

### Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus,

At the end of this month, earlier than is often the case, we come again to our observance of Palm/Passion Sunday and the "Three Days" or "Triduum" – the ancient title for the period that begins on Maundy Thursday evening and ends on Easter Sunday evening. Our schedule of worship and related activities will be as follows:

#### • Sunday of the Passion/Palm Sunday, March 24:

At **9:00am**, we will proceed with our normal in-person Faith Formation activities. At **10:15am**, we will likewise join in our familiar hybrid worship, handing out our beautiful Equal Exchange palms to those present in-person (and having them available for a day or two beforehand for picking up here at the church for those who will be Zoom-ing that morning). Our worship will begin with the Liturgy of the Palms and we will again enjoy Vincent Lamenza's reading of The Passion of Jesus (this year According to St. Mark) as the center point of our worship.

#### Maundy Thursday, March 28:

At 7:00 P.M., we will gather for a hybrid Liturgy of Holy Communion, sharing in the mystery and the meaning of that Upper Room – the body and the blood given for us – the betrayal and desertion of our Lord. Reflecting that betrayal and desertion, our worship will end with the solemn stripping of the altar by members of altar guild as the our choir intones the haunting words of Psalm 22.

#### Good Friday, March 29:

At 7:00 P.M., we will gather for a hybrid Liturgy of Good Friday – a dark and solemn, and yet hopeful, time when we hear again of the extent of Jesus' great love and sacrifice for you and me. Members of Youth Group and Pastor Tom will again lead us in our worship.

#### • Holy Saturday, March 30:

At 9:00 A.M., members of Youth Group will set up for our annual Easter Egg Hunt, with the hunt getting underway at 10:00 A.M. for children in four age groups: preschool, grades K-1, grades 2-3, and grades 4-5. At 7:00 P.M., we will continue our worship downstairs with a Liturgy of Readings and Prayer (which will not be available on Zoom) with the much smaller and quieter and darker setting of our downstairs chapel. This liturgy, a part of the ancient liturgy of Easter Vigil, features a series of lengthy readings from the Old Testament, telling of the creative and saving actions of God, beginning with Genesis 1, that point

the way to the ultimate creative and saving action of Easter. There will be no music and no offering – only my reading by the light of a single candle, silence for meditation, and prayer.

#### • The Resurrection of Our Lord, Easter Day, March 31:

We will once again gather in-person for a brief time of Sunrise Worship at **6:30am** in the field across from the pavilion, next to the sexton house (or under the pavilion roof in case of inclement weather). At **9:00am**, we will again proceed with our normal Faith Formation activities. And at **10:15am**, we will likewise join in our familiar hybrid worship, as we celebrate the Good News that Jesus is Risen!

I will look forward to being in worship with YOU, my sisters and brothers in this wonderful congregational family that is St. John, in this most Holy of times. Please don't hesitate to contact me with any questions or ideas!

## **Lent Worship Opportunities**



Minutes: Motion by Joshua Paul to accept the November 2023 minutes as read. Second by Jeff Lehman.

Motion approved unanimously.

As all offices are unopposed, President Josh Paul called for a vote to approve all nominations. Vote passed unanimously.

#### **Reception of Petitions and Communications:**

- A parishioner questioned whether we are having security cameras installed and offered to donate \$1,000 toward the project. A discussion was held about the potential project. Council members agreed to get quotes for a surveillance system with installation and discuss the cost/benefit next month.
- The upcoming Lower Susquehanna Synod Assembly will be held via Zoom on Friday, May 31 and in person on Saturday, June 1, 2024. We will need one male and one female voting member of the congregation to attend. This year, to encourage the involvement of younger members of the church, one voting youth member from each congregation has been invited to attend for a discounted \$50 registration fee. Council agreed that this is a good opportunity for members of our youth to get involved.
- Tom Dressler, professional organist, is willing to come to St. John's on Thursday, May 9, 2024, to act as guest organist for the Ascension Day shared Ecumenical Assembly. His recital will be woven into the worship service. Motion by Sandra Lamenza to pay \$200 from the Bicentennial Fund to cover the cost of the guest musician. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Craig Peters. Motion approved unanimously.
- Thank you note received from the Weekend Power Pack program at UDAMS.
- St. John's will host the Lenten service on Wednesday, February 28<sup>th</sup>. Pastor Tom will be preaching on Wednesday, March 6<sup>th</sup>. Pastor Tom proposed that the offering collected on February 28<sup>th</sup> go to ELCA Disaster Relief in Gaza. Motion by Sandra Lamenza. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Christie Kahler. Motion approved unanimously.


