Dear Friends in Jesus,

Well, June is almost upon us and that means it's Strawberry Festival time! That's right – as your family calendar hopefully already indicates, *June 13* is the big day. But, as with any event of this size, there is a lot more going on than the actual hours of serving on June 13. Here are most of the details to bear in mind:

- +May 29, starting at 5:30 P.M. <u>combined first work night</u> to begin getting the pavilion cleaned up and ready for the Festival <u>and</u> church outside spring property work accomplished (as we did successfully last year, we are consolidating what have traditionally been two annual work nights into one slightly longer evening, but lots of help will be needed.)

Congratulations to Our New Doctors!

It isn't often that we have one, let alone two, of our congregational family members who have placed over their shoulders the traditional hood that comes with the completion of a doctoral degree but, this spring, both **Daniel Bruner** and **Alayna (Peters) Ribovich** achieved this high honor as they both begin careers in the healing arts. Please read on for some of the details of Dan's and Alayna's experiences (and please note that the July/August newsletter will contain a full report on our May and June high school and undergraduate diploma recipients):

On March 31, **Daniel Bruner** completed four years of study and clinical work and graduated from New York Chiropractic College in Seneca Falls, NY with his Doctorate in Chiropractic. Dan's work at NYCC followed the completion of his Bachelor's Degree in Kinesiology at the Pennsylvania State University in 2014. During his last year of schooling for the doctorate, Dan had the pleasure of being accepted to an honors clerkship that placed him in a Neurology based chiropractic office in Lindenhurst, NY on Long Island. His focus in Chiropractic has related to ergonomics and workplace injury, injuries in athletes, neurology and geriatric care. Recently, Dan had the pleasure of accepting a position at Altland Chiropractic in Millersburg and is very much enjoying being back in The Valley.

After eight years, her time as a student is finally over. On May 13th, **Alayna Ribovich** received a doctorate of pharmacy degree from Shenandoah University. Alayna always intended to pursue pharmacy when thinking about college as a high school student. Her initial plan upon graduating high school was to attend Temple University in Philadelphia for seven years, three years to complete undergraduate coursework, and four years of pharmacy school. At 18, the idea of leaving Berrysburg for "city life" in Philadelphia was intoxicating, but soon after her first semester started she realized Temple and Philadelphia were just not the place for her.

After finishing her freshmen year, she then transferred to Shenandoah University in Winchester, Virginia. Shenandoah is a small, private university located in the beautiful Shenandoah Valley with about 4,000 students. From her first visit on campus, Alayna loved everything about it. She continued her undergraduate work by studying biology and chemistry. During her senior year she applied to several pharmacy schools and was accepted at the Bernard J. Dunn School of Pharmacy at Shenandoah. Alayna finished her Bachelor of Science degree majoring in biology and chemistry, graduating in May 2014.

The four years of pharmacy school challenged Alayna in new ways. She had always been an excellent student, and her undergraduate studies gave her an advantage in the classroom, but the expectations for professional students far exceeded the expectations she had previously experienced as an undergraduate student. It wasn't enough to just get good grades; you needed to be a well-rounded individual. To thrive in pharmacy school required work experience, getting involved with student organizations, taking on leadership roles, volunteering in the community, and networking within the profession of pharmacy whenever possible. Over time, Alayna rose to this new challenge. Some of Alayna's most notable accomplishments while in pharmacy school include holding several leadership positions in various student organizations, completing two internships, serving in a medical mission trip with Shenandoah to Haiti, and presenting a research poster on blood thinners at a national meeting while maintaining a 4.0 GPA.

Inquirer's Class

An Inquirer's Class will be held at the church on Sunday, June 17, beginning immediately after worship and ending by 12:30 P.M. This class is designed for those who are either thinking about or planning on joining the congregation, as well as current congregational members who desire a bit of a refresher in the basics of Lutheran Christian history and belief. Simply speak with Pastor Tom any time prior to the class to register. New members will be received at a later date, tentatively on July 1.

Congratulations to Our New Doctors - Continued

For Alayna, the importance of being well rounded was even greater, as she found she wanted to pursue a career in clinical pharmacy, which requires residency training. Pharmacy residency programs are extremely competitive, with only about 65% of applicants earning a position. Pharmacy residency training is a postgraduate training program that allows you to practice as a licensed practitioner, but also to train under the supervision of an experienced preceptor. This allows the resident to develop skills in various hospital settings and accelerate professional growth.

The entire residency application and interview process was brutal, one of the most stressful things she's ever done. You constantly had to prove why you were better than all the other applicants, who were all also incredible students and it really shook her self-confidence. Luckily she had her husband Brandon, her parents, and her faith to help her through the times when she didn't believe in herself. After months of applications and interviews, Alayna was accepted into her top choice of pharmacy residency programs. Starting on July 2, 2018, Alayna will be one of the pharmacy residents at Meritus Medical Center in Hagerstown, Maryland. After her year of residency training she hopes to pursue a clinical pharmacist position at one of the many hospitals in central Pennsylvania in order to move closer to home.

Our Faith Active in our Financial Giving - As of April 30

In recent years, Congregational Council has asked that we all periodically receive an update in the *Epistle* about how we are doing in meeting our ministry commitments adopted in our annual budget.

Regarding our Current Fund... (The Current Fund is the fund from which most day-today bills get paid, much like your home's checking account.) With 17 of 52 Sundays behind us as of April 30, to be right on **budget**, we would have received <u>\$50,160</u> out of our total 2018 budget. Adjusting for the effects of some lump-sum gifts at the beginning of the year, we have **actually received** <u>\$50,168</u> in offerings and other income, meaning we have just **slightly exceeded our goal by** <u>\$8</u>. This very small surplus is one of our best results at this point in the year.

As to the Children & Youth Ministry Fund, through which Miss Laurie's ministry with us is being funded, we have **received** <u>\$5,763</u> in offerings and Thrivent Choice Dollars as of the end of April (again adjusting for some lump-sum gifts at the beginning of the year) which, while not enough money to completely cover our expenditures, is still <u>almost</u> <u>\$3,000</u> ahead of where we projected we might be in our giving at this point in this second year of ministry together (which is very important because we will need to continue to grow together in order to fully cover expenditures in coming years as planned, without the help of interest from our Memorials Account).

Finally, as to the gifts we share with our Lower Susquehanna Synod and our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, to be exactly on **budget** as of April 30, we would have received and forwarded **\$3,923** out of our total 2018 commitment of \$12,000. As of April 30, we have **actually** received and shared a total of **\$5,677**, meaning that we are **ahead of** our commitment by **\$1,754**.

Thank you for your partnership in the ministry of St. John, and for your financial stewardship. Again, please watch for future updates every few months, and please feel free at any time to ask questions of or share ideas with Treasurer Jamie Doyle, Pastor Tom or any member of Council!

Did you know...?

- 1. Close to 75 percent of the flowering plants on the Earth rely to some degree on pollinators in order to set seed or fruit.

- 3. European bees are the most efficient pollinators. They can carry 90 times their weight in pollen.
- 4. The Rusty Patched Bumblebee is on the Endangered Species List and the Monarch Butterfly might be added.
