

Dear Friends in Jesus,

I wanted to use this space this month to update you on the work of the "Prayerful Planning Group". The Prayerful Planning Group, as you might recall, is the group of folks who assembled for the first time in January in response to a long-running bulletin and newsletter invitation for members of the St. John congregational family who would be interested in coming together to give prayerful consideration to our present building facilities and what God might be calling us to be and do in this regard. When we first gathered, however, we quickly found that the Holy Spirit had much more in mind for this group than being simply about "bricks and mortar". By May, we had developed four top goals as our focus: 1. Growing our participation in Christian Education, especially Sunday School, 2. My expectation is that the September 30 meeting will result in things to share and consider when we come together as a whole congregational family for our traditional All Saints' Sunday dinner and discussion. (While you're marking your calendar for the September 30 evening meeting, please also write in the first Sunday of November – November 3 – All Saints' Sunday, following worship, when we will gather for another wonderful fundraising dinner prepared and served by members of youth group and our advisors, followed by this time of sharing about "the state of the parish". You won't want to miss the chicken and waffles or the conversation and fellowship!)

In closing, speaking of "fellowship" and depending on when you are reading these lines, I hope you will be planning on joining in our Annual Square Dance (on the evening of the 29th) and our cruise on the Millersburg Ferry (on the afternoon of the 6th). Please don't hesitate to give me a call or send me an email if you'd like to learn more about either!


WOMEN OF THE ELCA

Annual World Hunger ingathering Sunday October 20, 2013

Our annual World Hunger Fund Ingathering Church program will be on October 20, 2012. If you would like your specific contribution included on your year end financial statement you will need to provide either your name or envelope number on your contribution unless you are using the envelope provided in your actual envelope box.

Over the years we have assembled 4 Enterline cousins that have graciously agreed to match all world hunger offerings received during the first 3 Sundays in October on a 1 for 1 basis. Every dollar received will be doubled that Sunday.

As your World Hunger Coordinator since 1979 you have responded very generously over those years as our compilation of statistics reveal that as of 2012 we had given \$ 72,735.88. This includes Hurricane Sandy relief of \$4600 in 2012

The ELCA World Hunger initiated program titled GOD'S GLOBAL BARNYARD in 2011. Early in 2013 we once again decided to go with the God's Global barnyard theme. What kind of animals or fowl will we buy in October for this program? We have to wait and see what the final results are that Sunday! Last year we had \$ 2045.00 to work with.

As we did last year when we have a final figure for Oct,2013 we will have all teens, children and interested adults come to the Sunday School room after church service. All of you will have dollars available to choose how we are going to spend that money to buy animals, fowl or farm. Bring your ideas along with maybe your parents and as a team we will make decisions on how best we can help others somewhere in God's World that are less fortunate than we are as Americans.

A handout will be available soon on what is available in God's Global Barnyard and will be distributed during Oct for your education on what's available and the cost for the animals or fowl.

In Larry's opinion to many of our fellow Christians like to pick and choose their own appropriate bible passages but like to ignore God's, Christs, and the apostles writings and action during the 1sr century concerning Justice for the less fortunate in their environment and within our world today. Remember the world's population just in my lifetime has gone from about a 2 Billion estimate in 1950 to about 7 Billion today. Think of the strain on the planet. REGISTER NOW FOR MIDWEEK BIBLE STUDY

Midweek Bible Study will resume on Wednesday, October 9, and then will meet weekly on subsequent Wednesdays through November 20, when we will take a break for Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas. Class will be held each week from 6:30 to 8:00 P.M. We will continue our multi-year journey of studying individual books of the Bible, using resources from our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's Book of Faith emphasis on Bible study. This fall, we will turn our attention to the Book of Acts – the dramatic story of how the Holy Spirit starts with a handful of frightened disciples to unleash a movement for Jesus that will literally change the world – considering how those lessons and practices of the earliest Christian Church might inform what we do in the 21st Century. We will cover most of the 8-week study during the fall and then, as we did last year, we will finish any "leftovers" at the start of the winter period that we have between Christmas and the beginning of Lent, adding to this a brief study of the letter of the Apostle Paul to the Galatians. For our short period of spring study, due to the late date of Easter, we will tackle a brief but dramatic study of the Letter of James. No previous Bible study experience is required – only an interest and enthusiasm to study, reflect on, and discuss God's Word together! So that the correct number of study books can be ordered for our study, please register in advance (by speaking with Pastor Tom) no later than Tuesday, October 1.
