Well, June is almost upon us and that means it's Strawberry Festival time! That's right – as your family calendar hopefully already indicates, *June 8* is the big day. But, as with any event of this size, there is a lot more going on than the actual hours of serving on June 8, especially as we return this year to a "normal" Festival but with some important improvements gleaned from last year's unique Festival day. Here are most of the scheduling details to bear in mind:

- Tuesday, May 24, starting at 5:30 P.M. <u>combined first work night</u> to begin getting the pavilion cleaned up and ready for the Festival <u>and</u> church outside spring property work accomplished (as we did successfully in several past years, we are consolidating what were formerly two annual work nights into one slightly longer evening, but lots of help will be needed.)

- Saturday, June 4, starting at 8:00 A.M. food preparation
- Monday, June 6, starting at 8:00 A.M. food preparation
- Monday, June 6, starting at 6:00 P.M. strawberry preparation
- Tuesday, June 7, starting at 8:00 A.M. strawberry pie preparation
- Tuesday, June 7, starting at 6:00 P.M. final cleanup of the pavilion and grove
- Wednesday, June 8, starting at 8:00 A.M. all of the final "moving around, hooking up, and plugging
  in" at the grove and pavilion
- Wednesday, June 8, starting at 12:00 P.M. WE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC
- Wednesday, June 8, afternoon and evening musical entertainment by Brad Crum, appearing as Elvis;
   by our own young persons, the Celebration Choir, under the direction of Miss Laurie; and, new this year, by The Lykens Valley Bluegrass Band.

Our Strawberry Festival is an event by which our caring and hospitality are known far and wide. The Strawberry Festival is an event by which we serve as Jesus served – on June 8 by providing a warm and loving and safe time of fun for the whole family, and throughout the following year by using the proceeds to help our neighbors in need and to do many benevolent projects that would not be possible otherwise. #### St John Restoration 250

Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to care for the church of God, which he obtained with his own blood. Acts 20:28

On Sunday morning May 1, 2020, the St John congregation voted in favor of moving forward with the proposed Restoration 250, a project focused on the preservation and restoration of the historic building that functions as our church and gathering place for worship.

Over three years ago the property committee was tasked with addressing the deteriorating plaster issues and the need of a fresh coat of paint. It has been over 40 years since the church was painted, and the challenge was to find a contractor who was willing to provide an appropriate and practical solution to the deteriorating plaster issue. After much prayerful research we agreed on moving forward with Bahret Church Interiors.

Because of the nature of the work, the property committee discussed other things that we should be addressing before the plaster repair and painting were completed, and established the following objectives of the St John Restoration 250 project to include:

- 1. Repair the plaster in a way that would be a long-term solution while giving the church a fresh coat of paint.
- 2. Improve the worship experience through better lighting and sound.
- 3. Make the first-floor vestibule entrance more welcoming with a clear message of our mission.
- 4. Improve the Zoom worship experience through better visual and sound quality.

Based on these objectives, the following improvements are included in the proposal.

- Plaster work will include the repair of serious cracks, removal of loose paint and plaster, and finishing walls with a flexible primer.
- Walls will be painted with two coats of quality paint in a buttery cream color. with two additional deeper shades used for accent in various places.
- All the wood trim, except for the pews, will be painted white.
- The ceiling stencil detail will be replaced with moulding that will coordinate appropriately with our Colonial Revival Architecture.
- The carpet will be replaced with a deep Cathedral Red 36# nylon carpet. The main entrance vestibule floor will be replaced with commercial grade vinyl wood panels.
- Additional lighting will be added under the balcony. Accent and task lighting will be added to the altar and
  organ spaces. Lighting will be improved in the vestibule areas and all lighting will be converted to costefficient LED lighting.
- The current sound system will be replaced with new speakers, new microphones, and a digital control panel.
- The current screen in the altar area will be replaced with a motorized screen and a ceiling mounted projector.
- Zoom equipment and cameras will be relocated to the balcony with a digital control system that will improve our Zoom worship.

The total project will cost approximately \$220,000. The financial committee outlined a financial plan for paying for the project which includes interest money from the Memorial Fund and money already contributed or pledged to the project. The financial committee has recommended we maintain a \$100,000 Memorial Fund interest

reserve (to, among other things, allow us to address the replacement of our steeple base roof as soon as possible). This lets us with a need to generate an additional \$65,000. Therefore, we are calling on all of us together to consider making a financial contribution or pledge to the project.

We hope everyone will accept the financial responsibility to help. Regardless of how small or large a contribution may be, we can all be a part of this important restoration project. All contributions will be recorded in our Memorial Records. They can be "dedicated" to someone or something, they can be made "in memory of" someone, or they can simply be a "gift" from an individual or a family. The contribution period will be two years, the commitment/pledge period will be two months. The attached contribution/pledge form should be included with your commitment and returned by July 30, 2022.

As we prepare to celebrate the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of St John Lutheran Church, we can all be proud of the fact that as overseers of this historic building, we have restored and preserved the heritage of both the building and the congregation.
