Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus,

As you read these lines, we will be just a week or two into the Season of Lent, which has its beginning on Ash Wednesday – this year February 17. That also means that it will very soon be a year (on March 8) since we last joined together in-person as a congregational family as "normal", in faith formation activities for all ages, followed by worship, followed by the final **Breaking Bread** time of wonderful food and fellowship. I don't know about you, but I find that March 8 of last year feels more like almost a lifetime ago than almost a year ago, so much has changed.

That change hasn't been all negative, of course – far from it! In fact, what we and so many of our sister congregations have been pushed to do is figure out new ways to do the very same work of God, many of which will continue to strengthen our ministries even when we do eventually reach the "new normal" – something very in keeping with who our God is, as we see that God in action in our Bibles.

<u>A year ago</u>, as the first wave of the pandemic swept over us, we had just hosted the very first Wednesday community evening of supper and worship, with a large and boisterous crew excited to be together again for those beloved Wednesdays, never realizing that a week later we would be cancelling and that, for the whole rest of Lent, we wouldn't experience live worship of any kind. <u>This year</u>, thanks to a technology called "Zoom", of which I at least had never heard as of this time a year ago, we are gathering and learning and worshiping and meeting and we are again making plans for what a return to in-person worship and other activities will look like for this next stretch until we arrive at something like a "new normal".

<u>A year ago</u>, the arrival of the COVID-19 pandemic had the effect of "blowing Lent out of the water". We were all so surprised and then shocked that there was really almost no chance to react or adapt to our new reality. <u>This year</u>, that is not the case and, in fact, I would like to suggest that the reality of life with the pandemic gives us a rare opportunity to really experience the Season of Lent as never before. During our Ash Wednesday (Zoom) worship, you heard me say the following:

We are created to experience joy in communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with Creation. But our sinful rebellion separates us from God, our neighbors, and Creation, so that we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended.

As disciples of Jesus, we are called to a discipline that contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from love of God and neighbor. I invite you, therefore, to the discipline of Lent – <u>self-examination and repentance</u>, prayer and fasting, sacrificial give, and works of love – strengthened by the gifts of Word and Sacrament.

Think of Lent as a time of pruning -or- housecleaning -or- stripping away an old coating that has accumulated and come to hide the beauty beneath. Think of Lent as a time of just plain getting real – owning up to the fact that we aren't in charge of our lives or world and that, in trying to act as if we are, we have made a real mess of things – from global climate -to- national politics -to- unloving things that are being done and said right here in our local communities.

It turns out there's maybe nothing like a pandemic (at least maybe nothing that you and I have experienced so far in our relatively sheltered lives) to force us to step back from everything we normally use and do to try to keep up the appearance of being in charge – all of the plans, all of the possessions, all of the pretending that life is just going to automatically go on tomorrow the same as today and yesterday. *In other words, for you and me, it turns out that maybe there's nothing like a pandemic to force us to focus on what really matters and to just plain get real. For you and me, it turns out that there's maybe nothing like a pandemic to force us to get straight Who is God and who isn't.*

The Season of Lent will run almost all of the way through this coming month. So, instead of getting down about everything that isn't yet back to "normal" or as we would like it to be, Lent is the perfect opportunity to join with the rest of your congregational family to "lean into" the times – to seize the opportunity – to seize the moment – to be open as maybe you never have been before – to look and ask first where God is leading and pointing YOU... where God is counting on YOU... where God is blessing YOU!
