Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus,

During these upcoming months of July and August, even though many forms of learning will be taking a summer break, our Adult Sunday Morning Bible Study will be pushing right on, albeit with a slightly different schedule from the rest of the year – a brief half-hour from 8:45 to 9:15 each Sunday morning now once again back in person. During the past 2+ years of reliance on Zoom for this learning time, maybe you have found that the Zoom-only experience made this time of fellowship and faith growth less appealing to you. If so, please come on back! Or maybe you have just never quite gotten around to signing in and trying it out. If so, please come on out and sample this relaxed, low-pressure time of gathering around God's Word in the Bible, now without the potential complications of relying on electronic devices! You don't need to worry if you feel that you don't know your Bible well; if so, you're not alone and that is why we gather for this time after all – to grow together! It turns out that no one is an expert and you will not be pressured to share or speak out in any way you don't wish.

Even as I mention the 8:45-9:15am timing of the gathering each Sunday morning, I want to highlight an exception to this schedule. On Sunday morning, July 10, from 8:30 to 9:30am, Gary Daniels and Rob & Courtney Foreman will lead a special session to familiarize all interested persons with our Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) unit. Please note that the unit is designed to be used in an emergency even by someone who knows nothing about it, and we are already blessed to have many medically-trained persons in our congregational family who are familiar with AED's, but it seems like yet another good way to care for each other in Jesus' Name to have as many of us as possible who currently know nothing about AED's (like me for instance) become a bit more familiar. The program is designed for all ages from older children on up and no sign-up is needed.

And then a word about a special study I will be leading later in July... Especially with all of the current discussion and debate surrounding the legality of abortion in our country, it would be easy to come to the conclusion that there is only one way for a Christian to faithfully view and understand this complex issue. Many Lutheran Christians are not aware that we of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America have had a social statement dealing with abortion for many years now, a statement which can be a great help as we all seek to be a meaningful part of this national discussion. To shed some light on this social statement, and to discuss the entire issue in some depth, I will be leading a two-part study during Sunday Morning Adult Bible Study at 8:45am on Sundays, July 17 and July 31. Please watch for more information!

Thank you for your kindness in reading, and for your partnership in this wonderful congregational family which is St. John!

At the Altar

Pastor Tom presided on the Day of Pentecost, June 5, as our congregational family joined in the order for Affirmation of Baptism and celebrated the Confirmation of **Allysa Rabenold** and **Sarah Riland**. Congratulations to these younger members and their families on this important milestone in their faith journeys!

At Graveside

Pastor Tom presided at funeral worship for **Marzette Hoffman**, who died at the Northern Dauphin Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Millersburg on May 22. Worship took place at the church on May 27, with interment in the Grandview Cemetery in Pillow. We pray God's comfort in the promise of the Resurrection of Jesus for daughter **Charlotte** and Marzette's other family members and loved ones!

Special Congregational Meeting

A Special Congregational Meeting will be held at the end of worship on Sunday, July 10. The purpose of the meeting will be to consider and take action on a recommendation from Congregational Council that we accept a proposal from Houck for the repair/replacement of the roofing at the base of our steeple, which as we all know must be taken care of prior to winter weather. Their estimate of **\$33,846** is far and away the best one we have received, approximately half the cost of one proposal received and \$10,000 or so less than another. This cost estimate, as with the other two received, cannot and does not cover any additional work which may be needed to repair/replace damage which can't be seen and assessed, such as to the wood supporting the roof, which may also have suffered with the intrusion of rain and weather over time. This additional work would be covered by "time and material". The funding for the project would come from the \$100,000 "reserve" which we have already set aside in our accumulated Memorials Interest as part of the **St. John Restoration 250** project. Clearly, this estimate figure gives us considerably more leeway than did the other bids received for any hidden/unexpected repair work which might end up being needed. Everyone is welcome to sit in on the July 10 meeting, but especially needed are all voting members, those confirmed members of the St. John Congregational Family who have communed and contributed this year or in 2021.

Boundless Celebration and Retreat at Camp Nawakwa

The members of the senior high youth group are planning to attend the Gathering Celebration and Retreat at Camp Nawakwa. This is a Lower Susquehanna Synod event. The retreat runs from Sunday, July 24th to Wednesday, July 27th. The Boundless Celebration and Retreat focuses on the Boundless theme from the now canceled 2022 ELCA Youth Gathering. It incorporates the three unique days youth and young adults would experience at a typical Youth Gathering.

Sunday - Synod Day: Sunday kicks off the week with the Boundless Celebration starting at 2:30 p.m. The day will most resemble what we would have experienced in Minneapolis during our Synod Day, with a catered meal, camp games and activities, live music, a visit from Bishop James Dunlop, and outdoor worship, all in the Upper Camp field and pavilion at Nawakwa.

Monday - Active Learning Day: Retreat groups will participate in active learning on Monday morning with large and small group activities. The afternoon will be filled with various camp activities and time for hiking, pool time, crafts, etc. We will join in the all-camp activity of capture the flag with the campers and camp staff Monday evening.

Tuesday - Service Learning Day: Tuesday will be a full day of service learning at our synod's "Growing Project" at the Wittel Farm in Elizabethtown, Lancaster County. We will travel to the farm to learn about food insecurity in Lancaster County, and how the Growing Project is meeting the needs of many families struggling with poverty. Participants will have a chance to help harvest fruits and vegetables, work in the gardens, experience cooking demonstrations, and learn about how the farm works. We may even have a chance to deliver some food to the distribution centers in the city and meet those who are benefitting from the ministry at the farm. Our day concludes at Nawakwa for dinner, followed by a campfire, outdoor worship, and a fun evening program.

