Well, June is almost upon us and that means it's Strawberry Festival time! That's right - as your family calendar hopefully already indicates, June 13 is the big day. But, as with any event of this size, there is a lot more going on than the actual hours of serving on June 13. Again this year, the following are some of the details to bear in mind:

- +June 4, starting at 6:30 P.M. the first work night to begin getting the pavilion cleaned up and ready for the Festival
- +June 11, starting at 6:00 A.M. the preparation of the barbecue and chicken corn soup at the home and shop of Henry & Lorraine Henninger (also note that, at approximately 6:00 P.M. that day, there is wrap-up work to be done as well – call Lorraine if you can help)
- +June 12, starting at 6:00 P.M. the cleaning and preparation of the strawberries at the home and shop of Henry & Lorraine Henninger
- +June 12, starting at 6:30 P.M. the final work night to finish the preparation of the pavilion and grove
- +June 13, starting at 7:30 A.M. food and other supplies are loaded up at the Henninger's for transportation to the pavilion
- +June 13, starting at 8:30 A.M. all of the final "moving around, hooking up, and plugging in" takes place at the grove and pavilion
- +June 13, starting at 12:00 P.M. we welcome our guests from the Manor at Susquehanna Village and prepare to open to the public
 - +June 13, starting at 1:00 P.M. WE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC
 - +June 13, starting at 2:30 P.M. entertainment by Brad Crum, appearing as Elvis
- +June 13, starting after 4:30 P.M. entertainment by gospel group, The Wehry Family If all this seems like a lot of work, it is. But it is also a time period during which our congregational family comes together to share in the fellowship and laughter that go with that work, perhaps more than at any other time during the year. The Strawberry Festival is an event by which our caring and hospitality are known far and wide. The Strawberry Festival is an event by which we serve as Jesus served - on June 13 by providing a warm and loving and safe time of fun for the whole family, and throughout the following year by using the proceeds to help our neighbors in need and to do many benevolent projects that would not be possible otherwise. Please remember that this annual tradition belongs to all of us and requires the support of all of us. If physical limitations prevent you from providing that kind of support, please provide your financial support, especially with the donations chart that will be posted in the foyer by the time you receive this Epistle. After 3½ years of faithful service, Carrie & Steve Schlegel will be ending their work as our sextons, effective June 4, to make a move to a new home in Pine Grove. Congregational Council is looking to fill this position as quickly as possible, ideally with a person/family from within our congregational family or with a person/family related to and recommended by someone within our congregational family. The position requires living in the sexton house, and provides that housing rent-free, along with a cash stipend of approximately \$100 per month. On Sundays from June 3 through September 2 (Labor Day weekend), when the Senior Choir is on "vacation", it would be great to have other St. John family members share their musical gifts in worship during the offering time, when the choir would usually sing. SUMMER SCHEDULE RETURNS FOR JULY AND AUGUST

Based on the very positive feedback received last summer, Congregational Council, with the recommendation of Worship & Music Committee and Sunday School Teachers & Officers, has again approved the use of the "summer" Sunday morning schedule that we used last year on a trial basis. Beginning on Sunday, July 1, and running through the Sunday of Labor Day weekend, September 2, we will gather for Sunday School at 8:45 A.M., going straight into the lesson of the morning instead of our traditional opening. These classes will end at 9:15 A.M., with worship beginning at 9:30 A.M. Once again, Pastor Tom will do his best to make sure that worship ends promptly by 10:30 A.M., for those who must travel to family gatherings or work responsibilities.

OUR FAITH ACTIVE IN OUR FINANCIAL GIVING – AS OF APRIL 30

In recent years, Congregational Council has asked that we all periodically receive an update in the *Epistle* about how we are doing in meeting our ministry commitments adopted in our annual budget.

First, our Current Fund... (The Current Fund is the fund from which most day-to-day bills get paid, much like your home's checking account.) With 18 of 52 Sundays behind us as of April 30, to be right on **budget**, we would have received and spent \$44,074 out of our total 2012 budget of \$127,326. We have actually received \$46,455 in offerings and other income, placing us \$2,381 over budget – the second year in a row – and only the second time in recent history – that our offerings have exceeded our budget goal at this point in the year. Our expenses as of the end of April total \$45,030 and are \$956 over budget (mostly due to the timing of certain expenses, like synod assembly registrations and an end-of-season heating oil purchase). Since we have taken in more than we have spent, we are running a surplus of \$1,425 as of April 30 – also for the second year in a row.

