This month, I wanted to highlight three things that you will find included later in this May edition of the *St. John's Epistle*.

The first concerns our upcoming Annual Strawberry Festival, which is scheduled for Wednesday, June 13. The seminarians and their families (many are married with families) really appreciate receiving gift cards from **Giant and Weis markets**.

In addition to gift cards, we are requesting the following types of tangible, nonperishable

food items and paper products and other staples. Note the following staple food items suggestions:


Cereal (hot and cold) canned vegetables, macaroni, granola bars, sugar, flour, peanut butter,

spaghetti sauce, baking mixes, paper products, soap, shampoo/conditioner, toothpaste

Approximately **40 seminary** households utilize the food pantry on a regular basis. Household sizes range from single individuals to families with children. There are no requirements to use the pantry, and we do not collect detailed financial information from households who use the pantry.

Seminary education is a significant financial investment. Most individuals and families rely on scholarships, grants, and loans to cover both educational and living expenses during their time at LTSG. For many, it is difficult to make ends meet. The LTSG Food Pantry ministry helps to ease this burden by providing essential items for individuals and families.

#### Bethesda Mobile Mission:

Almost always the news in the newspaper or TV is about the bad things going on in the world – crime, wars, fighting oversees, disease, famine, the bad economy, lack of jobs, etc. We all know there are good things happening as well, but the media doesn't usually report on those things. My daughter, Shannon, had an opportunity to do something "good" and I'm very proud of her (and Moms are good at bragging about their kids, right!). Every few months, Shannon goes with a Youth Group from Lykens to help with the Bethesda Mobile Mission. The Mobile Mission is staffed by church volunteers and are literally "Good Samaritans" to Harrisburg's homeless people. Every Friday and Saturday evening between 9:00 pm and 12:00 am, the Mobile Mission van delivers blankets, sleeping bags/mats, warm clothing, food, hot coffee, and personal hygiene items to the homeless. When Shannon returned home last Friday night, she shared her personal thoughts on the people she met.

Carl is the van driver for the Mobile Mission since 1996. Carl knows where the homeless are located and where to meet them. He also knows where it is safe to go. The first stop was the M & T Bank, where there were about 40 people. Here we passed out sandwiches, coffee, clothing, socks, sleeping mats, etc. A lady (not with our group from Bethesda Mission) showed up with a big container of spaghetti. She asked us to help pass out bowls of spaghetti so they would have a "warm meal". Then the lady went around and talked to the people and ministered to them. It seemed like she does this on a regular basis. Our next stops were: behind the ROC building, Metro Bank, Train Station, Occupy Harrisburg at the Capitol, and somewhere under a bridge. Carl knows where to find the people in need. One man asked Carl for a new pair of gloves. We searched all the boxes and could only find one glove - not a pair. Carl made a note to get a pair of gloves and bring them to the man on Saturday night. Next we went down an alley to find a little old lady who lives there for as long as anyone can remember. We also met a mother with a new baby girl. They told the mother she should go to stay at Bethesda's Womens Shelter. I hope she does. There is a man named "Arthur" who lives in his RV with a dog named "Pure Religion". Another man is named "Spider" who is homeless for a long, long time. "Arthur" told us about a newly homeless woman named "Rosie". She lives in her car which is parked near Burger King. Her car is broken-down and they will probably ask her to leave. First, she lost her job then her house.

Everyone is very appreciative and thankful of the things we bring. They have nothing and yet they look out for each other. They tell Carl if they know of someone who is "newly homeless". Donations are always appreciated. Bethesda Mission's website has a list of items needed at

Yes, there are still good people doing "God's work" in the world. Please keep Bethesda Mobile Mission, Carl, and all the volunteers in your prayers.
