

Dear Friends in Jesus,

You might say that my theme for this letter this month is "important discussions accompanied by food"! On All Saints Sunday, November 4, following worship, we will gather downstairs for what has become our annual chicken and waffles dinner, with all the trimmings, served by Youth Group. Lots of great food will be the order of the day, and a freewill offering will be received. As our eating concludes, we will spend a bit of time talking together about the "state of the parish" as we come down to the end of another Church Year and another calendar year. I will have some things to share, but please bring your ideas and your questions about any aspect of our life as a congregational family.

On Wednesday, November 14, it is a discussion about our life together as the Lower Susquehanna Synod that will be hosted here at St. John. As you may have already heard, our Lower Susquehanna Synod has embarked on what is being called a "Year of Reformation", leading up to the election of a new bishop – Bishop Hoover having already shared the news that he does not feel called to stand for reelection to a new term as bishop – at the Annual Assembly, to be held June 6-8 next year. As a part of this year-long journey, "listening posts" are being held at 14 locations around our synod, including this one at St. John, which will take place from 7:00 to 8:30 P.M. Synod leaders will be present to hear your thoughts and prayers about three core questions that are guiding the "Year of Reformation": 1. What should synod be about? 2. How can we claim a Lutheran identity in a changing world? 3. What is God calling all of us to be and do in the future as church together? What about the food, you ask? Well, it won't be anywhere near as elaborate as what we will be sharing on November 4, but the Women of St. John will be providing tasty snacks for the 60 or so people who, it is hoped, might attend.

I hope that you will be able to add these two gatherings to your November calendar – important times of conversation and sharing for these challenging times in which we live and serve!

OUR FAITH ACTIVE IN OUR FINANCIAL GIVING - AS OF SEPTEMBER 30

In recent years, Congregational Council has asked that we all periodically receive an update in the *Epistle* about how we are doing in meeting our ministry commitments adopted in our annual budget.

First, our Current Fund... (The Current Fund is the fund from which most day-to-day bills get paid, much like your home's checking account.) With a little more than ¾ of the year now gone as of September 30, to be right on **budget**, we would have received and spent \$97,943 out of our total 2012 budget of \$127,326. We have actually received \$97,858 in offerings and other income, placing us just \$85 under budget. Our expenses as of the end of September total \$96,367 and are \$1,576 under budget. Since we have taken in more than we have spent, we are running a surplus of \$1,491 as of September 30 – as was the case last year at this same time.

As to our benevolence offerings which we share with our Lower Susquehanna Synod and our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, to be exactly on **budget** as of September 30, we would have received and forwarded \$9,231 out of our total 2012 commitment of \$12,000. As of September 30, we have **actually** received and shared a total of \$12,627, meaning that we are **ahead** of our commitment by \$3,396.

Thank you for your partnership in the ministry of St. John, and for your financial stewardship, as we have now moved past the ¾ point in the year. Please watch for future updates every few months, and please feel free at any time to ask questions of or share ideas with Pastor Tom or any member of Council!

Motion by Craig Peters, 2nd by Karen Gehring to accept the July Council minutes. Motion passed unanimously.

Reception of Petitions and Communications: Copy of the place mat advertisement from the Hut for a six month period for \$145.00 was presented.

Pastor Tom presented a letter of resignation from Pastor Jan Mills, Klingerstown Parish. They will have an interim Pastor commuting from Lebanon.

The candidate for the Simeon Lutheran Church, Gratz was not agreed upon, Pastor Kathy Kuehl is covering.

St. John's was asked to host a Town Hall meeting by the conference Wednesday November 14th from 7:00pm until 8:30pm. Attending will be representatives from the synod council, Bishop Hoover's office, 5-6 presenters, and approximately 50-75 people, with the refreshments provided by the Women's group.

VFW post on the Speck Town Road is looking for names of families who may be in need. They decided instead of Holiday hams for needy families, they will be giving a \$25.00 gift card to Boyer's. There will be 10 of them, and they will be accepting applications until the end of October, with the gift cards expiring by the end of November.

Tree of Life Lutheran Church, Sudanese group is in need of support for members to attend Gettysburg Seminary. They are seeking a Mission Partner and will be grateful for any support the parish is willing to provide. It was discussed using the Local benevolence fund to donate a gift of love to be discussed at the next meeting.

Frontier supplies the church internet and landlines, with the 2 year plan ending a three year plan was available at a similar rate (minimal increase). The elevator line would increase a few dollars, although it is comparable to the previous bill.

Collection for a donation ALS Walk, although no team will be marching Sandy's Angles will still continue. Money can be sent to Steve in Sandy's memory. It was

discussed using the Bicentenial fund and individual donations. A note will be in the newsletter and bulletin.
