

Dear Friends in Jesus,

As has often been the case, upcoming Sunday mornings in late September, October and early November will feature some unique highlights, in addition to our regular center point of Word and Sacrament. I wanted to use this space this month to highlight those for you...

On Sunday, September 30, we will enjoy a beautiful display of the blankets that have been made by the "Blanket Bunch" since last fall for Lutheran World Relief. We will include a "blessing of the blankets" and receive a special ingathering offering to help to offset the cost of shipping the blankets to wherever in the world they will be needed in the year ahead.

The "sermon time" on **Sunday, October 7,** will see the 13 youth and 5 adults who attended the ELCA National Youth Gathering in New Orleans back in July taking "center stage" and sharing with our congregational family something of their experiences as "Citizens with the Saints"!

On Sunday, October 14, we will again be blessed by a visit by a Youth Encounter musical team during Sunday School and worship. The name of our team this year is New Dawn. Like the Cross Fire team we hosted last year, New Dawn is an international ministry team who will spend a few months this fall touring congregations on the East Coast in preparation for their main service abroad in 2013, which will take place in the Philippines and Taiwan. The team is composed of four college-aged young adults, two women and two men. As was the case last fall, in order to have the team with us, we are in need of host families for the team members. This would mean meeting your assigned team member(s) at the church on Saturday, October 13, at approximately 4:00 P.M., and taking them home for an evening meal and lodging overnight. In the morning, you would be asked to provide breakfast for your team member(s) and bring them back to the church. You would also be responsible for providing a bag lunch for Sunday, as the team will need to head out in good time after worship to get to their next stop. As past hosts found out, hosting a team member is a great way to meet a new Christian friend. Please speak with me as soon as possible if you would like to host a member of New Dawn! (Because the 13th of October is a day and evening when many of our youth group families are tied up with sports and music responsibilities, we are especially looking for other host homes for the New Dawn members.)

Our Annual World Hunger Appeal Ingathering Offering will be received during worship on **Sunday**, **October 21**. Please see the separate article in this *Epistle* from Larry Gessner, our Congregational World Hunger Appeal Coordinator, for details on this offering.

The final Sunday of October, **Reformation Sunday, the 28th**, will include the First Holy Communion of several of our young members who will have completed instruction with me prior to that time.

Finally, on the first Sunday of November, All Saints' Sunday, the 4th, following worship, we will gather for our customary All Saints' congregational dinner and sharing about "the state of the parish". This meal is again being planned as a fundraising dinner for our Youth Group, following the New Orleans trip, and will again feature wonderful food prepared and served by members of youth group and our advisors.

REGISTER NOW FOR MIDWEEK BIBLE STUDY

Midweek Bible Study will resume on <u>Thursday</u>, October 18, and then will meet weekly on subsequent <u>Wednesdays</u> through November 14, when we will take a break for Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas. Class will be held each week from 7:00 to 8:30 P.M. We will continue our multi-year journey of studying individual books of the Bible, using resources from our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's Book of Faith emphasis on Bible study. After spending last year in the Old Testament, we will "change it up" this year and turn to the Gospel of Luke for the fall. We will cover most of the 8-week study during the fall and then, as we did last year, we will finish the study during the brief winter period that we have before the early beginning of Lent. For our longer period of spring study, during the Easter season, we will then immerse ourselves in the Gospel of John. No previous Bible study experience is required – only an interest and enthusiasm to study, reflect on, and discuss God's Word together! We are proud of all the things she has accomplished in her life We will miss her but we know she's at a better place, she left us with many memories.



Annual World Hunger ingathering Sunday October 21, 2012

Our annual World Hunger Fund Ingathering Church program will be on October 21, 2012. If you would like your specific contribution included on your yearend financial statement for tax purposes you will need to provide either your name or envelope number on your contribution unless you are using the envelope provided in your actual envelope box.

Over the years we have assembled 4 Enterline cousins that have graciously agreed to match all world hunger offerings received on Oct 21 on a 1 for 1 basis. Every dollar received will be doubled that Sunday.

This year for the 2nd time we will also be applying for a \$3 for \$1 match from Thrivent under a program called 'Care Abounds in Communities'. In other words if our total offerings for World Hunger including 7 & 14 Oct + 21 Oct are \$1800 during those 3 Sundays Thrivent will be providing us with an additional \$600.

As your World Hunger Coordinator since 1979 you have responded very generously over those years as our compilation of statistics reveal that as of 2011 we had given \$63,389.88.

Some years ago we had provided some funds for the Heifer project. The ELCA World Hunger initiated a similar program titled GOD'S GLOBAL BARNYARD which we initiated in 2011 for the first time. During Lent 2012 we once again decided to go with the God's Global barnyard theme. What kind of animals or fowl will we buy in October for this program? We have to wait and see what the final results are that Sunday! Last year we had \$3130.00 to work with.

As we did last year when we have a final figure for Oct,2012 we will have all teens and children come to the Sunday School room after church service. All of you will have dollars available to choose how we are going to spend that money to buy animals, fowlor farm. Bring your ideas along with maybe your parents and as a team we will make decisions on how best we can help others somewhere in God's World that are less fortunate than we are as Americans.

A handout will be available soon on what is available in God's Global Barnyard and will be distributed during Oct for your education on what's available and the cost for the animals or fowl.

In Larry's opinion to many of our fellow Christians like to pick and choose their own appropriate bible passages but like to ignore God's mandate, Christ Mandate and the apostles in action during the 1sr century concerning Justice for the less fortunate in their environment and within our world today. Remember the world's population just in my lifetime has gone from about a 2 Billion estimate in 1950 to about 7 Billion today. Think of the strain on the planet. We Americans use bout 25 to 30 percent of the world's natural resources with 5% of the population. I will say no more

Council has also approved that 10% of our World Hunger offerings during October will be forwarded to Bread for the World which also works closely with our ELCA World Hunger Program.

We as a church have promoted World Hunger each and every Sunday. You,our members ,provide offerings almost every week through the entire year and for your continued support we need to thank all who continue to help this worldwide cause to try with God's help and mercy to get this mammoth problem under control.

Motion by Pat Herb, 2nd by Craig Peters to accept the May Council minutes. Motion passed unanimously.

Reception of Petitions and Communications: Motion by Carol Hassinger, 2nd by Jim Bullock to give \$200 gift to Berrysburg Community Fire Company from Local Benevolence. Motion passed unanimously.

Thank you from World Hunger Committee of Lower Susquehanna Synod for our contributions.

Thank you for gift of \$500 from Seminary Crossroads campaign.

Larry Gessner will be the lay male representing the Upper Dauphin conference of the Lower Susquehanna Synod at the ELCA in 2013.

The ELCA has a new campaign against Malaria which involves sponsoring mosquito nets at \$10/net which protects a family of 4. Pastor Tom suggested \$600 per year for 3 years which equates to \$50/month and would provide 180 nets which would help 720 people. Fay Nichols volunteered to organize a display. This effort could begin in 2013 and replay the internet sponsorship which could be moved to the regular operating budget. Council will give prayerful consideration to this idea until the next meeting.

Request from many congregational members to order new St. John shirts (t-shirts and polos like prior times). Red was suggested for the color for the Strawberry Festival. Pastor will look into this for Fall as well as aprons.
