilly and breezy here on The Hill even if it's not at home we won't be able to lower the pavilion sides or go inside.
- 6 And last, but most certainly not least, please do not attend in-person now or any time in the future if you aren't feeling well in any way or *if you have been exposed any time in the prior 14 days to a person who subsequently develops COVID-19-like symptoms or who tests positive for COVID-19.*

Please read on to get all of the details, and please don't hesitate to contact me or any member of Congregational Council with thoughts, suggestions, constructive criticisms or anything else that's on your mind and heart! Please believe me when I say that I'm cringing right now as I look back at the firm tone of what I have written above. As you've come to know me, I'm hoping you've found that I dislike confrontation and conflict more than most people, but that, when they are necessary in the name of faithfulness and love of neighbor – including all of you, my fellow worshippers – I won't shy away from it. Please especially believe me when I say how much I am looking forward to sharing this worship opportunity – as well as the Zooming that I have come to enjoy so much – with you, my congregational family!

# Initial Plan for Return to In-Person Worship at St. John Evangelical Lutheran

- +Assuming no COVID-19 surge or backtracking from the CDC/PA Department of Health as to "re-opening" guidance, this plan will take effect on Sunday, June 28, and be in effect, initially, for the "summer" period, through Sunday, September 13, 2020.
- +This plan will not in any way alter our pre-existing Sunday 8:45am time of Zoom Christian Education and 9:30am time of Zoom worship.
- +To those Zoom experiences, we will add a Sunday 11:00am in-person worship opportunity, outdoors only, in the pavilion. The rest of this document refers to this 11:00am in-person outdoor worship opportunity.

  Everything which follows comes out of an abundance of concern and protection and love for each other as Jesus would have us do in these times of so much uncertainty and so much that is still unknown about the COVID-19 virus!
- +To make sure that everyone attending can maintain a mandatory 6-foot safe spacing in the pavilion space, attendance will initially be limited to <u>24 persons</u>, plus Pastor Tom/the worship leader. This number will be regularly reviewed by Pastor Tom in consultation with Congregational Council as we live with this worship experience, with an eye to increasing the limit as can be safely done.
- +To make sure that no one coming for in-person worship would ever need to be turned away due to safe distancing concerns, everyone planning on attending on a given Sunday is strongly encouraged to please contact Pastor Tom/the worship leader ahead of time to "sign up". Persons who come for worship but who haven't signed up will also be welcome to attend as long as we have not already reached our limit of 24 persons. If we are already at our limit of 24 persons those persons will be kindly asked to return to their cars. We want very much to make sure that this NEVER happens, hence the stress on signing up in advance!!

- +Anyone who isn't feeling well for any reason is expected to refrain from attending in-person worship. Likewise, anyone who has been exposed <u>any time in the prior 14 days</u> to a person who subsequently develops COVID-19-like symptoms or who tests positive for COVID-19 is expected to refrain from attending in-person worship.
- +Every person attending who is age 2 or older will be required to wear a mask covering both nose and mouth the entire time they are present in the pavilion. Because any of us can be carrying and transmitting COVID-19 even though we feel just fine, and because the risk of transmission has been shown to drop by 75% if everyone present is wearing a mask, out of love for our neighbors in worship, this is essential and no exceptions will be made for any reason. Anyone with a medical condition that prohibits them from wearing a mask is asked to please simply join in Zoom worship and refrain from our in-person worship for the present.
- +To minimize any sharing of equipment, everyone attending is required to bring their own chair and arrange it so that they are observing a mandatory safe 6-foot spacing.
- +The foyer restroom will be available for those attending worship. Anyone using the restroom will be asked to wear their mask while doing so and to afterward wipe down restroom surfaces with wipes and instructions which will be provided. Also, for the safety of us all, anyone using the foyer restroom will be asked to please go no further than the foyer itself not upstairs or through any closed doors.
- +The pavilion kitchen area will be locked/unavailable for entry at all times.
- +Everyone attending is asked to please remember that we take the weather as we find it and to dress accordingly. Especially, it is often much cooler and windier in the pavilion than at home. We will not be able to put down the pavilion sides or go inside and so, if conditions are or become unsafe for worship, we will cancel or cut things short.
- +Pastor Tom/another appointed person will be the sole worship leader. Neither Miss Laurie nor our key-boardists will be present as leaders.
- +We will avoid singing and liturgical group spoken responses (which have been shown to be very much like singing in terms of risk of spreading virus).
- +To minimize any sharing of equipment, we will not use bulletins or worship books.
- +In accordance with existing congregational family practice, Holy Communion will be available on the first Sunday of the month and on festival Sundays, using the bread wafer only no wine/cup dropped in a notouch fashion directly into the communicant's hand by Pastor Tom. A blessing for those who do not commune will also be provided in a no-touch fashion. Each communicant will be asked to please wait until Pastor Tom has moved away before moving their mask just enough to allow them to place the wafer in their mouth. (Prior to distribution, Pastor Tom will have hand disinfecting wipes available which he will use to thoroughly sanitize his hands. These wipes will also be kept close at hand and, should Pastor Tom's hand accidentally make contact with someone else's during the serving, he will immediately pause the serving and repeat this sanitizing process before continuing.) Serving will take place with Pastor Tom going around to everyone in their safe spacing, to avoid lines or other crowding of the worshippers.
- +It is planned that one or more "Hosts" will be available from at least 10:40am on to help to answer questions or otherwise guide those coming for worship while Pastor Tom makes the transition from the conclusion of 9:30am Zoom worship.

# Sunday School Room Updates

At their June 14 meeting, Congregational Council approved moving ahead with the replacement of the old downstairs carpeting in the Sunday School Room area and in the conference room, at a total cost of \$9,973. With "regular" construction projects back underway for a while now, and with our building presently not being used under our current COVID-19 guidelines, it seems the perfect time to "complete" the downstairs improvements that have been underway for a couple of years now. Of the total cost, \$4,390 has already been specially contributed, with another \$2,000 pledged. Council has approved using accumulated Memorials Fund interest to cover the remaining \$3,600 cost if needed but would also welcome gifts in memory or in honor of loved ones, which would then be recorded in our Memorials Book. We're so excited to announce that VBS WILL BE HAPPENING this year! With one modification, though. Instead of you bringing your kids to VBS, we're bringing VBS to your kids.

This summer, on **Tuesday July 21**<sup>st</sup> **through Thursday, July 23**<sup>rd</sup>, we'll be using a quarantine-friendly VBS called BOLT.
