Dear Friends in Jesus,

Well, June is almost upon us and that means it's Strawberry Festival time! That's right – as your family calendar hopefully already indicates, *June 10* is the big day. But, as with any event of this size, there is a lot more going on than the actual hours of serving on June 10. Again this year, the following are some of the details to bear in mind (underlining indicates a change from previous years):

+June 1, starting at 5:30 P.M. – combined first work night to begin getting the pavilion cleaned up and ready for the Festival and church outside property work night (for the first time, we are trying to consolidate what have been two annual work nights into one slightly longer evening, but lots of help will be needed – raindate is June 2, also at 5:30 P.M.)

+June 8, starting at 6:00 A.M. – the preparation of the barbecue and chicken corn soup at the home and shop of Henry & Lorraine Henninger (also note that, at approximately 6:00 P.M. that day, there is wrap-up work to be done as well – call Lorraine if you can help)

+June 9, starting at 7:00 A.M. - the preparation of the popular strawberry pies at the home and shop of Henry & Lorraine Henninger

+June 9, starting at 6:00 P.M. – the cleaning and preparation of the strawberries at the home and shop of Henry & Lorraine Henninger

+June 9, starting at 6:30 P.M. – the final work night to finish the preparation of the pavilion and grove

+June 10, starting at 7:30 A.M. – food and other supplies are loaded up at the Henninger's for transportation to the pavilion

+June 10, starting at 8:30 A.M. – all of the final "moving around, hooking up, and plugging in" takes place at the grove and pavilion

+June 10, starting at 11:30 A.M. – we welcome our guests from the Manor at Susquehanna Village and the Kepler Home and prepare to open to the public

+June 10, starting at 12:00 P.M. - WE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

+June 10, starting at 2:30 P.M. - entertainment by Brad Crum, appearing as Elvis

+June 10, starting after 4:30 P.M. – entertainment by the group Shotgunn (which includes our own Darrell Denlinger on trombone!)

If all this seems like a lot of work, it is. But it is also a time period during which our congregational family comes together to share in the fellowship and laughter that go with that work, perhaps more than at any other time during the year. The Strawberry Festival is an event by which our caring and hospitality are known far and wide. The Strawberry Festival is an event by which we serve as Jesus served - on June 10 by providing a warm and loving and safe time of fun for the whole family, and throughout the following year by using the proceeds to help our neighbors in need and to do many benevolent projects that would not be possible otherwise. 
Vacation Bible School

OUR FAITH ACTIVE IN OUR FINANCIAL GIVING - AS OF APRIL 30

In recent years, Congregational Council has asked that we all periodically receive an update in the *Epistle* about how we are doing in meeting our ministry commitments adopted in our annual budget.

Regarding our Current Fund... (The Current Fund is the fund from which most day-to-day bills get paid, much like your home's checking account.) With 17 of 52 Sundays behind us as of April 30, to be right on **budget**, we would have received and spent \$46,180 out of our total 2015 budget of \$141,256. We have actually received \$45,315 in offerings and other income, placing us slightly behind budget, by \$865. (This result places us solidly in the top half of results for the past 15 years, and is especially nice to note following our worst-ever results back as of the end of February!) Our expenses as of the end of April total \$45,429 and are \$751 under budget (chiefly reflecting the fact that, while there was lots of heating required this past winter, each gallon of heating oil was less expensive than expected). Since we have spent more than we have taken in, we are running a very small deficit of \$114 as of April 30. The bottom line is that our ministry here together continues to be very blessed, especially in light of the continued struggles of our economy!

As to our benevolence offerings which we share with our Lower Susquehanna Synod and our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, to be exactly on **budget** as of April 30, we would have received and forwarded \$3,923 out of our total 2015 commitment of \$12,000. As of April 30, we have **actually** received and shared a total of \$3,467, meaning that we are **slightly behind** our commitment by \$456. We will want to be sure to close this gap as the year goes along.

Thank you for your partnership in the ministry of St. John, and for your financial stewardship. Again, please watch for future updates every few months, and please feel free at any time to ask questions of or share ideas with Pastor Tom or any member of Council!

The council meeting was called to order by President, Roy Henry.

