

Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus,

Well, June is almost upon us and that means it's Strawberry Festival time! That's right – as your family calendar hopefully already indicates, *June 7* is the big day. But, as with any event of this size, there is a lot more going on than the actual hours of serving on June 7. Here are most of the scheduling details to bear in mind:

- Tuesday, May 23, starting at 5:30 P.M. <u>combined first work night</u> to begin getting the pavilion cleaned up and ready for the Festival <u>and</u> church outside spring property work accomplished (as we have done so successfully in recent years, we are consolidating what were formerly two annual work nights into one slightly longer evening, but lots of help will be needed.)
- Saturday, June 3, starting at 8:00 A.M. food preparation
- Monday, June 5, starting at 8:00 A.M. food preparation
- Monday, June 5, starting at 6:00 P.M. strawberry preparation
- Tuesday, June 6, starting at 8:00 A.M. strawberry pie preparation
- Tuesday, June 6, starting at 6:00 P.M. final cleanup of the pavilion and grove
- Wednesday, June 7, starting at 8:00 A.M. all of the final "moving around, hooking up, and plugging
 in" at the grove and pavilion
- Wednesday, June 7, starting at 12:00 P.M. WE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC
- Wednesday, June 7, afternoon and evening musical entertainment by Brad Crum, appearing as Elvis;
 by our own young persons, the Celebration Choir, under the direction of Miss Laurie; and, new this year, by local group Shannon

Our Strawberry Festival is an event by which our caring and hospitality are known far and wide. (I can still remember how, 23 years ago now, when I would tell someone just where I was serving as the brand-new pastor, many would recognize "St. John Evangelical Lutheran", even more would recognize "The Hill Church", but if all else failed, they would for sure recognize "The Strawberry Festival Church"!) The Strawberry Festival is an event

by which we serve as Jesus served – on June 7 by providing a warm and loving and safe time of fun for the whole family, and throughout the following year by using the proceeds to help our neighbors in need and to do many benevolent projects that would not be possible otherwise. Upper Dauphin Area Archery Season

The 2023 U.D.A. Archery season began with 38 High School Archers and 52 Middle School Archers. That included from St. John's congregation; RJ Henry, Gabe Gehring for HS and Brayden Bender and Brianna Radel for MS. What a year it was! The HS broke the State record 3 times this season with the 3^{rd} coming at the State Tournament, which UDA won again for the 5^{th} time, shooting a state record of 3361. The team was led by Kyra Grace Tomlinson shooting a 287 which was good enough for 5^{th} place in the State girl's division. Gabe Gehring and RJ Henry both contributed with their personal best scores of 275 and 270 respectfully. This win of the State title capped off an undefeated 8-0 tournament record.

The season for the MS was quite different. Capturing 2nd place in 6 State Qualifiers earning them a 4th place overall ranking going into the State Championship. Not to be out done by their upper-class comrades MS captured the one that counted the most, the Pa State Championship with a score of 3249. Eighth grader Gary Leitzel shot his personal best of 286 earning him 2nd in the State for MS boys.

This is the 1st time the same school has won both the MS and HS State Championship!

Next by virtue of the State Championship both teams qualified for the National Championship in Louisville, Kentucky. The bus left UDA MS on May 10th to shoot on May 11th. The HS was ranked 37th in the nation out of 728 high schools. The Trojan archers did not disappoint shooting 3412 surpassing their old State record by 51 points to secure 10th position out of 253 competing high schools. Senior Kyra Grace Tomlinson shot a 297 out of a possible 300 securing her the 2nd spot in the nation! In the boy's division freshman, Austin Heim finished with a 295 to capture 10th place. The MS team also performed beyond expectations shooting their season's best score of 3291. Beating their State Championship score by 42 points. This earned them 14th place out of over 250 schools. The MS team was led by Gary Leitzel shooting 288 for 26th place out of 2767 MS boys. The teams had 2 All American Academic Archers (qualifications being top 24 in the nation combined with scholastic and GPA guidelines); Kyra Tomlison and Austin Heim HS.

Based on individual scores of 280 and above for HS and 275 and above for MS the Trojans have 9 HS archers and 5 MS archers qualify for the Open World Championship at Myrtle Beach S.C. to be held on June $8^{th} - 10^{th}$.

Congratulations to all our archers, parents, grandparents and even great grandparents!



Upper Dauphin Odyssey of the Mind

The Upper Dauphin Elementary School Odyssey of the Mind Upper Elementary team has qualified for Worlds Competition at Michigan State University in May. They earned this opportunity by scoring first place out of twelve teams in their division at the state Odyssey of the Mind competition held at Lock Haven University on April 1. The team will represent Pennsylvania in their problem and division against teams from across all 50 states and countries from around the world!

Odyssey of the Mind teaches students how to develop and use their natural creativity to become problem-solvers. It also emphasizes teamwork, budgeting, time management, public speaking, and more. Team members include Garrison Reiner, Sophia Reiner, Brooklyn Bender, Cora Welker, Kinsley Skelton-Crosby, Ava Zerbe and Calder Witmer.

Reagan Little graduated with a bachelor of science degree in Communication Sciences and Disorders from Lebanon Valley College on May 13th. She graduated summa cum laude and with Phi Alpha Epsilon honors. She is continuing her education at Lebanon Valley College to pursue her Master's degree in Speech-Language Pathology. During her time at LVC, she participated in a variety of service opportunities, including two service trips. In addition, she co-created and led *Girls Are...*, a social group for middle school-aged girls that teaches empowerment and confidence.