As to our benevolence offerings which we share with our Lower Susquehanna Synod and our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, to be exactly on **budget** as of April 30, we would have received and forwarded \$4,154 out of our total 2012 commitment of \$12,000. As of April 30, we have **actually** received and shared a total of \$5,867, meaning that we are **ahead** of our commitment by \$1,713.

Thank you for your partnership in the ministry of St. John, and for your financial stewardship, as we have now moved past the 1/3 point in the year. Please watch for future updates every few months, and please feel free at any time to ask questions of or share ideas with Pastor Tom or any member of Council!

At Graveside

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

In 1996, the LWR Coffee project was born. 16 years later, Lutherans' Commitment to Fair Trade is as strong as the coffee they drink.

Every time Lutherans use Fair Trade coffee in congregations, sell it to members and drink it at home, they minister to their coffee-growing neighbors around the world.

Here's what Lutherans have done through the LWR Coffee project:

- Drank 2.5 million pounds of Fair trade Coffee
- Raised \$566,000 for LWR Small Farmer Fund

Here at St John's our 1st order went out in Aug, 1999. We have recently added Tea to our purchase orders and a few Chocolate candy bars in past years..

I've had to reduce the types of coffee I buy because mixing types in 1 box cost about 30% more than a single flavor in one box. With many flavors available a simple request to me and I would include yours on new orders.

We will continue our coffee/tea sampling program on the 2^{nd} Sunday of each even month .

Our total orders since 1999 have now exceeded \$9,000 for St. John's.

Thank you for your ongoing commitment to "help our neighbor to improve and protect his property and business". The bulk of the coffee is now being grown n an organic environment with limited destruction to the Tropical rain forest cover.

The Council Meeting was called to order by President Jim Watson.

Pastor Tom offered devotions.

Present – James Bullock, Daryl Denlinger, Jamie Doyle, Karen Gehring, Mike Henninger, Pat Herb, Craig Peters, Mary Peters and Jim Watson

Excused Absences – John Ferree, Carol Hassinger, and Kris Kell

Motion by Pat H., 2nd by Mike H. to accept the March Council minutes. Motion passed unanimously.

Reception of Petitions and Communications: Thank you note from Ray & Vickie Bush for congregational support and Pastor & Jim W. completed congregational registration form.

Thank you from World Hunger Committee of Lower Susquehanna Synod for our contributions.

Thank you and Certificate from Bishop Hoover for our support and for meeting and exceeding our benevolence goal.

Request to tweak approval of Bryce W. 5 K to use church property including the use of the Sunday School room on 4/14. Council agreed.

Pastor's Report: Motion by Jamie, 2nd by Mike H. to accept Pastor's report. Motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Reports: Motion by Craig P., 2nd by Mary P. to accept the treasurer's reports. Motion passed unanimously.

Reports of Standing Committees:

Church Property: Met 2/28 and discussed Air Pear fans for energy efficiency. Committee concerned due to horsehair ceiling and think that no fans should be put on the ceiling. Recommending that we just don't put in any fans not even window fans since services is in the morning when it's cooler.

Finance Committee: Dan Langhans & Lorraine Henninger led discussion on proposed investments from March meeting: \$50,000 in Mission Int'l ELCS which invests in other churches and \$50,000 in Lutheran Community Foundation which does not invest in other churches. Motion by Jim B to rescind this investment decision from March and 2nd by Jamie. Motion passed unanimously.

Motion to put \$100,000 in Mission Investment Fund for 6 years at 3% APY by Finance Committee, 2nd by Pat H. Motion passed unanimously.

Worship & Music: Committee would like to pursue getting new robes for acolytes and Jim Watson. Louise, Lois and Sandy Paul will research and make recommendation or future action.

We will have special musical guest Dr. Bill Adams on clarinet at a future service.

Recommending earlier summer schedule from July to Labor Day consisting of Sunday School at 8:45 and church from 9:30-10:30am. This schedule was very positively received last year. Motion by Committee and 2nd by Committee. Motion passed unanimously. Committee will next meet in Sept.

Christian Education: Rachel's Day planning is underway for (1st Sunday in May) the linking of prayer partners. All children in the congregation would be linked with an adult for prayers for the coming year.

Bible School – Concordia material will be used again and "Amazing Desert Journey" is the theme.


