


## St. Johns Epistle

Dear Friends in Jesus,

As we get into that time of year when a sweater or a blanket can be a really nice and comfortable/comforting thing, it seems a good time to mention our prayer shawl ministry. As you hopefully recall, prayer shawls were introduced to our congregational family a few years ago now, under the auspices of our St. John Women of the ELCA. The concept is that, as someone of any age or gender who is going through a difficult time in their life and faith journey (for whatever reason at all) is given a blessed prayer shawl, the soft warmth of the fabric surrounding them is a great embodiment and reminder of the love and grace of God which is also surrounding them. I have seen folks drape them around their shoulders as a shawl is often worn, use them as a blanket for their lap, place them over a particular body part that is giving them problems – the possibilities are as numerous as are the recipients.

We are very fortunate to have a number of people who, under the guidance of Barb Bullock, knit or crochet these beautiful pieces and bring them to the church. Then, every so often, we display a new "batch" in worship and join together to ask God's blessing on those shawls and, through them, on those persons who will receive them. The intention of the ministry is that each person receive just one shawl "for life", to be used in whatever time(s) of brokenness they are facing or will ever face. (But with that said, every now and then prayer shawls can be lost – as when someone is discharged from the hospital and the folks gathering their things miss including the shawl – and there is absolutely nothing wrong with contacting me for a replacement.) Now that enough time has passed so that a great many members of our congregational family have already received blessed prayer shawls, we want to make sure that even more folks who are known to be hurting in body, mind, or spirit have the same opportunity. To this end, anyone from our congregational family can arrange to pick up and deliver a blessed shawl to a person known to them in any way who is struggling in any way.

Please don't hesitate to see me to learn more about prayer shawls in general, to learn more about our prayer shawl ministry, or to pick up a blessed shawl!

### Please Help!

As we near the end of the year, please be sure that, if you are a communing member of St. John, you have turned in at least one communion record card this year. If during the year you have been living and worshiping out of the area, or if you have communed even once at another congregation, please be sure to have that congregation send notice to Pastor Tom. If you are a contributing member of the congregation, please be sure that you have used your offering envelopes at least once this year, so that you are on record as having made a contribution. Please do your part to make sure that our parish records are as accurate as possible!

<u>And</u>, as another heating season gets underway, please do your part to help your congregational family be a good steward of heating oil and heating dollars. First, please be sure to keep doors closed between different heating zones – especially 1. all doors on the second floor going into the nave or up to the balcony and 2. all doors on the first floor going into the Sunday School room. Second, if you turn up a thermostat for any reason, please be sure to turn it back down again when you leave. All areas of the church other than our nave – which is automatically kept at 55 degrees – are normally kept at 60 degrees. Thank you!
