Dear Friends in Jesus,

Just when you were maybe beginning to wonder if the Season of Lent was indeed "on" for this year, we will observe **Ash Wednesday**, the traditional beginning of the Season of Lent, on **March 1 at 7:00 P.M.** with a Liturgy of Holy Communion, including the optional imposition of ashes. Those desiring to receive the mark of a cross, traced in ashes on their forehead, will come forward at the appropriate time in the worship, much as we come forward to receive Holy Communion. As is traditional here at St. John, those communing will have the option of receiving the wine from the common cup.

Then, on subsequent Wednesday evenings during Lent, we of the Lutheran, United Church of Christ, and United Methodist congregations of the Berrysburg and Elizabethville area will again join together for a light supper and worship. The supper, consisting of simple items like soup and sandwiches, will begin at **6:15 P.M.** Following supper, at **7:00 P.M.**, we will join in worship. Worship will end by approximately 8:00 P.M. Once again this year, the host pastor of each congregation will lead the worship, while the pastors will each take turns preaching in a congregation other than their own. Our theme for this year's Lenten series is based on the theme of the planned August 13 Elizabethville Bicentennial worship – *Community of Believers*, and so, as planning continues for August 13, each of our Wednesday evenings will examine some biblical aspect of what it means to be a community of believers. 

### PLEASE BE SURE TO GET YOUR LENTEN DEVOTIONAL BOOKLET!

Continuing our Lenten tradition of using a common resource for Bible reading and prayer, we again have that resource available for the taking – one that ties in with the 500th Anniversary of Martin Luther's beginning of the Protestant Reformation, which is coming up on October 31. It is a little booklet called *free indeed*. Coming from our denominational publishing house, Augsburg Fortress, it includes a reading from Martin Luther's Small Catechism, reflections, and a prayer for each day from Ash Wednesday through the Eve of Easter on April 15. We have ordered enough copies of the devotional that every member household can have one to use, and, to start with, they will be handed out before worship the last two Sundays in February. If, as you read these lines, you haven't yet gotten your household's copy, please check with Pastor Tom. (As has been the case in previous years, please don't change what you do in the way of regular daily Bible reading during Lent - instead, please add this brief time to your daily life, so that we share this devotional experience as a congregational family.)

Happy March! Just wanted to keep you posted on some of the things we have been working on:

We've created our own Sunday program and it kicked off on February 5<sup>th</sup>! We are calling it "SONday Celebration" - because our Great Big God is SON-sational!! We will be using the lectionary based Spark curriculum as a base. Each lesson will be tailored to have a story, craft and activities for 2 different age groups: one for 3 year olds through 2<sup>nd</sup> grade, and one for 4<sup>th</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> grade. After a 15 minute opening of songs and praise (for ALL youth), one group will go to craft; the other group will go to story. After about 20 minutes, groups will "rotate" to the other area. We'll finish each lesson with a short closing, prayer and sending song. We've been using this format since January, and it has been working nicely.

If you would like to lead story time or craft time as a Celebration Formation Leader for the day, let me know which Sunday works for you! All materials will be provided for you. Prayerfully consider joining the "Celebration" – it's fun, and a great way to meet and bond with the future of our church!

**Celebration Time** – the "Celebration" continues!! After the Gospel reading, young Christians 5<sup>th</sup> grade and lower are invited downstairs for a church experience geared to their age level. Most Sundays, the experience will reinforce the Gospel lesson of the day. Anyone interested in helping, see Miss Laurie!

We are working on creating a "Celebration Center" where all news related to SONday Celebration will be posted. Sign-up sheets for Celebration Formation Leaders (craft or story) and Celebration Time will be located in this center.



Celebration Choir – we've been learning songs during SONday Celebration which we plan to perform during a church service. Our first performance is scheduled for March 12<sup>th</sup>. Mark your calendars – we are going to rock God's house!