Wednesday: After breakfast, we join the whole camp community for morning worship led by two of our synod missionaries to Guatemala, Pastor Jennifer Hope-Tringali and Deacon David Hope-Tringali. Jennifer and David are in the states serving as Chaplains at Nawakwa for that week, but they traditionally live in Guatemala and shepherd Tree 4 Hope, a ministry walking alongside indigenous people living in Guatemala. The retreat wraps up by 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday.

Please keep in your prayers all those attending from other churches, the staff of Nawakwa, the staff of the Lower Susquehanna Synod, and our group of nine, as we embark on this faith-filled, eye-opening, one-of-a-kind, fun-filled adventure on the hillsides of Camp Nawakwa!

St. John Evangelical Lutheran Church, Congregational Council Minutes: April 10, 2022

The council meeting was called to order by President Roy Henry. Pastor Tom opened the meeting with devotions and a prayer.

Present: Roy Henry, Pastor Tom Bruner, Carl Baumgardner, Sheila Bader, Michael Henninger, Dana Klouser, Gail Billow, Joshua Paul, Ira Antes and Courtney Foreman. Also present during the discussion of steeple repairs and the proposed St. John Reno 250 project: Sandra Lamenza, Lynn Henninger, Helen Henninger, Barry Williard, Ty Troutman, Dennis Smeltz, and Harold Herb.

Prior to the Council Meeting, members of the Property Committee and the Reno 250 working group presented the following information to council for action:

Carl Baumgardner shared that Bahret's utilized a lift on Tuesday and repaired the damaged copper but found further damage to the roof and octagonal structure supporting the steeple. There was a \$1,000 deductible, but insurance covered the remainder of the repairs that were completed on Tuesday.

Bahret's suggested removing the copper, rebuilding the joists and rafters, covering with an Azac composite (rubber) roofing product and a 5/8" underlay, to include Azac sheeting on soffit, and covering both tin roofs with silver coat in order to repair the damage that was found. Bahret's submitted an estimate of \$49,000, with 2 weeks and 2 days to do the repair. This estimate includes the lift rental.

The Property Committee is working to secure more estimates for comparison.

Sandra Lamenza presented the information for the Reno 250 project and answered any questions from Council. Discussion was held about the project, including information from the Financial Committee from Lynn Henninger that shows that the congregation is in a good position to move forward with the project. It was agreed that the financial goal for the project will be to raise \$100,000 over the next 2 years.

Council voted unanimously to present the proposed project to the Congregation.

A congregational meeting is planned for May 1, 2022, immediately following worship. A simple majority vote is needed to pass the motion at the meeting. Members present at the meeting, in person or via Zoom, that have been active in the church within the last two years are able to vote. The vote is to be held via secret ballot.

Members of the committees present were dismissed, and council proceeded with the monthly council meeting.

Minutes: Motion by Carl Baumgardner to accept the February 2022 minutes as read. Second by Michael Henninger. Motion approved unanimously.

Reception of Petitions and Communications:

We are looking for a male and female member of the church to represent St. John's at the Synod Committee on June 3 and 4, 2022. The members must have access to Zoom and a phone to cast votes.

Pastor's Report: Motion to accept the Pastor's reports for February and March by Dana Klouser. Second by Shelia Bader. Motion approved unanimously.

Pastor also shared plans for times away throughout the year to include:

- June 21 – July 7, 2022. Matthew Williard will lead the service on June 26. Jim Watson will lead the service on July 3.
- September 15 – 20, 2022. Matthew Williard will lead the service on September 18.
- December 26, 2022 – January 4, 2023. Jim Watson will lead the service on January 1.

Children and Youth Ministry Report: Motion to accept Miss Laurie's reports for February and March by Joshua Paul. Second by Gail Billow. Motion approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Reports: Motion to accept the treasurer's reports by Joshua Paul. Second by Michael Henninger. Motion approved unanimously.

Reports of Standing Committees:

Church Property: The balance due has been sent to Bahret's for copper roof repair.

Finance Committee: No report.

Worship and Music: Meeting held 3/15/22. Outside worship is currently planned for 5/29, 6/19, 6/26, 7/3, 7/17 (Voices and Viddles to follow service), 7/31, 8/14 and 9/4. More dates to be added in May if renovation project is approved.

The goal for Fall, 2022 is to return to “New Normal” for worship at the beginning of October with vestments worn, choir singing, acolytes, flowers, ushers, bell ringing and normal flow of Communion.

The next meeting is planned for May 2022.

Faith Formation: No meeting. Miss Laurie and the Williards are doing well with their classes. Adult Sunday School will be restarting in the Fall. Spring Bible Study is starting this month.

Youth Ministry: Meeting tonight at 6 to prepare for the Egg Hunt. Readers are set for the Stations of the Cross service.

Next ELCA Gathering is planned for NOLA in 2024.

Mutual Ministry: Met 4/10/22 after worship. Vital statistics are strong. New members will be welcomed in two weeks. Next meeting is planned for July 2022.

The bottle will be available for donations throughout May. Motion to approve by Carl Baumgardner. 2nd by Michael Henninger. Motion carried unanimously.

Tiffany also asked if a representative from LifeLine could talk to the congregation during worship or Sunday School, and to place a Pack and Play in the vestibule to collect supply donations. This was tabled until Fall.

Next Council Meeting: May 22, 2022, at 6 pm.

Adjournment: Motion by Carl Baumgardner, Second by Michael Henninger to adjourn the meeting. Motion approved unanimously. The meeting was closed with the Lord’s Prayer.
