From the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus.

As I write these lines, the birds are singing outside my office window, and they and all of God's Good Creation are making clear that the new life and new growth of spring are underway, which means that summer cannot be far behind! With that in mind, a few "thinking summer" items for you this month...

First, while the astronomers and meteorologists might not agree, for us here at the Hill Church, summer definitely gets underway on Sunday, May 28. That will be the morning that we once again switch to our **summer schedule** of 1. **Sunday School for Grades 7-12 and for Adults at 8:45 A.M.**, with no opening, so that we simply join in the regular half-hour study session, ending by about 9:15, 2. **Worship at 9:30 A.M.**, ending promptly by 10:30 so that everyone can get on to those reunions and other summer Sunday plans (this will also be the morning that we move out to the pavilion for the first of our outside summer worship opportunities in the beauty of our pavilion and grove), and 3. **SONDay Celebration (Sunday School for Grades 6 and younger) with Miss Laurie also at 9:30 A.M.** (please note that holding SONDay Celebration during worship will happen only while we are on our summer schedule, through Labor Day weekend, and not be a permanent thing).

Second, as you hopefully know by now, this year's Annual Strawberry Festival will take place on Wednesday, June 14, in our grove and pavilion. This edition of the **St. John's Epistle** contains the updated committee listing for all of the different tasks that need to be done in order for the day to be a success. Please be sure to remove the listing and keep it handy (maybe on the refrigerator?), and please be sure to check with your committee chairperson, the overall chairpersons, or with me if you have any questions or concerns about your scheduled work. **Please also make note of two other important Strawberry Festival-related dates during the month of May: 1. The next planning meeting has been scheduled for <u>Tuesday, May 2</u>, beginning at <u>6:15 P.M.</u> and 2. The first pavilion cleaning and preparation night, which will also serve as our spring outside worknight on the church property in general, has been set for <u>Tuesday, May 30</u>, beginning at <u>5:30 P.M.</u> (You might remember that, two years ago, it worked really well to combine the two worknights instead of trying to schedule two separate days and times, but this again means that we will need lots of "hands" to pull off this busy evening of projects.)**

Finally, as I have shared with you previously, our congregational family will be taking part in the Area-Wide Elizabethville Bicentennial Worship on Sunday, August 13, at 10:30 A.M. What you probably haven't previously heard is that that worship is now being planned for indoors at the Upper Dauphin Area High School instead of outdoors on the athletic field. (While the thought of being outdoors together on a beautiful August morning appealed to all of us involved in the planning, the risk of inclement weather and concerns about acoustics made this the right decision.) Also, I wanted to let you know that there will be musical opportunities that day for all interested members of our congregational family! Miss Laurie will be coordinating an area-wide young person's choir to sing during the worship and during the musical program time following the picnic lunch, while Carol Hubler and Judy Ferree are planning that both "Senior Choir" and "Men's Choir" will sing during the musical program time. (I purposely put those group names in quotation marks because it is our hope that, while the "regulars" will make up the core group of each, we will get lots of other interested voices to join in this once-in-a-lifetime day.) Please watch for further details about special rehearsals some time after our Strawberry Festival!

ASCENSION DAY TO BE CELEBRATED

On Thursday evening, May 25, we will gather at 7:00 P.M. for a Liturgy of Holy Communion, in observance of The Ascension of Our Lord.
