Our spring session of Midweek Bible Study will get underway on Wednesday, April 19 and run for six weeks, meeting each week from 6:30 to 8:00pm and wrapping up prior to Memorial Day weekend. Prior to April 19, the folks who have signed up will make the decision whether we will meet in a hybrid fashion (in-person with a Zoom option) or via Zoom only – Pastor Tom will be open to doing whatever the group decides. For our spring study, we will be "following the lead" of Book Discussion Group, reading and discussing the acclaimed book Walking the Bible by Bruce Feiler, in which he engages us in his experiences of traveling over and through those lands we commonly refer to as the "Holy Lands", helping us see familiar biblical passages with new perspectives. Depending on how our gatherings run, we may finish with a May 24 Movie Night to take in the film based on the book together, maybe even with popcorn! To take part in this spring study, you do not have to have taken part in Book Discussion Group in March or April – nor will you be "bored" if you did! And, as always with these studies, no previous Bible study experience is required - only an interest and enthusiasm to study, reflect on, and (if and when you are comfortable doing so) discuss God's Word together! So that the correct number of study books can be ordered for our study, please register in advance (by speaking with Pastor Tom) and let him know if you will need a copy of the book by the end of the day on Maundy Thursday, April 6.

Pastor Tom is seeking a male and a female voting member (confirmed congregational family members who have communed and contributed in this or the prior year <u>and who</u> <u>do not have to be spouses</u>) to join him in attending this year's Annual Lower Susquehanna Synod Assembly, with the theme **Created for Community**. The business of the assembly will begin the evening of Friday, June 2 and conclude at the end of the day on Saturday, June 3. The Assembly will be 'hybrid,' with one of the Assembly Business days taking place via Zoom and one taking place in person. All costs for voting members are borne by our congregational family budget, so all that interested folks need to be able to contribute is their time. **Please speak with Pastor Tom ASAP to learn more; early discounted registration ends on March 31.**
