Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus,

In what amounts to a continuation of my letter on this page last month, this month I would like to report on some plans for our congregational family worship life during May. ***But first, I want to thank everyone who has been joining in Sunday worship via Zoom for hanging in there with me/us!*** We certainly had a rough start during March, thankfully with some improvement in time for Palm/Passion Sunday. But it was only when we acquired a particularly-capable (and pricey) microphone that things finally got at least close to where we want them to be for the long haul – thankfully in time for our celebration of the Resurrection of Our Lord/Easter Day. There will still be much tweaking ahead because, like so many things in this unique time, it is an ongoing journey!

After missing a year in 2020, I am delighted first to share that we will once again be gathering for worship on the evening of the Ascension of Our Lord, Thursday, May 13, at 7:00. Please note that it will take place on Zoom only and so our annual Blessing of Seed & Soil for instance will accordingly be adapted. We will use the same Zoom contact information as on Sunday mornings, but I will send a reminder email about that as we get closer.

Ten days later, on the 50th Day of Easter, Sunday, May 23, we will observe the Day of Pentecost, the third of the three great annual Christian festival days (along with Christmas Day and Easter Day) and the day when we traditionally have celebrated the confirmation of our young adult members. With things almost certainly still not sufficiently close to our “new normal” to allow us to set aside such things as masks and safely distanced seating by May 23, I have consulted with the families of our confirmands and we have agreed that we will instead plan to celebrate this faith milestone on All Saints Sunday, November 7, also a very fitting day when we, along with the rest of the Church, celebrate what amounts to a “congregational family reunion”, including those seemingly separated from us by distance and even death. This year, we will look forward to including in that celebration the young men who would have been last year's confirmands – **Gabe Gehring, Aidan Roadcap, and Hoyt Schlegel.**

Moving to the end of the month, on the Sunday of Memorial Day weekend (and Memorial Day itself), May 30, it will once again be time for us to switch to our summer schedule of 1. **Sunday Morning Bible Study for Adults at 8:45 A.M. still only on Zoom at least to start with**, ending by about 9:15, 2. **Worship (available both in-person and on Zoom) at 9:30 A.M.**, ending promptly by 10:30 so that everyone can get on to those reunions and other summer Sunday plans, and 3. **SONDay Celebration for our younger persons with Miss Laurie, (in-person at the church with a Zoom option) also at 9:30 A.M.**

And finally, May 30 will also be the morning that we move out to the pavilion for the first of our planned outside summer worship opportunities. With our wifi connection for Zoom-ing coming through a mobile hotspot, the plan is that our outdoor worship will be just as available on Zoom as our indoor worship (although we will obviously have some different things to check out and tweak to make that transition). I hope this will be a great help to folks who find outside worship in general not to their liking and to anyone who, on a particular Sunday morning, finds that it will be just too breezy and/or cool to join in outdoor worship!

Thank you all for your partnership, your patience, and your forgiveness as we all continue as a congregational family on this journey that is living into the “new normal”!

Pavilion Use

As our world continues to “open up”, Pastor Tom is getting more requests from folks who are not members on the rolls of the St. John congregational family about “renting” our pavilion, and so it seems like it might be a good time for all of us to be reminded about how the pavilion can be used for things other than official congregational family functions. In 1983, soon after the original part of the pavilion was constructed, a policy was adopted by the Congregational Council which says **“the use of the Grove and Pavilion shall be restricted to the members of the congregation of Saint John’s Evangelical Lutheran Church”**. It then goes on to clarify that this means that at least one member on the rolls must be a member of the group using the facilities, that this person must be present during the event, and that they will be the person taking responsibility for making sure that nothing about the event violates the other guidelines – for instance about no alcohol on the premises and taking away their own trash. Annual family reunions, for instance, can continue to use the pavilion only so long as there continues to be that responsible “official” congregational family member identified and present, which there has been/is in each case. While there is no rental charge, donations are welcome and virtually always given by folks using the pavilion in this way. Please don’t hesitate to contact Pastor Tom (or any Council members) with any questions about this policy.

Tithes and Offerings

If you are not yet ready to take part in in-person worship, there are **three** very simple options for giving your tithes and offerings. You are welcome to 1. mail your offering to the church (PO Box 270, Berrysburg, 17005-0270) or 2. drop it by the church and place it in the red plastic tub that is prominently visible in the Sunday School Room, on the table just outside Pastor Tom’s office door. ***In addition, 3. if neither of those is easily done, you may wish to contact your bank about setting up an automatic payment, as some of our congregational family members also have done, whereby the offering you direct is sent by your bank as a check mailed directly to the church.*** In all cases, Pastor Tom will then see that all offerings received get securely passed along to our counters.

Rose Kell graduated from Misericordia University with a Master of Science in Occupational Therapy in October 2020. She was working full time at Penn State Hershey Medical Center Rehabilitation while going to school full time for the first two and a half years. March 14, 2021

The council meeting was called to order by President, Roy Henry. Pastor Tom opened the meeting with devotions and a prayer.

Minutes: Motion by Ron Erb and seconded by Lori Motter to accept the February minutes. Motion approved unanimously.

Reception of Petitions and Communications:

Water testing inspection was passed for February.

A motion was made by Sandra Lamenza and seconded by Ron Erb to make Gift of Love contribution of \$300 to the family of Alex Rodriguez, an Upper Dauphin student who is suffering a serious illness, and a \$500 contribution to the Lutheran Camping Corporation. Motion approved unanimously.

A motion was made by Sandra Lamenza and seconded by Matt Williard to approve a request from Amy Gehring to use the pavilion on April 10 for Gabe's birthday. Motion approved unanimously.

A motion was made by Sandra Lamenza and seconded by Heidi Lehman to approve a request made by Ann Bruner for the Friends of the Elizabethtown Library to use the pavilion for their annual book sale on July 15, 16, and 17. Motion approved unanimously.

The use of the pavilion for the annual family reunions was discussed. It was agreed upon that the use of the pavilion would be honored as it was in previous years. There is a sign-up sheet in the church lobby. All previous rules still apply.

Pastor's Report: In addition to Pastor's written report, he added that he was asked to provide the leadership for the Upper Dauphin Baccalaureate Service for the 2021 graduating class. He has accepted. Motion made by Matt Williard and seconded by Ira Antes to accept the pastor's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Children and Youth Ministry Report: Motion was made by Ron Erb and seconded by Matt Williard to accept Miss Laurie's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Motion made by Ron Erb and seconded by Michael Henninger to accept the treasurer's report. Motion approved unanimously.
