### A Letter from The Pastor.....

#### Dear Friends in Jesus,

Our journey through the Season of Lent begins this month, with our observance of **Ash Wednesday** on **March 6 at 7:00 P.M.** with a Liturgy of Holy Communion, including the optional imposition of ashes. Those desiring to receive the mark of a cross, traced in ashes on their forehead, will come forward at the appropriate time in the worship, much as we come forward to receive Holy Communion. As is traditional here at St. John, those communing will have the option of receiving the wine from the common cup.

Then, on subsequent Wednesday evenings during Lent, the Lutheran, United Church of Christ, and United Methodist congregations of the Berrysburg and Elizabethville area will again join together for a light supper and worship. The supper, consisting of simple items like soup and sandwiches, will begin at **6:15 P.M.** Following supper, at **7:00 P.M.**, we will join in worship. Worship will end before 8:00 P.M. The host pastor of each congregation will lead the worship, while the pastors will each take turns preaching in a congregation other than their own. Our theme for this year's series will be *A Journey of Forty... Why Lent?* in which we will take a look each week at a different significant forty-day period in the Bible and what each might say about our forty-day (not counting Sundays) journey through the Season of Lent. The details for these Wednesday evenings are as follows:

### A Friendly Reminder...

A reminder in these late winter days, where unpredictable weather can make it very difficult or even just plain unsafe for some in our congregational family to gather here on The Hill for worship, that you can listen to our worship each Sunday morning through a link found on our congregational website. (And, of course, you can access this same audio any time for any reason, including when you just want to hear again something you already heard on a previous Sunday!) To tune in, you will need some kind of electronic device that is able to connect to the internet – or someone handy who has such a device. With that device nearby, simply follow these instructions:

+Go to our congregational website – www. stjohnhillchurch.org.

+When you arrive on our website homepage, scroll about halfway down to the item on the right that says "St. John's Service Recordings" where you will find a green link that says "St. John's YouTube Channel". Clicking this green link will take you to our very own St. John channel on the YouTube website.

+Once there, you simply click on the particular date you are interested in, at which point a new blacked out (remember we have only sound, no video) window will appear and that Sunday's worship audio will begin to play. The first thing you will likely hear is the murmur of our gathering congregational family before the Announcements. And you may need to turn up your sound a bit, depending on your device.

+You can then use the cursor that appears at the bottom of that blacked out window to go forward or backward as needed – or just sit back and listen to the whole thing!

Greetings and many blessings to you all!

Pastor Tom so graciously requested my putting together a synopsis of my educational pursuits thus far, as I am yet again approaching another graduation in the near future! As many of you may know, I graduated from high school back in 2009 with high hopes of pursuing a career in classical music, more specifically, classical violin performance with a concentration in piano performance. After the successful completion of two years of music performance study at the conservatory level, I elected to change career paths. I did this for a multitude of reasons, with my primary reasoning being that the life of a musician did not offer me the kind of stability that I longed for in a career.

Consequently, I transitioned to the major of dietetics and nutritional science, where I completed a four-year academic curriculum with an additional year reserved for the completion of a professional dietetic internship. Seven long years after moving to Cincinnati, I was awarded my Bachelor's of Science Degree in Dietetics in May of 2016, and I later sat for the registration/licensure exam in August of 2016, awarding me with the title of Registered, Licensed Dietitian Nutritionist (RDN, LDN). It was at this point that I decided to move back home to Pennsylvania to pursue a career in healthcare, and I began working for PinnacleHealth Systems as an RDN, providing nutrition education to patients concerning the implementation of health-specific diets, participating in community outreach programs, etc.

Although I found fulfillment in my work as a nutrition educator, I knew that something was still missing in terms of my professional career, and given that I had always had such respect for the nurses I worked alongside during my dietetic internship, I looked into the possibility of going back to school for nursing. At this point, I had essentially deemed myself "too old" to pursue yet another degree, but luckily for me, I was blessed with a great opportunity to complete what would have been a four-year nursing program in 16-months time, an accelerated nursing program only offered to persons already holding a degree in another discipline. I began this arduous, highly intensive educational pursuit in August of 2017, and now today, some 16 months later, I stand on the cusp of my second university graduation, where I will be awarded a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree, with my graduation date and pinning ceremony being set for December 14, 2018.

The second-degree program that I pursued in nursing was probably the hardest thing that I have ever done. Completing what would be a four-year program in sixteen months called for almost constant studying, days without sleep, long clinical hours, not to mention, a severe strain on my relationships with loved ones. Factor in the fact that I held a steady job during the course of the program, working night shift, and one might almost go so far as to label the whole program as slightly maddening! My last semester consisted almost exclusively of clinical time, with my being responsible for the completion of a 360-hour capstone experience, where I was assigned to work in the adult oncology unit over at Hershey Medical Center, an experience that brought to the forefront the fact that I am tremendously blessed and fortunate enough to have been awarded good health. If it hadn't been for the power of prayer and the belief that God could see me through anything, I never would have made it through the program, and I am thankful everyday for having a strong faith base and a family that never failed to support me along the way.

Upon my graduation, I will be working at Lancaster General Hospital, where I have been offered a position in their Emergency Department Observation Unit. This particular unit is a location where patients stay when they require further evaluation of their present condition before either returning home or being admitted to the hospital. It is a fast-paced unit and I am eagerly anticipating my start date in February of 2019 after successfully passing my nursing boards and obtaining state licensure.

Although the road has been long and winding, I could not have asked for a more rewarding career than the one I am about to embark on. The immense satisfaction that accompanies the profession of nursing is one that I treasure, as I am fortunate enough to be awarded the opportunity to share in times of what can prove to be extreme happiness or insurmountable sorrow. Again, I cannot stress how incredibly lucky I am, and I find it no accident that God called me to this profession, knowing well that I can and will make a difference, all while continuing to grow in both wisdom and gratitude.
