Part One of our Annual Congregational Meeting will be held following worship on Sunday, December 13. We will take action on the election of four members to our Congregational Council and proposed budgets for 2021. A copy of the main 2021 budgets is included in the December/January *St. John's Epistle*, as well as the names of the Council nominees being proposed by our Nominating Committee. All voting members – those confirmed members who have communed and contributed during 2019 or 2020 – are especially encouraged to attend this brief, but very important, meeting! *Important – New for This Year's Meeting:* Since our plan is that folks will

be attending 10:15 A.M. worship on December 13 both in-person and via Zoom, we will also plan that everyone will be able to simply attend Part One of our Congregational Meeting in those same ways. For those attending via Zoom, the Zoom host of the morning will make sure to keep a close eye on all Zoom participants for any questions that need forwarding to the floor of the meeting and if/when hands need to be raised for any voting. But there is one potential Zoom participation issue of which all those calling in with a telephone need to be aware. Because telephone participants can neither be seen by the Zoom host nor unmute themselves, there doesn't seem to be any way for telephone participants to give input to the meeting by way of their Zoom connection, so we are hoping that perhaps all those who normally Zoom via their telephone will be able, just for the meeting, to find a way to Zoom by way of an internet-connected device, maybe shared with a family member. If this will not be possible, please contact Pastor Tom or Roy or Rachel Henry, who will try to work out a way by which telephone Zoomers could call the telephone of someone on the floor of the meeting.

For as long as we are under COVID precautions and restrictions, we are asking that all altar flower sponsors please arrange to stop by and take their flowers directly from the vases at the altar, which can be done as soon as immediately after the end of worship. Bags for wrapping the flowers are being kept on the front pew by the lectern.

#### Help Requested for our Neighbors at Premier

Our congregational family has a long history of strong support for what was once the Susquehanna Lutheran Village in Millersburg, presently known as Premier at Susquehanna. We have been called on for help once again and, to that end, Miss Laurie is coordinating two Christmas projects:

- Goodies for Premier We are collecting items for residents who might not otherwise get any presents for Christmas! Suggested items for donation are: travel size toiletries including hand sanitizer; adult coloring books; Word Search books; crayons and colored pencils; single serve portions of SOFT foods like applesauce, pudding, jello, Tasty Kakes; purse size tissues; soft, snuggly blankets would be nice too!. A tub for donations has been placed in the foyer of the church.
- Card Shower for Premier In conjunction with the "goodie" collection, we're going to do a "Christmas Card Shower" for residents of Premier as well! There are 135 people residing at the home, so we're going to need LOTS of cards!! Cards can be hand-made or store bought. A basket for the cards has also been placed in the fover of the church.

Please be sure that, if you are a communing member of St. John, you turn in at least one communion record card (or, in these COVID times, if you have already communed this year but aren't sure if you did already turn in a record card, and can't comfortably stop by in person to do so now, feel free to contact Pastor Tom, who can make the notation) this year. And please bear in mind that Holy Communion is currently being offered each week at 11:00 A.M. in-person worship. Also, if you are a contributing member of the congregation, please be sure that you use your offering envelopes at least once this year, so that you are on record as having made a contribution. Please help to make sure that our parish records are as accurate as possible!

While we are following COVID guidelines established by Congregational Council, please note that spaces within the church building, such as the Sunday School Room, will not be available for non-congregational-ministry functions as they would be in "normal" times.
