Dear Friends in Jesus,

Congregational Council and I regularly strive to be the best stewards possible of the financial resources you entrust to God for use in this ministry that we share. To this end, we have had some discussions recently about our annual expenditure of just over \$1,000 for the *Lutheran* "Every Home Plan", under which we have attempted to include every "active area household" in this group subscription at \$8.95 each. For as long as I have been a pastor, the congregations that I have served have done just that, and I have always believed, and continue to believe, that the *Lutheran* (now rebranded and restyled as *Living Lutheran* as of the April issue) has great value. But I also know that we all are deluged with good and valuable things to read, increasingly including digital content, and so I have no wish to use your ministry dollars to provide a print resource that does not end up being of use to the recipient(s). So, at Council's request, on **Sunday**, **May 15** (the **Day of Pentecost**), I will take a couple of minutes during the announcements to seek your input about where we go with our *Living Lutheran* subscription plan.

Fortunately, I have discovered in my research that we are not limited in our choices to <u>all</u> (what we are currently doing) or <u>nothing</u> (pulling the plug entirely and leaving those folks who still want to receive *Living Lutheran* to subscribe on their own at a much higher \$19.95 per year). We have two other "half way" choices:

±The "Every Home Plan" has actually now been modified so that it only requires a number of subscriptions equal to ½ of a congregation's average worship attendance (103 for us in 2015), meaning we would have to have at least 52 subscriptions which, at \$8.95 each, would shave our cost down to around \$465 – a lot less than \$1,000!

±There is also an option called the "Leadership Plan" which requires us to have at least 20 subscriptions but at a somewhat higher rate of \$11.75 each, which would come out to roughly \$235 per year.

So here is what I would like to do on May 15... In the announcements that morning, I will quickly remind everyone of what our four options are and then, using a tear-off piece that will be included in each bulletin, I will ask each member household who would like to continue to receive *Living Lutheran* by way of one of the much less expensive group plans to indicate this by checking the box and putting their name on the tear-off and returning it to me. I will then tabulate the results and report to Council at their meeting that afternoon. If we have 52 or more expressions of interest (don't forget – we need your name in order for it to count!!), I will recommend to Council that we go with the new "Every Home Plan", including only those interested households. If we have 20 to 51 expressions of interest, I will recommend that we go with the "Leadership Plan", once again including only those interested households. If we have 19 or fewer expressions of interest, I will recommend that everyone simply be on their own to subscribe for the \$19.95 per year (but we would then get at least 1 subscription for the church library which would be available for borrowing).

A couple of details in conclusion: 1) We will publicize the results, whatever they end up being. 2) There will be space on the tear-off for comments, which you are welcome to make, but if you do not wish to receive a subscription, the simplest thing will be to just ignore the tear-off and you will not be included. 3) If you are a member household who will not be present on May 15, please simply call or email me beforehand if you would like to be included in a group plan. 4) If we do end up going with some kind of group plan, I will have special envelopes available by which I would encourage the subscription recipients to consider supporting the cost of that subscription (either \$8.95 or \$11.75 per year – still much less than \$19.95). 5) There is ABSOLUTELY NO SHAME and you will not hurt my feelings (nor God's feelings, I'm pretty sure, based on my reading of the Bible), no matter what you decide – just be prayerfully honest! Thanks for reading and for your help, my congregational family!

I will also be posting the songs we do each week in the J.A.M. session for kids who want to continue listening and learning them for the weeks to come. The songs we are starting out with are: Build your Kingdom here, Here I am to Worship, and How great is our God.

I once again want to take the time to thank each congregation member for your continued support in this ministry. There are many good things happening in the heart of the church, and I ask for your continued prayers for not just myself, but the kids, parents, and anyone closely impacted by this ministry.


