Dear Friends in Jesus,

Well, June is almost upon us and, this year, that means it's time to welcome back our Annual Strawberry Festival after a year "away"! That's right – as a further reminder that we are steadily making our way toward that muchanticipated "new normal", and as your family calendar hopefully already indicates, *June 9* is the big day. But, as you have also hopefully already heard, this will be a year of transition for our Festival, with all serving taking place in a "Takeout/Self Seating/Enjoy the Church Property" format and with no other activities taking place here on The Hill. Especially with all of the changes and tweaking that are needed to transition to this first-ever (and hopefully/prayerfully last-ever!) format, there is a whole lot going on and lots of help needed just as in the past, well before we open at 11:00 A.M. on June 9. Here are most of the scheduling details to bear in mind:

- Tuesday, May 25, starting at 5:30 P.M. <u>combined first work night</u> to begin getting the pavilion cleaned up and ready for the Festival <u>and</u> church outside spring property work accomplished (as in past years, we are again combining what were at one time two annual work nights into one slightly longer evening, but lots of help will be needed.)
- Saturday, June 5, starting at 8:00 A.M. chicken corn soup preparation
- Monday, June 7, starting at 8:00 A.M. beef barbecue and shortcakes preparation
- Monday, June 7, TBA (Evening) cleaning/preparation of strawberries
- **Tuesday, June 8, starting at 8:00 A.M.** strawberry pie preparation
- Tuesday, June 8, (All Day) various take-out preparation/pre-packaging of foods



- Tuesday, June 8, starting at 6:00 P.M. strawberry preparation and pavilion and other set up
- Wednesday, June 9, starting at 8:00 A.M. preparation for opening at the pavilion
- Wednesday, June 9, starting at 10:00 A.M. orientation and safety gathering for participants
- Wednesday, June 9, starting at 11:00 A.M. WE OPEN OUR TAKEOUT TO THE PUBLIC

Pavilion Curtains

Immediately following worship on May 2, a combined Property Committee/Congregational Council meeting gave the go-ahead to a proposal from Shady Lane Curtains, LLC of Bird-In-Hand to replace our pavilion's three curtains (north, east, and south sides) with new, motorized curtains, each of which contains a "window" strip of clear siding which will allow for a much brighter experience for anyone gathered in the pavilion with the curtains lowered. This will also allow us to combine what have been two smaller curtains on the east side (since our expansion of the pavilion years ago) into a single and more solid curtain. The total cost of \$9,011 will be financed through the Strawberry Festival/Bicentennial Fund, as have many such improvements in the pavilion which directly benefit our Annual Strawberry Festival, but special donations toward the cost are very welcome and have already come in sufficient to cover more than half of this cost. If you would like to make a gift, please place your check (payable to **St. John Bicentennial Fund** and indicating "Curtain Project" on the memo line) in a plain envelope marked with the notation "Curtain Project" and your offering envelope number and drop it in the offering plate at the top of the stairs on Sunday morning or route it to church by any of the alternate means listed below. By moving quickly, we were able to take advantage of almost \$900 in discounts for ordering during what is traditionally Shady Lane's less busy season and we will be able to have the work done prior to our June 9 Drive-Through Strawberry Festival.

Our Faith Active in Our Financial Giving – as of April 30

After concluding the year 2020 with very strong giving of tithes and offerings, despite all of the COVID-related impacts to our congregational family life together, the first third of 2021 has likewise seen us all pulling together in solid fashion in giving to God's work in this place as a congregational family. Here are summaries of our three largest funds for the first four months of 2021 – the **Current Fund** (much like your main checking account at home, from which most of the day-to-day bills of ministry get paid), the **Children & Youth (C&Y) Fund** (through which Miss Laurie's ministry is funded), and our **Larger Church Benevolence** (through which our congregational family supports the work of our Lower Susquehanna Synod and Evangelical Lutheran Church in America on all of our behalf):

* Our April 30 Total Giving reflects the kindness of several folks who shared all of their 2021 offerings right at the beginning of the year. The "Adjusted" line subtracts out the 2/3 of these advance gifts which applies to the months May through December still to come.

[^]With our Larger Church Benevolence, we simply send on exactly what we receive each month, and so the Total "Expenses" equal the Total Giving.

The above information is based on a summary which Pastor Tom (putting on his "CPA Hat") shares each month with Congregational Council. Please don't hesitate to ask him any questions you might have about these numbers. For questions about the details of our giving or our expenses, please speak with **Treasurer Jamie Doyle**. Thank you for your partnership in this wonderful ministry which is St. John, and especially for your kindness in "going the extra mile" to mail or drop off your offerings in these challenging times! Please watch for future updates every few months. (And please remember that, if you are not yet ready to take part in in-person worship, there are three very simple options for giving your tithes and offerings. You are welcome to **1.** mail your offering to the church (PO Box 270, Berrysburg, 17005-0270) or **2.** drop it by the church and place it in the red plastic tub that is prominently visible in the Sunday School Room, on the table just outside Pastor Tom's office door. In addition, **3.** if neither of those is easily done, you may wish to contact your bank about setting up an automatic payment, as some of our congregational family members also have done, whereby the offering you direct is sent by your bank as a check mailed directly to the church. In all cases, Pastor Tom will then see that all offerings received get securely passed along to our counters.)

The ELCA Youth Gathering team announces the theme of the 2022 Gathering, "boundless: God beyond measure," based on Ephesians 3:19 CEV.



"I want you to know all about Christ's love, although it is too wonderful to be measured. Then your lives will be filled with all that God is."



Ephesians 3:14-21 CEV ¹⁴ I kneel in prayer to the Father. ¹⁵ All beings in heaven and on earth receive their life from [God]. ¹⁶ God is wonderful and glorious. I pray that [God's] Spirit will make you become strong followers ¹⁷ and that Christ will live in your hearts because of your faith. Stand firm and be deeply rooted in [God's] love. ¹⁸ I pray that you and all of God's people will understand what is called wide or long or high or deep. ¹⁹ I want you to know all about Christ's love, although it is too wonderful to be measured. Then your lives will be filled with all that God is.

20-21 I pray that Christ Jesus and the church will forever bring praise to God. [God's] power at work in us can do far more than we dare ask or imagine. Amen.

We are bound. Bound by our sin, by the expectations of others, by poverty, by -isms that try to divide us, and by so much more. In a life that often feels as if it has young people in a suffocating grip, we want them to imagine the boundlessness of God: boundless love, boundless mercy, boundless freedom, boundless creation, boundless strength. What are the stories of God's people, both in Scripture and modern-day, that share the awe and wonder of just how vast our God is? Confirmation has been moved to All Saints Day on November 7, 2021.

The trash pick-up company has been sold to Heim's Disposal Service. They will honor the previous arrangement of free pick-up for the church. Sandra Lamenza will send that a thank you note to acknowledge their generosity.

At the Upper Dauphin Conference, Jonathan Jenkins was elected to a second term as Dean, and Pastor Dell will be attending the 2022 ELCA conference in Columbus, Ohio.

Pastor's Report: Motion made by Sandra Lamenza and seconded by Dana Klouser to accept the pastor's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Children and Youth Ministry Report: Motion was made by Sandra Lamenza and seconded by Sheila Barder to accept Miss Laurie's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Motion made by Ron Erb and seconded by Michael Henninger to accept the treasurer's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Reports of Standing Committees:

Many of the committees have not been meeting due to the COVID 19 pandemic. Any business that needed attention has been handled through phone calls.

Church Property: The committee met to discuss the ongoing issue of the pavilion curtains. The damage is bad enough that some will have to be replaced. A group is visiting a location to see the newer electric curtains. The work has begun at the sexton house, and the stars have been taken down and repaired.

Finance: No report

Worship and Music: The committee met via Zoom. They discussed drive-thru communion and the change of confirmation to All Saints Day in November. The Alter Guild will start meeting in the fall, and the flower committee will re-start the alter flowers the beginning of November.

Faith Formation Team: The committee met via Zoom. They discussed Vacation Bible School. The expect it will be a regular in-person event Monday July 19 through Friday July 23 with a closing program on Sunday, July 25. They have a back-up virtual plan if necessary.

Yo*uth Ministry:* The youth group had a successful egg hunt and the first post-COVID in-person game night. They have a current fundraiser selling Knobles Grove Tickets.

Mutual Ministry: Met on April 11. Three graduating seniors, all from UDAHS, are eligible to receive the St John Congregational Scholarship. They are Gracie Gehring, Kinsley Schreffler, and Owen Mattern. The presentation at Class Night will be virtual on June 2, 2021. A motion was made by the Mutual Ministry committee to accept Pastor Tom's recommendation that he create a June – September self-study confirmation class program which will allow the opportunity for Avery Mace, who ended up missing most of the Sunday morning classes this past year, to catch up, so she can be confirmed with her classmates on November 7. After discussion, the motion was passed unanimously. Pastor Tom will oversee her progress.
