

Dear Friends in Jesus,

Well, June is almost upon us and that means it's Strawberry Festival time! That's right – as your family calendar hopefully already indicates, *June 8* is the big day. But, as with any event of this size, there is a lot more going on than the actual hours of serving on June 8, this year with pretty much everything taking place at our newly refurbished pavilion! Here are most of the details to bear in mind (underlining indicates a change from previous years):

+May 24, starting at 6:15 P.M. – first work night to begin getting the pavilion cleaned up and ready for the Festival, with lots of help needed especially following this year's pavilion renovation work (I realize this evening may well be done and over by the time you read these lines)

- +June 4, starting at 7:00 A.M. first day of soup preparation in the pavilion kitchen
- +June 6, starting at 7:00 A.M. second day of soup preparation and preparation of the barbecue in the pavilion kitchen (please also note that, at approximately 6:00 P.M. that day, there is wrap-up work to be done as well call Lorraine Henninger or Sandra Lamenza if you can help)
 - +June 7, starting at 7:00 A.M. the preparation of the popular strawberry pies in the pavilion kitchen
- +June 7, starting at 6:00 P.M. the cleaning and preparation of the strawberries and the covering of the pies in the pavilion kitchen
 - +June 7, starting at 6:30 P.M. the final work night to finish the preparation of the pavilion and grove
- **+June 8, starting at 8:00 A.M.** all of the final "moving around, hooking up, and plugging in" takes place at the grove and pavilion
- +June 8, starting at 11:30 A.M. we welcome our guests from the Kepler Home and prepare to open to the public
 - +June 8, starting at 12:00 P.M. WE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC
 - +June 8, starting at approx. 2:30 P.M. entertainment by Brad Crum, appearing as Elvis
- +June 8, starting after 4:30 P.M. entertainment by the group Shotgunn (which includes our own Darrell Denlinger on trombone!)

The Strawberry Festival is an event by which our caring and hospitality are known far and wide. The Strawberry Festival is an event by which we serve as Jesus served – on June 8 by providing a warm and loving and safe time of fun for the whole family, and throughout the following year by using the proceeds to help our neighbors in need and to do many benevolent projects that would not be possible otherwise. Hello Everyone!





OUR FAITH ACTIVE IN OUR FINANCIAL GIVING - AS OF APRIL 30

In recent years, Congregational Council has asked that we all periodically receive an update in the *Epistle* about how we are doing in meeting our ministry commitments adopted in our annual budget.

Regarding our Current Fund... (The Current Fund is the fund from which most day-to-day bills get paid, much like your home's checking account.) With 17 of 52 Sundays behind us as of April 30, to be right on **budget**, we would have received and spent \$\frac{\\$47,758}{\}} out of our total 2016 budget of \$146,083. We have **actually received \$\frac{\\$48,231}{\}}** in offerings and other income, placing us slightly ahead of this goal, by \$473. (This result is one of our best in the past 16 years, and is especially nice to note following our actually "losing" a Sunday back in January and with the special appeals that we have also been conducting for Amanda's ministry with us and the pavilion work.) Our **expenses** as of the end of April total \$\frac{\\$46,641}{\}\$ and are \$1,117 under budget. Since we have taken in more than we have spent, we have a small **surplus** of \$\frac{\\$1,590}{\}\$ as of April 30 – again one of our best results at this point in the year. The bottom line is that our ministry here together continues to be very blessed, especially in light of the continued uncertainties of our economy!

As to our benevolence offerings which we share with our Lower Susquehanna Synod and our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, to be exactly on **budget** as of April 30, we would have received and forwarded \$3,923 out of our total 2016 commitment of \$12,000. As of April 30, we have **actually** received and shared a total of \$3,789, meaning that we are **slightly behind** our commitment by \$134. We will want to be sure to close this gap as the year goes along.

Thank you for your partnership in the ministry of St. John, and for your financial stewardship. Again, please watch for future updates every few months, and please feel free at any time to ask questions of or share ideas with Pastor Tom or any member of Council!

The council meeting was called to order by President, Roy Henry. Pastor Tom opened the meeting with a prayer.

Minutes: Motion by Dale Hassinger and seconded by Tamara Spicher to approve the minutes from the March 2016 meeting. Motion approved unanimously.

Reception of Petitions and Communications: We received a request from Shannon Motter to hold a spaghetti supper and several other fund raising activities to finance the cost of her missionary trip to Guatemala through the "Tree for Hope" program. A motion was made by Sandra Lamenza and seconded by Carl Baumgardner to approve the use of the Social Hall on May 22 for the dinner and to support her other fund raising efforts as necessary. Motion approved unanimously.

A request was made for financial support for the radio station "Sing for Joy". A motion was made by Jeff Lehman and seconded by Jeff Buffington to continue our annual gift of \$300. Motion approved unanimously.

Pastor's Report: Motion made by Lorraine Henninger and seconded by Dale Hassinger to accept the pastor's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Youth and Children's Coordinator Report: Carl Baumgardner reported on the activities of the Youth and Children's Coordinator. Amanda Baker was installed during Sunday services on April 10. Beginning immediately through Memorial Day, Amanda will lead the youth Sunday School with some opening activities. Memorial Day through Labor Day Sunday School will be held at the same time as church. Details on how this program will work will follow.

Treasurers' Reports: Motion made by Tamara Spicher and seconded by Jeff Buffington to accept the treasurers' reports. Motion approved unanimously.

Reports of Standing Committees:

Church Property: Additional work on the porch of the sexton home and some necessary landscaping work was completed. Most of the work on the pavilion was completed. Two outside work nights have been scheduled for April 26 and May 24.

Finance/Stewardship: No report

Worship and Music: The committee is looking into local vineyards as a resource for communion wine. An outside service was added for Sunday August 21. Possibility of children providing music during the church service under the direction of Amanda Baker.

Christian Education: No report

Youth Ministry: There were many positive comments about the youth participation in the Good Friday service. The lock-in and the Easter Egg hunt went well. Dan and Angie Mauer will be retiring next

month as youth advisors. Becky Conti will take over as lead advisor and Jodi Thompson as Support Advisor.

Mutual Ministry: Discussed the many positive things happening in the church. Also discussed the possible need for an Inquirer's Class.

Executive: No report.

Green Team: No report

Other *Reports:* The Cemetery Association approved the construction of an entrance to the cemetery being built at the first road on the north side of the church. Many of the broken tombstones have been repaired. Dead trees were removed from the south side of the cemetery.

Progress continues on getting all the proper background checks completed for those working with children.

Unfinished Business: The local benevolence group will be taking on the task of identifying opportunities for utilizing our "Gifts of Love" funds. They will meet September 6, 2016.

New business: Pastor Tom and Roy Henry will attend a Halifax High School graduation ceremony on June 7 to present Zach Thompson with the St John Christian Leadership Scholarship.

Next Council Meeting: May 15, 2016 at 4:00PM and mid-summer meeting is August 1 at 7PM.

Adjournment: Motion by Dale Hassinger and seconded by Gail Billow to adjourn the meeting. Motion approved unanimously.


