Looking Ahead

Our 7:00 P.M. worship on Maundy Thursday, April 1; Good Friday, April 2; and Holy Saturday, April 3, will all take place on Zoom only.

The Youth Group will be holding an adapted Easter Egg Hunt on Holy Saturday, April 3. (*Please stay tuned for more details, but it will be possible, as in previous years, to attend our Hunt and still make the Berrysburg Community Easter Egg Hunt at 11:00 A.M.*)

On Easter Sunday, April 4, we will again gather for Sunrise Worship in-person – with masks covering nose and mouth and observing safe spacing – on the field across from the pavilion, next to the sexton house, at 6:30 A.M.

Our spring session of Midweek Bible Study will get underway on **Wednesday, April 14** and will continue through the end of May, wrapping up just before the Memorial Day weekend. We will meet each week from 6:30 to 8:00 P.M., tentatively on the Zoom platform. After spending the year thus far in the New Testament, we will now turn to the Old Testament with a study of the **Book of Jeremiah** and the closely related **Book of Lamentations**. Speaking as he first did more than 600 years before Jesus' birth, in a time when things which had for centuries seemed so rock-solid were tottering and shaking, the Prophet Jeremiah has a lot to say to us in these times in which we are living. (And perhaps more so than with any other biblical prophet, we find a kindred spirit in Jeremiah – someone who is open about his struggle with just how difficult following the call of God can be.) No previous Bible study experience is required – only an interest and enthusiasm to study, reflect on, and (as you are comfortable doing so) discuss God's Word together! So that the correct number of study books can be ordered for our study, please register in advance (by speaking with Pastor Tom) <u>no</u> **Later than next Sunday morning, March 28**.

We are in need of two Voting Members – a man and a woman who must both be voting members of the congregational family, confirmed, contributing, and communing – to join with Pastor Tom in taking part in our Annual Lower Susquehanna Synod Assembly, taking place on Friday evening, June 4, and Saturday, June 5. For the first (and most likely last) time, the Assembly will take place only virtually, probably on the Zoom platform. The only other requirement for those participating is that they will <u>each</u> need to have <u>two</u> Zoom-compatible devices available to them – one with a suitable screen to allow for viewing and hearing everything that is taking place and the other, such as a smart phone, to be used as a dedicated voting device. Since we will all be Zooming from the comfort of our own locations, please take note of the opportunity presented to multi-task (not to mention attend in your jammies!) such as has never been the case before and likely never will be again. To take advantage of less expensive "early bird" registration – paid for by our congregational family – <u>Voting Members are needed by Pastor Tom by Thursday, April 15</u>.
