## A Letter from The Pastor.....

Dear Friends in Jesus,

responsible ways.

As I write these lines in early April, we have just had another well-received Sunday morning after-worship fellowship time with the opportunity to sample and purchase "Fair Trade" coffee, tea, and chocolate. As I was sharing in the preworship announcements, what makes these products different from similar products you purchase at the grocery store is that the organization from whom we and more than 7,000 other churches get these items, *Equal Exchange*, provides a fair return to the small farmers who actually do the growing, allowing them to stay on their land and grow their crops in environmentally-

Recently, Larry Gessner, whose work with this ministry goes all the way back to our beginning in 1999, set out to try to figure out how much support St. John has provided to these family farmers over the years. He was fortunate to connect with Susan Sklar, a former Pennsylvanian now working with Equal Exchange in Massachusetts, who provided as many answers as her records, which no longer go all the way back to 1999 and which primarily cover coffee purchases, would allow. Based on Susan's figures and Larry's efforts to fill in the gaps, a best estimate is that together we have purchased over \$19,000 in "Fair Trade" products over the years, about \$16,000 in coffee itself. From this \$16,000 in coffee purchases, a best estimate is that the growers themselves have received about \$5,000, making us a small but important part of annual payments to grower cooperatives that total around \$17 million.

Note that similar figures are not readily available for the approximately \$3,000 we have purchased in tea, chocolate, and syrups over the years and so they are not included in this estimate, which means that we have done even more to benefit the economies and the ecologies of producer regions.) Thank you! And thank you to Larry and to Ann our coordinators!

Also, as you hopefully recall, this year's Annual Strawberry Festival will take place on Wednesday, June 13, in our grove and pavilion. This edition of the *St. John's Epistle* contains the updated committee listing for all of the different tasks that need to be done in order for the day to be a success. Please be sure to remove the listing and keep it handy (maybe on the refrigerator?), and please be sure to check with your committee chairperson, the overall chairpersons, or with me if you have any questions or concerns about your scheduled work.

Please also make note of two other important Strawberry Festival-related dates coming up this month: 1. The **next planning meeting** has been scheduled for <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>April 30</u>, beginning at <u>6:30 P.M.</u> and 2. The **first pavilion cleaning and preparation night**, <u>which will also serve as our spring outside work night on the church property in general</u>, has been set for <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>May 29</u>, beginning at <u>5:30 P.M.</u> (You might remember that, in the past few years, we have had good results combining two work nights into one instead of trying to schedule two separate days and times, but this again means that we will again need lots of "hands" to pull off this busy evening of projects.)

## News from Miss Laurie




## Youth Group News
