

Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus,

I'm going to use this space this month to highlight a few scheduling items relating to the month of November.

First, there is the matter of an upcoming time change. For a good many years now, we have all made the jump back from Daylight Saving Time to Standard Time in early November, but this year it comes up really quickly – at 2:00am on All Saints Day, **November 1**. So, different from any recent year I can recall, this year be sure to set your clocks back before you turn in on the last night of **October**, Reformation (and Halloween) Day, October 31!

Just a couple of days after that, there is also the matter of an upcoming election. I'm guessing there are few, if any, of us who don't already have that November 3 date seared into our brains. I'm also guessing that you, like I, are growing weary of the many voices telling us how we ought to cast our ballots, including those voices claiming to have the "one faithful" way to vote. So it is worth remembering that (often to the great chagrin and frustration of the People of God then and now), the Bible makes clear that God grades leaders (and the citizens who support them) not based on who promises the lowest taxes -or- who plans the strongest military-or- who engages in the most God-talk, but rather on who does the best job of taking care of those folks who find themselves at the very bottom of the societal "ladder" – in biblical times, widows, orphans, and "resident aliens" (yes, immigrants) – the most vulnerable in our midst. What might that God-view mean for our casting of our votes? PLEASE BE SURE TO DO YOUR DUTY AS A CHRISTIAN AS WELL AS YOUR DUTY AS A CITIZEN OF OUR GREAT NATION, THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, AND (IF YOU HAVEN'T ALREADY SUBMITTED YOUR MAIL-IN OR ABSENTEE BALLOT) **VOTE** on November 3!!

Moving to later in the month, you might note that, missing from the monthly calendar later in this St. John's Epistle is our traditional Thanksgiving Eve Community Worship, shared with our neighbors of the Lykens Valley UCC Charge. In this pandemic year, it would have been a prudent decision to not hold this worship in any case, but our Congregational Council, with the recommendation of Worship & Music Committee has also made the decision that we will no longer hold this worship in 2021 and beyond. With Pastor Jeff Wagner's retirement from Peace and St. Peter's congregations, and with his and my having come up "empty" in trying to interest other neighboring congregations in joining with us in this worship opportunity, it

is a good time to put this steadily-shrinking (but still beloved by me and the rest of the hardy crew who made it a priority) event to a well-deserved rest.

Finally, on the last Sunday of the month, **November 29** – also earlier than is many times the case – a brand new Christian Year will begin with the **First Sunday of Advent**. As per our congregational family tradition, at sundown that day we will light our steeple stars. It is also Congregational Council's and my hope that November 29 will mark our return to our familiar Sunday morning schedule of 9:00 Faith Formation Time and 10:15 Worship. Between now and then, we need to assembly the necessary "people power" (see the separate article in this newsletter about the *Video Ministry Team*) and "Wi-Fi power" to enable all interested folks to "Zoom into" in-person worship here at the church, instead of having a separate time of Zoom worship as presently. As with so many things these days, all of this is subject to change, depending, for instance, on what happens between now and then with regard to the virus, so please stay tuned!

Advent is the blue season, the Season of Hope, and ours is a Hope that nothing and no one can ever take away – we have Jesus' word on it. Thank you for reading and for your partnership in following Him!!

Notes on the Blanket Bunch

On behalf of the Blanket Bunch I wanted to bring the congregation up-to-date on what has been happening since the last Blanket Sunday in October 2019.

As we all know in March of this year our lives changed because of the Virus. The blanket bunch discontinued meeting in Mid-March and hasn't made any blankets since then.

I would like to report on the number of blankets that we completed and where they were distributed.

We completed a total of 147 blankets. A total of 91 blankets was sent to Lutheran World Relief in New Windsor, Maryland for distribution to wherever there was a need. A total of 50 blankets were given to Amy Gehring who took them to the Bethesda Mission in Harrisburg. We donated a total of 5 blankets to fire victims in Berrysburg and also donated 1 blanket to Lifeline in Millersburg to raise money for their Silent Auction.

Even though our numbers were not as high as some years we feel blessed that we were able to help fill a need in the world.

We are blessed to have the support of our congregation. Words cannot express how thankful we are for all the donations we receive. It helps make this ministry the success that it is.
