

Dear Friends in Jesus.

In this month where we especially think of giving thanks for our food and the bounties of God's Good Earth, I wanted to take some time to "talk food" with you!

For some time now, our congregation has been taking part in the ecumenical "Free Community Dinner" ministry, whereby, as its name suggests, a time of food, fellowship and devotions is shared with those in need once each month — usually on the fourth Thursday. For ease of access, this meal is always an "in town" event, taking place at either Salem United Church of Christ or Trinity United Methodist on Main Street in Elizabethville. Since we can't host one of these meals, we have been actively involved from the beginning in providing financial support, as well as some great cooking and serving by Fay Nichols and Randy Challenger. (If you would like to find out about how you can help with these meals, please speak with Fay or me.)

Now, there is a new ecumenical ministry, called the *Weekend Snack Pack Program*, which will soon be providing food support each weekend for children in the Upper Dauphin Area Elementary School who depend on free or reduced price school lunches as a major source of nutrition during the school week, and who are at risk of hunger on days when school is not in session.

Very tentative projections show that there may be as many as 80 children in need in this way, but the final number of children being served will depend on how many parents/guardians give their approval for their student(s) to participate and receive food.

Working through the Central Pennsylvania Food Bank to purchase food items, it appears that the annual cost per sponsored child will be less than \$100 - again only an estimate which is very tentative.

Space at the elementary school outside Loyalton for storage and preparation of the food for distribution has been approved by school administrators, so this will greatly simplify the delivery and disbursement of the food.

As a result of decisions made at the organizing meeting held on October 1, I am very pleased to report that our congregational family is well represented in the leadership of this ministry. Barb Bullock, who originally heard God's call to explore the need for this ministry, was elected Chairperson of the Steering Committee. Sandra Shade, with her extensive financial experience, was elected Treasurer and will be administering a dedicated account that has been established under the financial auspices of our congregation. Pat Herb will serve as a member of the Steering Committee – in particular as a liaison with the Central PA Food Bank. At least seven local christian congregations are represented on the Steering Committee and the larger Planning Group. This Planning Group, by the way, will meet again on Monday, October 27, at 6:30 P.M. in the Upper Dauphin Area Elementary School library. If you are reading these lines prior to this day and time, please know that you are welcome to come and give input at this gathering!

Going forward, volunteers to handle the food and financial support will be the principal needs of the *Weekend Snack Pack Program*. Please "stay tuned" for opportunities to serve, and please remember in your prayers those children in need who will served, as well as those whom God will be calling on to do the serving!

BRING YOUR APPETITES AND YOUR IDEAS!

Following what has become an annual tradition, on All Saints Sunday, November 2, following worship, we will gather downstairs for a chicken and waffles dinner, with all the trimmings, served by Youth Group. Lots of great food will be the order of the day, and a freewill offering will be received. As our eating concludes, we will spend a bit of time talking together about the "state of the parish" as we approach the end of another Church Year and another calendar year. Pastor Tom and the members of the three Prayerful Planning Group ministry teams will have some things to share, but please bring your ideas and your questions about any aspect of our life as a congregational family!

"FIGHT FOR BRIAN" CAMPAIGN TO SOON WRAP UP

Fight for Brian wristbands are still available for \$1 each in the Sunday School Room (and in several other locations in our local community). As you hopefully recall, the goal of this project, created and organized by Marlee Mattern, is to raise a total of \$1,500 from the sale of 1,000 wristbands and other donations above and beyond the \$1 per band. (As these lines are written in mid-October, we are rapidly closing in on this goal, and will shortly begin wrapping up the campaign.) A 1/3 match has been made available to us by the Dauphin County Chapter of Thrivent Financial, which will result in \$500 additional if we can raise the \$1,500. At the request of Brian and Jodi, half of the money raised - hopefully \$750 - will be given to leukemia research (from which Brian has benefited so much), while the remaining half, plus the matching funds, will be given to the Thompson's. Since the money raised will be routed through our Local Benevolence Fund, please make checks payable to "St. John Lutheran Church" and note on your check "Fight for Brian". When you stop by the Sunday School Room, you will find an informative display, created by Marlee, that includes information on becoming a bone marrow donor (much simpler than you would imagine!). OUR FAITH ACTIVE IN OUR FINANCIAL GIVING - AS OF SEPTEMBER 30

In recent years, Congregational Council has asked that we all periodically receive an update in the *Epistle* about how we are doing in meeting our ministry commitments adopted in our annual budget.

Regarding our Current Fund... (The Current Fund is the fund from which most day-to-day bills get paid, much like your home's checking account.) With three quarters of the year's Sundays behind us as of September 30, to be right on **budget**, we would have received and spent ¾ of our total 2014 budget of \$133,608, or \$100,206. We have actually received \$91,766 in offerings and other income, leaving us about \$8,400 behind our budget goal. (After a January and February that saw some of our worst results ever, due to wintry weather and sickness, you may recall that we had improved quite a bit with our offerings by June 30. Then, in July, August, and September, we saw a backsliding in our giving, taking us back closer to where we were at the end of the winter.) Our expenses as of the end of September total \$97,611 and are about \$2,600 under budget – pretty typical for September 30. The bottom line is that, since we have spent more than we have taken in, we are running a deficit of about \$5,800 as of September 30. (Please note that this does not in any way mean that we are about to run out of money. We are fortunate and blessed to have the interest from our Memorials Fund to fall back on when such shortfalls occur. But please consider what our giving says about our joy and gratitude to God for first giving us all that we are and have – we can do better!)

As to our benevolence offerings which we share with our Lower Susquehanna Synod and our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, to be exactly on **budget** as of September 30, we would have received and forwarded \$9,000 or 3/4 of our total 2014 commitment of \$12,000. As of September 30, we have actually received and shared a total of \$9,837, meaning that we are ahead of our commitment by \$837.

Thank you for your partnership in the ministry of St. John, and for your financial stewardship. Please watch for future updates every few months, and please feel free at any time to ask questions of or share ideas with Pastor Tom or any member of Council!