Minutes: Motion by Lorraine Henninger and seconded by Sandra Shade to approve the minutes from the March 8, 2015 meeting. Motion approved unanimously.

Reception of Petitions and Communications: The church received a thank you letter from Community Life Team for the \$100 donation to the emergency medical services program.

The church received a thank you letter from the Lutheran Camping Corporation for the \$500 gift. This is the second installment of a \$1500 pledge St John made to the organization.

We received notification that the web domain name is up for renewal. The fee is \$101 per year. We are asking Rachael Henry to look into other options for a more reasonable cost.

Dave Klotz has volunteered to be the male representative to the Synod Assembly Meeting in June. A motion was made by Sandra Lamenza and seconded by Cheryl Shadle that we approve Dave as our male representative. Motion approved unanimously. Pastor Tom will make the arrangements for Sandra Lamenza, Dave Klotz and himself to attend the meetings.

Pastor's Report: Motion made by Ken Koller and seconded by Tamara Spicher to accept the pastor's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Treasurers' Reports: Motion made by Ken Koller and seconded by Gail Billow to accept the treasurer reports. Motion approved unanimously.

Reports of Standing Committees: Church Property: The church oil tank was filled the end of March. The heating system in the shaft of the elevator is not functioning properly. It will be addressed at the next scheduled elevator service. Tammy Becker will be on vacation the third week of May. Her family will fill in for her with the necessary church responsibilities. The spot light on the north side of the church is not working. Plans to have it repaired are in motion. Clean up day at the church is scheduled for Saturday, April 18.

We offer our sincere thanks to Tim Motter for donating his time and equipment to plow our snow throughout this long winter.

Finance: No report

Worship and Music: Plans were finalized for Holy Week worship. Pastor Tom is reviewing changes to the Good Friday Service for 2016. The experimental skype system set up for worship has been successful and we are reviewing options for making it a permanent addition to our service for those who are homebound.

Our most grateful thanks to Amy Gehring and Louise Baumgartner for the wonderful children's Easter Program they produced.

Christian Education: Met to discuss the Easter Program, Vacation Bible School, the Walk in the Woods (October 4) and Rachael's Day (May 3).

Stewardship: No report

Youth Ministry: Many thanks to our youth group with worship and the egg hunt during Holy Week.

Mutual Ministry: Met on April 12. Discussions involved ways to improve the sound quality of our children's programs, ways to improve attendance at the Saturday night vigil during Holy Week, and the improvement in financial contributions toward the end of the first quarter.

Executive: No report.

Nominating: No report

History: Still working on the history book.

Green Team: The group is looking into the possibilities for electronic giving.

Other Reports:

Prayerful Planning Group: The group is developing a policy for those working with children in our ministry that will protect the children from abuse and comply with laws regarding background checks and mandatory reporting etc.

Cemetery Association: The cemetery association met in March. They looked at options for building an entrance to the cemetery at two of the roads; one adjacent to the front to the church and one on St John Road. They also discussed the increase in cremations and some of the things we need to address to react to this change including things like a creating a cremation garden and possible benches that hold ashes. The association will contact the grave digger to confirm that all casket graves must be at least 6' deep. They will address some of the trees with dead limbs and other landscaping issues. They are also getting estimates on repairing some of the damaged tombstones.

Unfinished Business: There are 56 remaining green hymnals. We need to decide an appropriate distribution of the hymnals.

A motion was made by Sandra Lamenza and seconded by Ken Koller that we discontinue the "no touch" policy at the May 3 service. Motion approved unanimously

New Business: Confirmation Services will be held on May 24. All council members should be there at 9:50 am to participate in the processional.

A motion was made by Tamara Shade and seconded by Sandra Lamenza to hold a blood drive in the name of Brian Thompson. Dates being considered are Wednesday June 24 and Tuesday June 30. Pastor Tom and Mary Ann Smeltz will finalize the details.

Next Council Meeting: May 17, 2015 at 4:00PM. The May meeting will be the third Sunday because of Mother's Day.

Adjournment: Motion by Sandra Lamenza and seconded by Gail Billow to adjourn the meeting. Motion approved unanimously.


