

Dear Friends in Jesus,

Because of some changes in our Sunday morning schedule at the end of this month that have the potential to be a bit confusing, I want to take this space this month to attempt to avoid as much of that confusion as possible!

The biggest change is that, after several years of being well received during the months of July and August, Congregational Council has decided that, this year, we will expand our Sunday morning summer schedule to the entire period between Memorial Day weekend and Labor Day weekend. Therefore, beginning with the Sunday of Memorial Day weekend, May 24, and running through the Sunday of Labor Day weekend, September 6, we will be in full "summer mode": We will gather for Sunday School at 8:45 A.M., going straight into the lesson of the morning (and skipping the opening time in which we join the rest of the year). These classes will end at 9:15 A.M., with worship beginning at 9:30 A.M. As before, I will do my best to make sure that worship ends promptly by 10:30 A.M., for those who must travel to summer family gatherings or work responsibilities.

The other change to note begins with the fact that you might well show up for worship at 9:30 A.M. on May 24 expecting that we will be gathering outside in the pavilion, as we typically would be on the holiday weekend. But, because the Day of Pentecost falls on May 24 this year (which means that we celebrate the Rite of Confirmation that day as well - see the separate article later in this Epistle), we will instead be inside for worship on the 24th, where we can better enjoy both the faith milestone of Confirmation and the beautiful red geraniums of Pentecost, and then we will be outside for our first time this summer the following Sunday, May 31 (when we will celebrate the Festival of the Holy Trinity with Holy Communion).

So, to summarize, here is what's coming up the final two Sundays of May:


