Dear Friends in Jesus,

It is certainly graduation time here at the Hill Church! As I write these lines in mid-May, we have eleven young persons who are receiving their undergraduate degrees from no less than eight different universities and colleges – Daniel Bruner, Rose Kell, Morgan Klinger, Kimberly Langhans, Jennifer Lehman, Blake Maurer, Alayna Peters, Courtney Rudisill, Kerilyn Schaeffer, Sara Shade, and Callie Spicher. Many of them will, in turn, very soon begin work on graduate degrees. Watch for further details about these graduates in the July/August St. John's Epistle.

We also celebrate with seven of our young members who are graduating from high school in early June, and this will mark the first time that we as a congregational family are awarding the *St. John's Scholarship for Faith and Education* to those graduates. You might remember from several months ago that Congregational Council had approved the idea of providing a one-time \$250 scholarship to those high school graduates who have been communing and contributing members of our congregational family ever since their confirmation (or since becoming members of our congregational family, if that took place when they were already confirmed).

The \$250 scholarship, which will come from our Local Benevolence Account (which is largely supported through our Annual Strawberry Festival) will be remitted directly to any recognized and credentialed college or university or trade school selected by the graduate, after we have received documentation of successful enrollment. The scholarship recipients will be recognized, however, at their respective Awards or Class Nights. This means that, this year, Council Secretary Jamie Doyle and I will be attending the Awards Night at Millersburg Area High School on Tuesday, June 3, to recognize **Payton Stutzman** with a scholarship. The next night, Wednesday, June 4, Council President Jim Watson and I will be present at Upper Dauphin Area High School's Class Night, where we will recognize **Kayla Henry**, **Megan Mench**, **Shannon Motter**, **Benjamin Paul**, **Bobby Paul**, and **Whitni Rudisill** with this honor.

As I write these lines, I am also working to arrange for our traditional recognition of our high school graduates during Sunday morning worship – stay tuned for a date or dates for this.

Please remember all of our graduates and their families in your prayers. We can all certainly be very proud of these young persons and their achievements and look forward eagerly to the ways in which they will make God's world a better place!

LOAVES & FISHES EVENT TO BE HELD

We have already sent a requested congregational gift of \$325, from our Local Benevolence fund (provided mainly through our Annual Strawberry Festival), toward the \$75,000 total cost of the project, and Barb & Jim Bullock, Larry Gessner, and Fay Nichols will be helping during the 4-7pm "shift". (Larry Gessner, Fay Nichols, and Pastor Tom will be representing our congregational family during the Annual Assembly at Messiah on June 6 & 7.)


SUMMER SCHEDULE RETURNS FOR JULY AND AUGUST

OUR FAITH ACTIVE IN OUR FINANCIAL GIVING - AS OF APRIL 30

In recent years, Congregational Council has asked that we all periodically receive an update in the *Epistle* about how we are doing in meeting our ministry commitments adopted in our annual budget.

Regarding our Current Fund... (The Current Fund is the fund from which most day-to-day bills get paid, much like your home's checking account.) With 17 of 52 Sundays behind us as of April 30, to be right on **budget**, we would have received and spent \$43,680 out of our total 2014 budget of \$133,608. We have actually received \$44,945 in offerings and other income, placing us \$1,265 ahead of budget – the fourth year in a row – and only the fourth time in recent history – that our offerings have exceeded our budget goal at this point in the year. Our expenses as of the end of April total \$47,176 and are \$3,496 over budget (largely due to much larger heating oil expenditures than we expected). Since we have spent more than we have taken in, we are running a deficit of \$2,231 as of April 30.

Several observations from Pastor Tom (the old accountant) about these financial results at this 1/3 point in the year: First, the fact that our offerings and other income are again exceeding our budget goal by a good amount is especially good financial stewardship news this year, after a January and February that saw some of our worst results ever, due to wintry weather and sickness. Second, the amount by which our income exceeds budget (\$1,265) is almost the same amount that it was at this point last year, which means that our giving this year has increased to match the amount of increase called for in our 2014 budget – 3.1% - a testament to faith and trust in God expressed through our pocketbooks in these uncertain financial times. Third, our higher-than-budget expenses from heating costs will mean that we will be especially challenged to end the year with total spending at or below budget. Finally, and most importantly, the bottom line is that our ministry here together continues to be very blessed, especially in light of the continued struggles of our economy!

As to our benevolence offerings which we share with our Lower Susquehanna Synod and our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, to be exactly on **budget** as of April 30, we would have received and forwarded \$3.923 out of our total 2014 commitment of \$12,000. As of April 30, we have **actually** received and shared a total of \$4,352, meaning that we are **ahead** of our commitment by \$429.

Thank you for your partnership in the ministry of St. John, and for your financial stewardship. Again, please watch for future updates every few months, and please feel free at any time to ask questions of or share ideas with Pastor Tom or any member of Council!
